From the Rectory

Where would we British be without our WEATHER to talk about?! After the longest hot, dry summer I can remember for ages (although not all over the country, just in the South) we now have torrential rain as I write, very welcome for the dusty plants and shrubs, not to mention the lawn which has seemed to green before my eyes! The settled spell of course made our being in lock-down so much more pleasant and as we emerge gradually into whatever the 'new normal' will be, I trust and pray that, like the lawns, it will be a time of regrowth and new life for everyone.

It has been a joy to reconnect with our Parish family in our churches for worship together, albeit without singing for now, but this week (mid-August) the regulations changed to allow for a small group of singers, safely distanced, to lead live worship in our buildings. Hopefully it won't be too long before the congregation is allowed to join in with them – we'll wait and see. On the first Sunday in August, we had a 'Songs of Praise' in Findon Church, with favourite hymns chosen and introduced by villagers before we listened to a recording of each choice. Gerald's choice, our final hymn, proved too much for everyone to stay silent, and it was so uplifting to hear people humming along each in their own way to 'How Great Thou Art'. We have a great God, who cares for each one of us, and I so look forward to being able to sing out the words to that hymn again at the top of my voice, in thankfulness for all God's blessings.

One of the challenges that came up as we returned to church Services was how to manage paper; Orders of Service and hymnbooks in particular. We have been using a projector and temporary screen at Findon on the first Sunday of the month for some time, and we're in the process of applying for the necessary permission from the Diocesan Advisory Committee to install a drop down screen and permanent projector in the church, following informal advice from our architect and the Diocese last year. We are very fortunate in that a member of the congregation has given us half the cost of the equipment, so we are able to proceed once permission is granted. Should anyone else like to make a contribution, this would be very gratefully received, as it would mean we need to dip less into our reserves! Contact the Parish Office for details.

To reassure traditionalists, having a screen will not mean this is in use at every Service in Findon, and when not in use, the screen will retract against a roof beam so it is barely visible. It will however mean we have more flexibility in our worship and will be able to project images sometimes during a sermon for example, hopefully making it more interesting! It is also a positive move for the younger members of our congregation, since similar technology is in everyday use in our schools and colleges. At the moment, it would also mean that we could play music clips through the system (which will link to our existing system) replacing the singing of hymns until we are permitted to sing in church again.

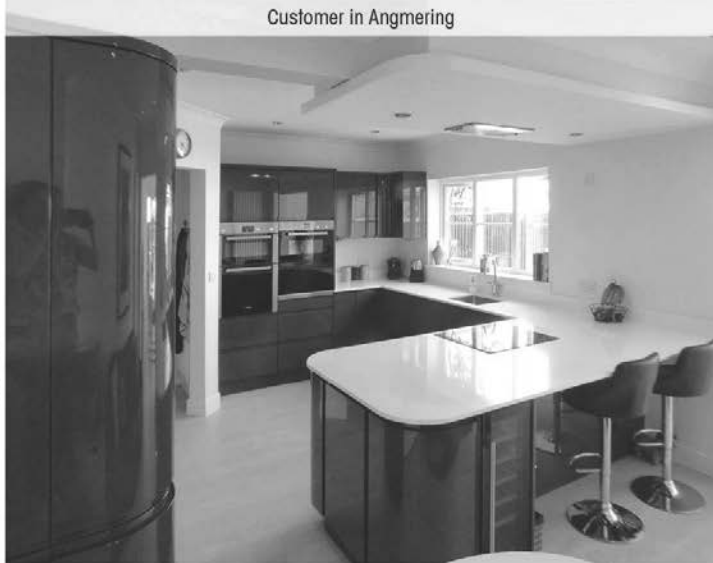

COVID-19 Guidance

From 1st September schools, colleges and universities will be opening.

It is against the law for gatherings of more than 30 people to take place in private homes (including gardens and other outdoor spaces).

It remains the case that you **should not** do any of the following:

socialise indoors in groups of more than two households (anyone in your support bubble counts as one household) – this includes when dining out or going to the pub

socialise outdoors in a group of more than six people from different households; gatherings larger than six should only take place if everyone is

exclusively from two households or support bubbles

interact socially with anyone outside the group you are attending a place with, even if you see other people you know, for example, in a restaurant, community centre or place of worship

hold or attend celebrations (such as parties) where it is difficult to maintain social distancing and avoid close social interaction – even if they are organised by businesses and venues that are taking steps to follow COVID-19 Secure guidelines

stay overnight away from your home with members of more than one other household (your support bubble counts as one household)

Beryl the van and I are home again, after an amazing visit to the West Sussex village of Findon.

Findon is the nearest village to the 6,000 year old ancient monument called Cissbury Ring. The site is on a large hill amid the Sussex Downs, from the top of which, you can see for at least thirty miles towards the coastal aspect. It is also a SSSI, for plants and butterflies etc.

I walked all around this area for three days and was amazed and delighted to see so many butterflies, some which I have never seen before, as I come from the Peak District

As I walked along the outer perimeter of the fort, on the earth battlements of Cissbury Ring, my imagination ran riot, in between spotting plants and butterflies. I kept thinking, 'If I were a Stone-age chieftain, I know where I would plump for'. Subsequent generations of settlers there would probably have had a good view of any oncoming Romans etc. The history of the site is literally almost endless, with the use of the site during more recent events, such as the First and Second World Wars.

The village of Findon itself contains many points of interest, including the vast village common with a 'Winterbourne' pond - you see the trees and vegetation typical of a pond, but not the water for the dry periods of the year. There is a large detached building on the common, which at first sight looked like an nineteenth century workhouse, but turned out to be another historical local landmark, known as the Wattle

House ('What's a Wattle? Oh it rings a bell from history lessons; wattle and daub walls etc.'). The Wattle House was built by a local worthy (George Holford, Circa 1792-1802) who had cornered the market literally, in supplying the wattle fencing used in sheep markets and fairs held upon the common.

The common has a huge beech tree which threw me a bit. I tried to guess its age, but was way out. I thought 100 years, but it turned out to be planted in 1981 to commemorate the wedding of Charles, the Prince of Wales and Lady Diana Spencer!

There is church of 11th century origin, dedicated to St. John the Baptist, which is next to a large estate mansion called Findon Place - which can be viewed from the public right of way, which leads to the church.

The church graveyard contains some moving testimonies inscribed upon the gravestones, including one near the entrance to the church, which is the gravestone of the Pratt family. The son, who at just 19 years of age, died of his injuries on October 27th 1918 (only a few days before the end of the war), and also his parents who survived him for another 35 years.

The public right of way path extends alongside a large woodland, and then becomes a beautiful 'green corridor' of bramble, spindle, dogwood, hawthorn, blackthorn, bindweed, elder, oak, ash, sycamore, and others too numerous to take in, for those who have not the time to survey in detail.

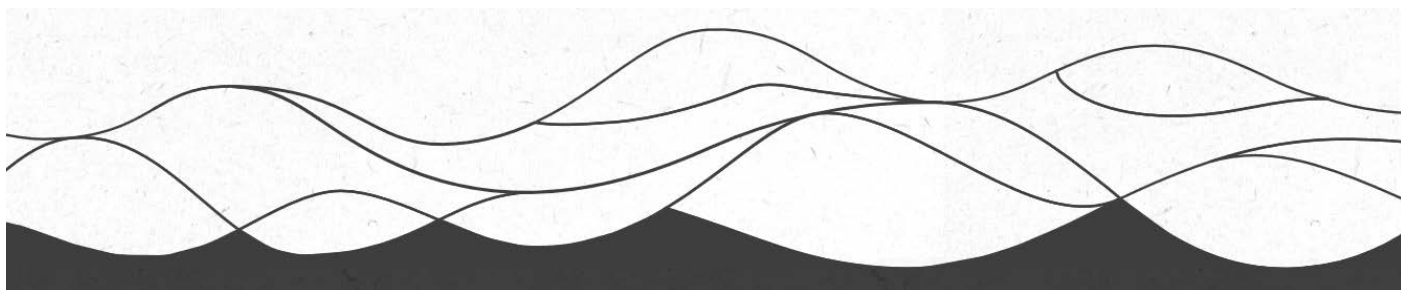

The Plunkett foundation, in conjunction with Citizens Advice, have been very focused in encouraging governmental support for our Post Offices, especially those situated in rural areas. 74% of rural Post Offices operate in a community that is without a bank. A fallout from Covid-19 is the continual exit of bank branches from the High Street.

Citizens Advice has recently conducted the most comprehensive research ever into Post Office banking. This research confirms that for many customers Post Office banking is the only option open to them. When Post Office services were standardised prior to 2017 the provision of high street banking services was patchy. However the banking framework agreement between the Post Office and the banking industry now enables 99% of UK personal banking customers and 95% of business banking customers to access services at their local Post Office. This service is provided mainly on an everyday banking basis, including services; cash

withdrawals, balance checking, cheque and cash deposits.

Part of this research revealed that 70% of postmasters stated that pay rates for banking do not cover the costs of providing the service and this is certainly true for our own Post Office. An interesting statistic to come out of this research is that although many of us are happy to use online banking, 90% of the UK population uses a bank branch at some point. It is also apparent that vulnerable groups are most likely to use Post Office services weekly.

Our village Post Office makes a commission based purely on the number of transactions (every balance check or stamp sold makes us money!). If we can all continue to use this vital service, coupled with support from groups such as Plunkett and Citizens Advice, who put pressure on the government to ensure the survival of rural services, then hopefully we can continue to provide this service for many years to come.

Paws Animal Sanctuary

We took in a cat after the owners moved away leaving him behind. We had him neutered and treated for bad ear mites, worms and fleas. We called him Bob. Then a new volunteer came in and left the cattery doors open and he was gone! We put posters up everywhere. After spending weeks looking for Bob all over the village, he started to turn up every evening near The Oval. One of the neighbours would wait for him; she fed him and gave him water, and the good news is he has decided to live with her. She said she didn't really want a cat but Bob trusts her and has made himself at home with her, her husband, son, and their two dogs. So, grateful thanks Sarah.

After nine weeks at The Equine Hospital our pony Elvis is back home, what a worry it has been. He had a plate put in his shoulder, but he pulled the stitches out with his teeth and had to go back into surgery to be re-stitched. He then had a really bad infection that took weeks of antibiotics and laser treatment to try to clear up the infection. He is still very lame and has developed marked muscle wastage and weakness in the shoulder and leg, so it is still difficult for him to walk. He is having acupuncture every week and still needs physiotherapy. The bill came to £8,179.02!

We have been busy with so many cats coming in; the last two females needed

spaying, our vet bills go up and up. It costs over a hundred pounds now to spay a cat.

The mole is still here destroying the lawn - every day there are new molehills and I have tried every single suggestion people have advised. The humane traps do not work either - he just fills them up with earth. All the rabbits and guinea-pigs have gone to new homes. I advise all the owners to clean them out every single day, keep hutches in the shade and put their animals out in runs on the lawn with plenty of water and boards over the top for shade. Hutches are like hot ovens in this hot weather. The telephone goes crazy every weekend with people wanting to know if we are opening on a Sunday again. But, until we feel it is safe, we will not be opening again on a Sunday for some time.

An Acre

A.D. 1262, Alchorne Manor, Rotherfield, Sussex. Peter de Alchehorne and his son John are relaxing in front of the fire after a hard days ploughing.

“You did well today lad. You kept those oxen straight and out of the Mabbs Ghyll and we ploughed a good acre.”

“What is an acre Dad,”

“Well an acre is an acre same as it always has been. What a team of oxen can plough in a day. That is a long furrow (furlong) 200 yards long. What a team of oxen can plough without getting too tired. The other way is a cant (narrow strip) 20 yards wide. That is four times your ox goad which

sometimes called a rod or pole or perch. Good old Saxon measurements that have served us well for hundreds of years.

Now our Norman Lords have said that we have got it wrong. They say that our foot is one tenth smaller than theirs and that we have to add one foot for every ten of ours to bring things into line. Are you listening son? You look sleepy. This is where it gets complicated. That means that a furlong is now 220 yards and a cant is 22 yards and your ox goad is now 16 and a half feet although, in fact, it is exactly the same length as before. Did you get that son?”

No, he did not. He had nodded off and was now fast asleep.

It's the season of the glut and the weather this year has taken the glut to a whole new level! My broad beans were a disaster (covered in blackfly), but everything else had been very prolific. I am now drowning in a sea of French beans and runner beans; and tomatoes; and Cavolo nero; and leeks; and soon Chinese cabbage. I've never grown Chinese cabbage before, but it's looking good, so I'm hoping for lots of stir fry in September and also some lovely sweetcorn. Another first for me is edamame beans. They have produced beans, but not in huge numbers, so although we are enjoying what we have, I'm not sure I'll grow them again.

Although the jobs in the garden slow down over July and August (apart from the relentless watering this year) things get very busy in the kitchen, as I desperately try to use up what I'm picking. I've made several batches of soup for the freezer – mainly tomato, but also runner bean. I've also frozen French beans, blueberries and tayberries; made and frozen courgette quiches; made jam and piccalilli; pickled beetroot, and now chutney season is upon us. One benefit of a glut is that it makes you look for new recipes and I've just discovered Sri Lankan beetroot curry, which I think will become a favourite. Our daughter

comes to visit once a week and goes home with a "Red Cross parcel" full of masses of veg and the odd jar of jam. Our son has a fig tree that has loved this hot, dry weather and I'm now swapping runner beans and beetroot for figs.

Whilst the vegetable garden has benefited from the extraordinary weather, the rest of the garden has suffered. As our many water butts ran dry, and I don't like to use too much mains water, the lawn and flowers have struggled. I've watered when things looked as if they were about to expire, but I think I need a rethink. I probably need to put down loads of compost to supplement the meagre layer of soil in the borders and I am going to have to look into drought-tolerant plants. But at last we've had a bit of rain so hopefully things will pick up.

Thankfully, in June, the blackbird with an identity crisis finally stopped pretending to be an ambulance, so we've had a bit of peace. I hadn't realised how many people were being driven crazy by him – after I wrote about him people kept stopping me on my way through the village and talking about him. He's certainly had his "15 minutes of fame".

GROUPS OF YOUTHS

Sussex Police have received many calls from across both East and West Sussex reporting large groups in fields, often loud music can be heard. Please keep calling these in.

If you see something that looks suspicious or out of place please call it in on the non-emergency number 101. But if you think a crime is in progress call it in on 999.

POACHING

Sussex Police would like to raise public awareness regarding poaching in rural areas. In the last few years, they have worked very closely with rural communities and have had great success in the reduction of poaching of wild animals. Poaching is a secretive business, often carried out at night and in remote locations, but if caught, poachers can be prosecuted for a range of offences.

Game dealers, restaurateurs, hotels and public houses are being advised to check that they are not buying illegally

killed game. They can do this by not purchasing meat from unknown persons and reporting suspicious gatherings in car parks immediately; dealers in game should show legal documentation for the sale of meat.

Anyone who suspects illegal poaching is taking place, please call Sussex Police on 101 or 999 in an emergency, i.e. poaching is occurring in front of you there and then.

Memory Lane

Living in lockdown, my thoughts went back to the days in Findon before we had so much. Most villagers worked six days a week, so Sundays were special. Most families attended church or Nepcote chapel; children also attending afternoon Sunday school. In winter families and friends would visit each other for tea or a rare treat to see a magic lantern show at Nepcote chapel. Summer Sunday evenings would mean family walks through the lanes or on the hills around, stopping to chat with whoever one met along the way! Watching traffic pass by on the London road through the village, we had special viewing points - North End well (now under the A24) and The Triangle (now gone, but it was the point where Nepcote Lane and Cross Lane met the Worthing Road). It was our pre-television entertainment.

This being pre-bin collection days, Findon had its village tip on the bank of Soldiers Field at the bottom corner of Nepcote Green. Years later treasure

hunters dug for treasure and I am sure none was found. Our tip was named The Dally Hole by villagers. Any unwanted items would be offered to family or friends before going to The Dally Hole. My mother accepted a table from a friend who lived at Ivy Cottage at North End. As it was on castors, transport to Old Cottage was no problem. With three family members and a friend half sitting on each corner, we propelled the table scooter-fashion down the A24. I may add there was much less traffic on the A24 at that time. On reaching our front door, it was found that the legs were too long to get through the door. Mum, never daunted, got a saw to shorten the legs. Life was short for the table in our living room, as it almost filled the room. So the table's life ended keeping us warm as logs for the fire.

I now return to 2020 and the unknown living time ahead, after one of many trips down my memory lane.
