Young and old- everyone can get involved



#### From the Rectory

It was a joy to see almost 70 people (including several children and some dogs) respectfully giving thanks and remembering at Findon War Memorial on Remembrance Sunday. Wreaths were laid representing the villages, Findon Parish Council. Arun District Council and West Sussex County Council. Colin and I recorded a Service in church, with contributions from Evelyn Stanford and Ian Hollyhomes, with Tessa McCormick reading the poem 'The Soldier' and Ian Swales reading the list of the fallen from the three villages as usual, enabling many others to remember with us from their own homes.

Like much of this past year, it is unclear as I write just what lies ahead of us as we approach Christmas and the new year, but looking back over 2020, I think we have much to be thankful for, and much to be proud of as village communities. While we are hopeful that there will be some form of public worship in our churches over Christmas, we cannot at this stage be certain what form this will take. There will still be online worship available for those unable to get to church, and I'd like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who has helped to contribute to our weekly recorded Services over the months of lockdown, and most particularly to thank Colin Cox, our talented Assistant Priest here, for his IT expertise and creative gifts in putting the whole thing together on our Parish Facebook page and sending it to Liz Henderson for our website.

The Nativity performances and Carol Concerts and sing-alongs, we so enjoy in our schools and churches, will sadly not be taking place this year, nor will our Walking Nativity, but we do plan to sing carols around Findon in set locations on 3 evenings. (see pg 13 for details!)

Another new venture is the 'Candle in the Window' initiative (see front page) and this fits perfectly with



the concept of Advent as a time of waiting in the build up to Christmas Day. Many of us are familiar with the Advent Wreath, where a new candle is lit each Sunday of Advent, gradually increasing the brightness of the light, culminating in lighting a central white candle to show that Christ, the Light of the World has been born. Be creative, I'm really looking forward to seeing what you put in your window as I walk round the village with Tilly!

The four weeks of Advent have traditional themes. The people of God, whose stories we read in the Old Testament speak of hope in troubled times through following God's Law, the prophets call us to a new way of living, ending with John the Baptist's call to repent and turn back to God, the final candle being to remember Mary whose humility and obedience enabled the birth of Jesus when she said 'Yes' to God's call through an angel. This year, let us also travel through Advent prayerfully, remembering those we love

but may be unable to meet in person, those across our world for whom daily life is such a struggle, and giving thanks for all those who have helped us in our lives, and especially in this past year, when there has been so much to challenge our individual well-being.

Certainly, whatever the Government decides. Christmas celebrations will be different for everyone this year, but what is (or should be) at the centre of these celebrations doesn't change; the reason for Christmas is our awe and wonder that God chose to be born in human flesh, Emmanuel, God-with-us. Jesus was born in poverty to a very ordinary, yet quite extraordinary couple, far from their own home at the behest of the ruling foreign power (Rome) and subject to the whims of a power-hungry puppet leader (Herod). We are so fortunate, living in a democracy, with the associated freedoms, but many people in our world are not so lucky, living in fear, often lacking the basic necessities of life we take for granted here. Sad as it is not to be able to join with extended family members at Christmas this year, we can look ahead to better times. In remembering others less fortunate than we are, wouldn't it be wonderful if we all contributed what we would have spent on excess food, drink and (often unwanted) gifts for one

another to a charity supporting the homeless in this country, or the persecuted or displaced across the world, or those who are struggling to rebuild lives after natural disaster. The list could go on....

If we are able to have a Crib Service on Christmas Eve, could each child bring a picture of an angel



they have drawn, coloured and cut out, to stick on a poster to give thanks for our 'Guardian Angels' who keep us safe. This can then be displayed in the church until the end of January, when hopefully we might have some idea of when Messy Church might be able to meet again. Any adults who want to join in and bring an angel are also welcome of course.

Remember, I am here for you all (not as some think just for those who 'go to church'!) and don't hesitate to get in touch if I can do anything for you.

May God bless you all this Christmas and through January, as together we look forward to longer days and better times.


# Afternoon tea deliveries raise over £1,340 for Children in Need appeal!

Here is the proposed plan starting at 6.00pm each evening:-



#### Findon Parish Council

The year 2020 will be remembered through the lens of the COVID pandemic, a difficult and trying time for us all. Despite the restrictions Findon Parish Council (FPC) has continued to meet and manage business via virtual full Council and Planning Meetings using the Teams platform.

It is a good time of the year to look at those FPC achievements in 2020, some of which are complete and some still in progress. It is appropriate to emphasise that all parish councillors have contributed to this work.

- \* Findon Parish Council: For the first time in a number of years FPC is at its designated number of Councillors this is great news since these increased numbers should mean we can achieve more in 2021.
- \* COVID Support: With the first COVID lockdown FPC leafleted the village offering support to villagers. A range of activities from shopping, pharmacy collections to direction and advice was undertaken during this period as villagers contacted FPC through its website.
- \* Tree Management: Trees have undergone an expert assessment, particularly those on Nepcote Green and north of the Glebeland. Sadly, a number of trees have had to be removed as a result of ash dieback. FPC has planted and maintains a nursery of varied saplings with a view to replacement and extension of our trees.
- \* South Downs National Park Area (SDNPA) proposed Nepcote

Conservation Area: The intent to create a new conservation area on the downlands adjacent to Findon was launched and following FPC and individual input progressed with an intended mid year 2020 target following the public consultation. This would be the SDNPA's first new Conservation Area designation, however the project has now been put on hold by the SDNPA until the COVID restrictions are lifted.

- \* New Housing Development : FPC continued to pursue alternative locations for new housing in Findon rather than those imposed upon the village by SDNPA. A working group was created and investigated alternatives, creating a proposal that was put to the village via ballot. This alternative proposal was strongly favoured in this ballot whilst the SDNPA version was least popular. Nevertheless SDNPA refused to amend its proposal, notwithstanding the clear view expressed by the villagers. As a result FPC was faced with the risk that both proposals would proceed, creating double the new houses in Findon. FPC therefore was compelled to withdraw its application.
- \* Operation Watershed: This project is now complete adding protection, via increased drainage and soakaways to Findon from the risk of flooding via Nepcote Lane.
- \* Nepcote Green: Fencing around Nepcote Green has been fully replaced, partly with the help of Findon Sheep Fair. In addition, the process of returning Nepcote Pond to its previous

filled state is underway and FPC is seeking support to that end from other local government bodies.

- \* Open Spaces: Our volunteer Working Group continues, subject to COVID guidelines, to clear leaves and debris from various roads and footpaths to ensure safe access for users.
- \* Homewood Play Area: FPC has successfully achieved a grant from the SDNPA for the renovation/redesign of this facility. A Working Group has undertaken the process of gaining and subsequently evaluating tenders for the work, with a view to a 2021 completion.
- \* Village Pre-School : Support work to repair the village pre-school roof has been undertaken.

- \* Traffic and Parking: Multiple concerns from villagers regarding increasing parking and speeding risk has led to the establishment of a Working Group on this subject. We look forward to their impact in 2021.
- \* Allotment Gardens: The various lockdowns have had the impact of making these allotments look better than ever, credit to the plot holders.

FPC would like to thank Findon
Village Store for the chair and plaque
outside the store, noting Peter
Goldsworthy for his role in ensuring
the survival of our village shop.
Peter's contribution to the shop and
the village in general is significant and
we would endorse those thanks.

Finally, FPC would like to wish all residents a Merry Xmas and a Happy New Year.

#### Paws Animal Sanctuary

We might be in lock down but we are still as busy as ever, with injured birds, stray and unwanted cats. The phone never stops ringing. Thankfully we have reliable volunteers here every day. Today we had a call from another guinea-pig rescue in Haywards Heath, telling us a guinea-pig breeder in Chichester has died and there are hundreds of guinea-pigs needing to be rescued immediately. Mainly females all with babies. I quickly discussed it with the volunteers and we agreed we could take 50 mums with all their babies. The girls started getting the cages ready looking for drinking water bottles making sure we have enough guinea-pig food and hay. They are looking forward to giving them all names. I also sent a message out to all the other animal rescues in the area to see if they could also help.

All the cats are reserved this week except for two. A lady looking for two cats is coming tomorrow to see them. They are two brothers and so friendly I know she will love them.

A lady, moving to a flat without a garden, brought in a bald hen called Nancy. I tried putting Nancy in with our hens but they all bullied her, so I quickly rescued her and took her to live inside in the warm. Most of her feathers have grown and today she laid her first egg. Nancy goes anywhere she wants and will jump up on tables and work surfaces and help herself to cat food, and she loves cucumber and lettuce. She follows volunteers in and out and

around the garden and has no fear of cats or dogs.

Almost every week there are animals needing to visit the vets. So many of the cats need neutering before they can go to a new home. People reserve them and have to wait until they are better after their operations before they can go.

All the cats look forward to their Dreamies each night. They all have electric beds and night lights. It gets dark so early they go to bed much earlier in the winter.

It will soon be Christmas and luckily for us many of our volunteers are single and have promised to come in and feed the animals over the holiday.


