It is wonderful that events are starting up again in the villages, after well over a year of restrictions. Findon Village Hall Team put on a film evening in mid September and it was lovely to be back there again to enjoy a relaxed evening with drinks and a burger, with ice cream in the interval, and David Gear entertaining us with popular melodies before watching 'Military Wives'. The film really brought home the challenges of being married to a serving member of our armed forces, and the real life families certainly all need our ongoing prayers. We had a tantalising glimpse of the October film and other titles to look forward to between now and Christmas.

Light Lunch at 1 is also back – how we have all missed this opportunity to chat with friends over delicious soup and puddings, all home made. Thank you to Dorothy Barber and her team for all their cooking! If you haven't been before, give it a try – see you in Findon Village Hall on the last Tuesday of the month; £5 is excellent value.

Messy Church also resumes this month, meeting in Findon Village Hall on the first Tuesday of the month, 3.30-5.30pm with activities this month around the theme of *One World; let's care for it!* All welcome, but remember that children must be accompanied by a parent/carer who is responsible for them at all times. We ask for a minimum contribution of £3 per head to offset the cost of art materials and the meal we provide for everyone to share at the end of the session. Don't forget to let us know on arrival if you or your child have any food intolerances.

Sadly, we have had to take the decision to close the weekly Youth Club due to the lack of response from both young people

and volunteers to help to supervise their activities. We are sad that the 3-4 regular youngsters no longer have this available, but I still hope we might be in a position to offer a weekly club again in the future if there is sufficient demand. Meanwhile, I hope to liaise with the Village Hall Team to put on a Family Afternoon 3-4 times a year; watch this space, and keep an eye on the Findon Village Hall and Parish Churches websites!

Our first Parish Family Walk will have taken place when you read this and has hopefully been enjoyed and well supported. A pilgrimage has been a central part of many faiths throughout the centuries, and this is no accident. Barriers come down as people walk together, enjoying the countryside and chatting, and friendships can form and deepen, as well as having the time simply to appreciate this beautiful part of Sussex where we live, giving thanks to God for his abundant provision.

It doesn't seem possible, but it is now 3 years since we held our first Findon Worship and Praise Service! This has continued to grow in popularity, with visiting groups of musicians eager to return to help lead our worship again thanks to Graham Langford for coordinating this. If you haven't been before, do join us at 10.00am on the first Sunday of each month to see what we do. The projector and screen we bought, thanks to the generosity of some of our congregation, is also used to good effect in our Communion Services now. Looking up instead of down at a hymnbook really improves the quality of singing!

#### Bob Eastabrook 1938 – 2021

Bob was very well known around the village and with his easy-going nature and sense of humour he made many friends. He loved living in Findon and loved and embraced the friendly community life here and was active in many local events including the Sheep Fair, Stoolball, Fetes, Flower shows, Christmas Tree festivals, etc.

After leaving Worthing Chess Club he went on to start a chess club in Findon which just about survives each Monday in the Village House. He also engendered a love for the game in his grandchildren and spent many an hour playing them.

After his retirement the first thing he joined was the Village Hall Maintenance team which involved keeping the grounds and hall in good order. He continued this for many years until he found it too onerous.

He took up woodwork in a big way making several pieces of furniture around the house including a dresser, coffee tables and a set of 6 beautiful Windsor chairs.

Also, he got interested in wood turning and became an active member of West Sussex Wood Turners where he won many awards. He became an accomplished wood turner and many family, friends and villagers have one of his lovely turned items. He volunteered at the Amberley Industrial Museum where children of all ages can have a go at wood turning.

He joined the Worthing Men-in-Sheds which he thoroughly enjoyed. His first visit involved delving into skips to rummage around for wood to recycle into toys, shelves and all sorts of

things! A few years ago he helped set up the Findon Men-in-Sheds which is finally allowed to reopen after a Covid break. They help around the village mending seats, notice boards and anything else that needs doing.


He took over as secretary of the 200 Club which raises money for the Findon Village Hall, and enjoyed organising the quiz nights.

When the community Village Store was purchased he became involved in fitting it out and later helping at the counter

Unfortunately, as his health deteriorated, he had to gradually give up all his interests, and over the last few months life became very difficult for him but he never complained.

Living in such a friendly village has been a great support for me and I would like to thank everybody for their many kind messages of sympathy.

I know he will be greatly missed.


Having the author present brought both the book and the art of writing to life.



### Shepherding at the start of Autumn

September is a generally a busy month locally, with firstly the Findon Sheep Fair (which was cancelled this year) followed by the Sheep Auctions at Ardingly and lastly the West Grinstead ploughing match at Partridge Green. Attending the agricultural shows is a day off for the farmers and shepherds and a chance for them to meet and exchange news.

The sheep auctions moved from Findon to the show ground at Ardingly in the year 2001 and this year 5,500 sheep were sold there in one day. Sheep are brought from Kent, Surrey, Hampshire and Sussex. The picture below is taken at this year's sale in the Southdown section where the sheep were sold in their pens.

It was very good to attend the Edenbridge and Oxted show for the first time at the end of August, where we met a number of sheep farmers who have said they will be coming back to the Findon sheep fair in 2022.

At the West Grinstead Ploughing Match, 150 years of the meeting was being celebrated. Again, it was good seeing people who come to the Sheep Fair and many friends who visit this show. As well as the ploughing, there is hedge laying, terrier racing, cattle and sheep judging and much more.

### Film Review by Carrie Morrison

"The Way" - Directed by Emilio Estevez

With a heart-wrenching story such as this one, it is difficult to not be at least spiritually touched by this film. Adapted from the short stories in Jack Hitt's book, Off the Road: A Modern-Day Walk Down the Pilgrim's Route into Spain, Martin Sheen stars as Thomas Avery, an optometrist whose son tragically dies whilst walking through the Camino de Santiago, a traditional pilgrimage also known as The Way of St. James. To fulfil his son's wishes to cross the Camino, Thomas takes his son's rucksack and begins a lifechanging journey, meeting interesting characters along the way.

The film is technically subdued to make space for the charming essence that comes from the journey through the Camino. The cinematography, by Juan Miguel Azpiroz, honour's the stunning views pilgrims get to see on their walk, that almost spiritually captures you in its beauty. Its soundtrack is gentle and not overpowering, especially during its walking sequences to allow emotional breaks between scenes. It makes The Way a moving yet calming viewing for viewers.

You are enamoured by the sheer sense of community that locals have as they welcome travellers into their homes. The way the main cast interact with each other is an interesting dynamic, as their contrasting stories make for intriguing conversations. There were aspects to the story that make it dated to a certain extent like its depiction of the Roma community in Spain. A part of me wishes that Martin Sheen's character was allowed to be more vulnerable, and less emotionally stilted,

as the viewer could have felt a deeper attachment to him. James Nesbitt, as writer Jack Stanton, is belligerently loud and affectionate, though the character definitely feels like an obvious shoe-in for Jack Witt, the author of the original novel. To the point where Jack's interactions with Thomas feel callous, as the audience knows post-film Thomas's story is shared with the world.

Criticisms aside, this is an emotional film that I am sure many people can connect with. I cannot possibly comprehend the idea of losing a child, so it feels disingenuous to give a verdict on whether the film gives a just view of its subject matter. What I can say, however, is that this film soared through a splendid part of the world that people should know more about.

I think we can now say the Village Hall is back up and running with its prepandemic level of activities. The barbeque last month was a great success – the weather decided (in the end) to be more than kind to us, we had a great turnout and it seemed like everyone was having a great time – many thanks to the Events Team who made it all possible.

We also had the first of this year's film nights which I confess I missed because I was away on holiday myself. I understand that this was a slightly more modest success possibly because of some confusion arising because the originally planned film had to be substituted by another. However, the whole thing meant that a completely new kitchen crew could learn the ropes without being totally overwhelmed! The next film night will return to a Friday, the film will be "Good Liar" starring Helen Mirren and Ian McKellen – so the 22nd October is a date for the diaries - see you then.

The new CCTV system has now been completed with the erection of a post at the rear of the hall and additional high level cameras giving us a good view of the entire area at the back including the pre-school and the basket ball court. A great job by IPS and at a price rather generous to us.

# Working as a Registrar of Births, Deaths and Marriages

I have worked in the Registration Service for over forty years, firstly in North London and since 1988 in West Sussex, based in offices at Haywards Heath, Horsham and Worthing. For me it has been the perfect job, as I have always thought of myself as a 'people person' and so to have had the chance to support people during the occasions which are such key milestones in life, has been very fulfilling.

Performing a marriage ceremony is probably the most publicly familiar task and is certainly one of the most enjoyable. I must have married hundreds of couples over the years and have more than once been greeted with 'you married me last time as well!'. When I was in North London we might do fifteen weddings on a Saturday morning and I can honestly say every wedding was made personal and unique. I have had the pleasure of conducting ceremonies for a number of village couples and even had the privilege of officiating at my own daughter's wedding - which was the very first to take place at Cissbury Barns - although embarrassingly, she was an hour late!

The Registrar's work starts well before the ceremony of course and includes ensuring that people are legally entitled to marry. That has led to interesting situations over the years - such as helping a young woman to escape an arranged marriage; exposing couples who had clearly never met each other before their wedding day and preventing one potential bigamist from marrying his own wife's sister.

Registering deaths can be very stressful as people are understandably at their most vulnerable. Worthing is one of the busiest offices in the country for deaths and in winter months my working day might involve registering up to thirteen deaths. I did my best to make sure the task never became routine and being as sympathetic as possible whilst maintaining the necessary professional distance. Registering a Stillbirth is always particularly sad - we used to have a room set aside at some hospitals so that we could see the mother together with her newborn child. On one occasion the mum asked would I like to hold her baby and of course I answered, 'yes please'.

Registering births has probably been my favourite aspect of the job, and getting to hold the babies a delightful bonus. I was able to register my own daughter and grandchildren (which leads to an unusual certificate) - and my very final registration before retirement a year ago, was my youngest grandson, Max.

Most Registrars stay in the job for many years and become skilled at working with the public during difficult and emotional times. When a large inquest took place in 2015 at the Royal Courts of Justice, for fifteen British people killed during a terrorist attack in Armenia, Registrars from West Sussex were called in to act as ushers to support the bereaved families. Commuting to the Holborn courtroom every day and working alongside emminent coroners, barristers and

#### Findon Parish Council

The Findon Sheep Fair Committee ran a limited event on Nepcote Green on 11 September 2021, since the Fair is not being held in this year. This is an attempt to maintain the history of the Fair in Findon. A formal opening and closing ceremony with a number of village supporters continued that tradition and ensured that relevant bye laws were obeyed. All are looking forward to a full 2022 event with great anticipation.

Yvonne Wilson, the new Chair for Findon Pre-School, attended a recent Council meeting and talked with great enthusiasm regarding the future of this village asset and how we can develop and broaden the advantages that the Pre-School can bring to Findon.

Following the strong public response to the traffic and speeding survey (350 responses) circulated by Findon Parish Council, collation of opinion is well underway. Initial examination has shown the need for a number of Council sub-groups focussed on turning these thoughts into appropriate action plans. These plans will subsequently be communicated to villagers and progress

reported at future Parish Council meetings.

Continuing with traffic and roads, sourcing of village entry signs, to signify entry into the village, is underway. The thinking here is very much in line with that expressed during the survey. These signs are intended to lower traffic signage and enhance the village look and feel whist acting as a traffic calming service.

October should see the long pursued changes to A24 speed limit installed. This will involve lowering the speed restriction from 50mph to 40mph leading to Findon Valley, and should certainly make exit from the village safer and particularly so for residents of the Quadrangle. Since Findon Parish Council has councillor representation from this part of the village it has given clear focus and engagement.

West Sussex County Council (WSCC) is currently evaluating the results of the survey on plans to create a cycle path from Findon to Findon Valley.
