From the Rectory

Waiting..... there are many reactions to having to wait for something. These depend on who is waiting and what they are waiting for! Now, in December, we are all waiting for Christmas; our emotions as we wait will very much depend on who we are, on what extra pressures the season might bring alongside the joys of spending time celebrating with family and friends. Christmas can be a very difficult time for those who have lost a loved one, especially if they now find themselves alone, and living as we do in a supportive and caring village my hope is that nobody will be left completely alone at Christmas. If you know of anyone who needs support, please do not hesitate to get in touch through the Parish Office.

The church marks this waiting time specifically as Advent. 'Advent' means 'arrival'. This year, Advent Sunday fell in November, on 28th. I wonder if any children noticed that they should have had an extra couple of chocolates in their advent calendar this time round! But for Christians, the four weeks leading up to Christmas each have a focus, so as we wait, we reflect on the history of our faith, looking at the example of the lives of key figures in the Bible and hopefully learning more about our own faith. This year we are taking these weekly themes of the Patriarchs ('Fathers' of the faith from the Old Testament like Abraham and Moses) the Prophets (people like Isaiah, through whom God has spoken to his people), John the Baptist (who prepared the way for Jesus to begin his ministry) and Mary, without whose willingness to be the mother of Jesus there would be no Christmas, and discussing these in our weekly Advent Study Group – details can be found on our website.

All these people prepared the way for Jesus with humility and selfeffacement, putting the call of God first, something we can all learn from! Secular Christmas is very much selfcentred, focusing on what people want, what they perceive they 'deserve'! We all need to remember that the real reason for Christmas is Jesus, Emmanuel, God-with-us – a baby born away from the security of a home to an ordinary but devout couple, who grew up to give his life for you and me to bring us closer for God and offer us the gift of eternal life. Tempting as it is to think just of ourselves at Christmas, my hope and prayer is that in reading this you have been reminded of the real reason we are waiting for Christmas. that we wait to once again welcome the Christ-child into our hearts and lives, by reflecting his eternal love to those we meet in how we live our lives. The only gift needed to give and to receive at Christmas is love.

May God bless you all as you prepare to celebrate Christmas this year. Thank you for the care and compassion you show to those who need it, locally and globally. Colin and I look forward to welcoming you to the many events and services planned over the Christmas period, and wish you all a healthy and happy 2022.

#### CHILDREN IN NEED Afternoon tea

Someone once said that tea to the English is really a picnic indoors. They were so right. Last Friday, a blundering week before Children in Need kicked off, another of Gay's splendid pop-up tea rooms managed to create one of the best indoor picnics I have seen for a long time. Sofas, armchairs and dog were removed to the garage, and dining tables, vintage crockery, cake forks and table cloths were purloined to create the Claridges of Convent Gardens! Many helpers made cakes, savouries and sandwiches, and there was even a glass of Prosecco and a raffle available for those who were willing to dig deep into their pockets.

The men scrubbed up well too!

A tremendously enjoyable and successful afternoon managed to raise over £1050 this year, which is astonishing.

On a serious note, and to put into perspective how the funds are allocated, take a look at what is being done for the children in need of help and support in West Sussex. Last year 6 local projects secured funding of over £300,000. Worthing received £122,490 for weekly youth clubs for young disadvantaged children; and

the Juno project in Worthing, helping young people to find

employment, received £39,000. Ferring, and Goring-on-Sea received grants to help support disabled children; with special funding allocated to a play-scheme in Lancing. Holiday activities for disadvantaged children are provided through a scheme in Haywards Heath with a grant of £91,092 coming directly from Children in Need.

With the charity funding over 2500 projects like these nationwide, it helps improve the wellbeing of many children and young people, by removing some of the barriers faced by so many of them.

Many thanks to all those who helped raise funds - to the volunteers, bakers, waiters and those who washed up! But especially to Gay and Gerald Hibbs who opened up their home to make this event possible.

Findon Parish Council (FPC) has been made aware that the problem regarding dog fouling has not improved. May we respectfully ask all dog owners to be aware that any dog waste must be bagged and binned in order to keep our village clean and safe. Dog waste can be put into Arun District Council (ADC) litter bins if dog bins are not nearby. Thank you to all of you who do follow this practice. In the meantime, FPC is investigating the provision of additional dog waste bins.

Those residents who make regular trips to Worthing Amenity Tip will be aware that the system is now by way of booking online. West Sussex County Council (WSCC) will be undertaking a consultation to see how the temporary system has worked but it is expected to be made permanent. Good news for those with brown bins as normal service seems to have been resumed. The roads around the village are no longer strewn with the overflowing bins so we have all breathed a collective sigh of relief. Plenty of work still to do in the garden to keep us busy!

It has been agreed to relocate the defibrillator in The Square and FPC would like to thank Mr Adam Collard for allowing the equipment to be installed on the wall of his shop over the last few years. We will let you know the new location as soon as we can.

By the time this edition of Findon News is published, the survey requesting

input from residents to the Public Works Loan to complete the building works at Findon Village Hall, will have closed and the responses being analysed.

With autumn now firmly in place and with Christmas just around the corner, FPC is delighted to announce that the marvellous Findon Xmas Lights volunteers have once again put up the Christmas lights in the centre of the village for the grand 'switch on' held on 28 November 2021. This will be the last time that Jan Mackerell and Corinne Ball will head up the volunteers and we would like to thank both of them for their inspiring work over the years to lighten up the village at this special time of year. Proposals of any size or scale will be considered and could include, for example, creating wildflower meadows, new hedgerows, more natural rivers, planting trees,

#### Findon Village Hall News

I must start with a swift correction and apology this month - the date I put down for the Village Hall Trust AGM last month was a day early – it was the 25<sup>th</sup> not the 24<sup>th</sup> November – I do hope people were not inconvenienced by my error

By the time you read this, we will know the outcome of the poll on the principle of the Parish Council and the Village Hall Trust applying for a Public Works Loan in order to finish the extension to the hall. At the time of writing there is still a week to go before the voting deadline. Regardless of which way you voted, I would like to thank everyone who has returned their voting card for their support for and interest in the affairs of the Hall.

Over the past month we have tried an experiment to improve the acoustics in the hall which deteriorated markedly with the removal of the stage. It was a "concept proving" measure (translation: Heath Robinson arrangement) – but it worked! We simply fixed the old stage backdrop material to the far end wall and this resulted in a marked improvement. We are now arranging for a rather neater installation and also reviewing ideas for reducing the acoustic reflectiveness of the end wall at the entrance end of the hall. We hope that the combination of these actions will give us a good performance but, if not, we do have further measures in mind.

Lambstails attendance has been very low so far, in fact, on two of the sessions so far only a single mum and child turned up! Clearly, this will need to be kept under review as the sessions are not sustainable without better

attendance. However, we are not giving up yet. If any mums would like to provide feedback or suggestions as to what might meet their needs better that the current arrangement, we would, of course, be happy to receive them. All the other regular activities at the hall are running well and the demand for Pilates sessions in particular seems very high. Children's parties have also been running at high demand. Film Nights are, of course, running again and attendance levels once again very encouraging. We were taken by surprise at the 2<sup>nd</sup> film night and ran out of burgers! We will try to make sure that does not happen again...

We have also returned to the prepandemic practice of stacking all the chairs around the perimeter of the hall when not is use and this has allowed us to provide some secure storage space inside the hall, currently, the WI and Light Lunches are using some of this but a small amount of additional storage may also be available.

At the request of the Christmas Tree Festival organisers, the Hall car park will be available to them for overflow parking during the event on the 4<sup>th</sup>/5<sup>th</sup> December. They will have control over the barrier so it will be opened at their discretion.

We have received an expression of interest for at least some of the bridge tables mentioned last month but no claim of ownership, so in the absence of a claim in the immediate future, they will be going to a new home.

So, all that remains is for me to wish you all a very merry Christmas and cross my fingers for the outcome of the PWL vote!



#### Paws Animal Sanctuary

As soon as all our cats go to new homes our pens are soon full up again. Some cats need to be neutered or spayed. It is so time consuming having to take them to the vets early in the mornings and then pick them up again in the afternoons. I hate driving in the dark and it's almost dark at 4 o'clock now, so the neutering days are such a rush. Lots of volunteers who normally start at 6pm cannot get here to help at 4pm when we alter our hours in the winter. The hens start to put themselves away as soon as it gets dark. Elvis the pony and Jasper the donkey also go into the stables earlier - expecting their evening meals ready. All the cats need to be fed and tucked up for the night with their heated beds and nightlights turned on. The rabbits and guinea-pigs have supper and their drinking water bottles are checked. Nightlights are turned on and they are all safely inside in the warm for the night.

We sometimes have dogs handed in to be rehomed - five in the last few months. One was an eleven week-old Dachshund puppy that a very elderly owner had for only two days. He said the puppy wouldn't stop crying and he had no sleep for two days, I told him the puppy was missing his Mum and the other puppies, so he should take him back to the breeder. He said it would be too embarrassing and he couldn't do confrontation. Could we find the puppy another home? Luckily one of our volunteers went and collected the puppy and rehomed him with her daughter's two French bulldogs. They loved the puppy, so

he soon settled in and is very happy with them. The last dog we were given was a little Corgi x Chihuahua belonging to a 99 year-old lady who has gone into a care home. The dog had been overfed and not taken for walks, so she was overweight. She stayed here for a couple of days and wasn't frightened of the cats, dogs, rabbits and hens running around. She easily tired and slept a lot in her bed. A volunteer fell in love with her and took her home. She loves her new home and big garden, sleeps on her mum's bed and she is now very active and full of life.

I went to see a really lovely film called Dream Horse at the Village hall. I really enjoyed the wonderful music played by a man at the organ before the film began, and in the interval. It really brought back memories of being taken to the cinema when I was a child - a huge organ would rise up through the floor, lights flashing. There was always music playing before the film began. Wishing everyone a lovely Christmas and a peaceful New Year.


