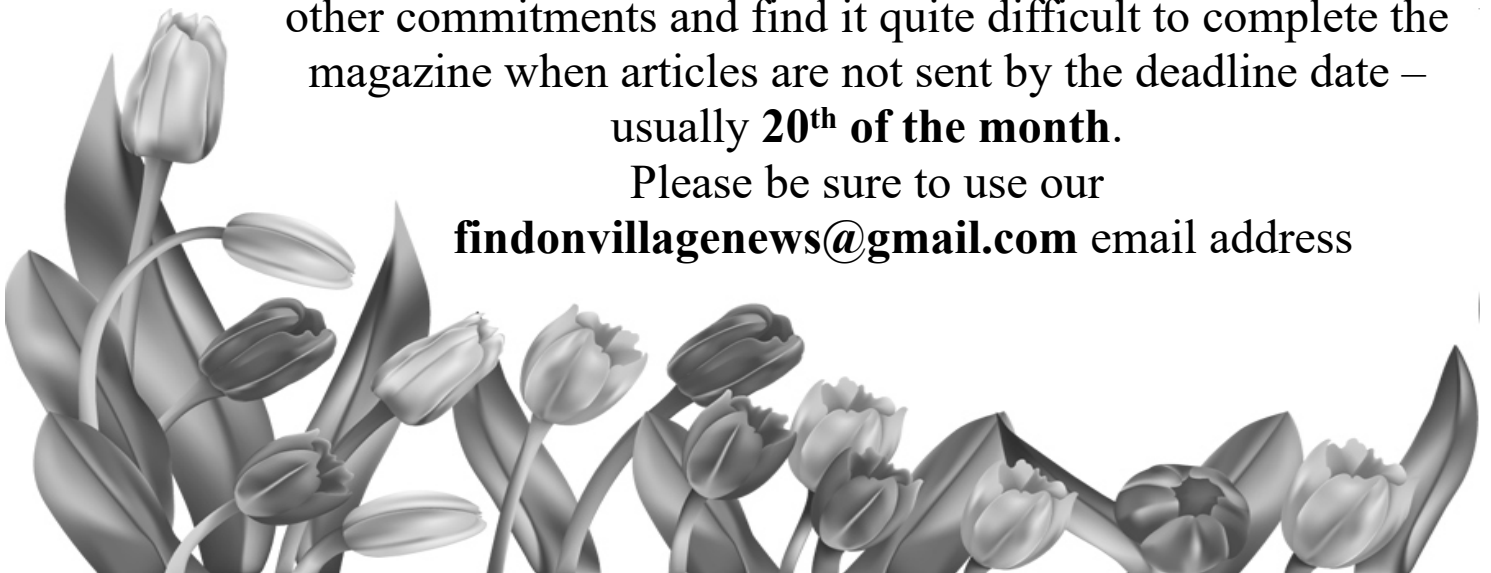

From The Rectory

Have you walked up to Findon Churchyard recently? The snowdrops are stunning this year, a real sign of hope and springtime! Thanks to the work of Findon Volunteers, they are finding it easier to grow this year too, with the fallen leaves having been expertly cleared away – thank you so much. The earliest primroses are also flowering now, but their glory will be at its height in a few weeks time. As the days lengthen, the birds are starting their rehearsals for the dawn chorus which will be at its best in time for our Dawn Service on Easter Morning, but I am jumping ahead of myself – we are not quite in to Lent yet!

Speaking of being ahead of myself, how many of you spotted last month's deliberate mistake?! Shrove Tuesday, with the pancake frolics, wasn't 1st February but is 1st March, which is also St David's Day! Families coming to our Messy Church that day will be able to make daffodils as well as enjoy eating and racing with pancakes at Findon Village Hall, and the pupils at Clapham and Patching School will have their own pancake fun in a special assembly towards the end of their school day. Of course, the pancakes we enjoy are symbolic of using up rich ingredients in our pantries before starting the discipline of Lent.

Shrove Tuesday is a time of fun and frivolity, followed in the church by Ash Wednesday, the day when traditionally people went to confession to a priest and received absolution. Palm crosses from the previous year will have been burnt and the ashes from this are then

used in the Ash Wednesday Service to mark each person with the sign of the cross for repentance. We have a Service at Findon and Patching Church at 10am that day.

Lent is traditionally a time of reflection and some people like to 'give up' something they enjoy during these 40 days as a discipline. Another way to mark this period is to do something extra – perhaps setting aside a time each day to read or pray, or making a greater effort to support someone in need, or a charitable organisation. Lent reflects the 40 days that Jesus spent in the wilderness alone, fasting and praying, before starting his earthly ministry and can be a time of spiritual growth for us all, as well as the opportunity to lay down the things that burden us as we review our daily lives. We are planning to run a Lent Course, based around beautiful images and stories, called 'Comfort Ye my People' over the 5 weeks, so keep an eye on our website for details and do join us if you are able. If you'd like a preview, look on the Diocesan website (chichester.anglican.org/lent-2022)

After Lent and Holy Week we come of course to the greatest festival in the Christian calendar – Easter – when we praise God with joy for the resurrection of his Son, Jesus, who died on the cross for us all. There are no flowers in church during Lent, so Easter Sunday is always a joy when the church is once more filled with beautiful flower arrangements, often using lilies.

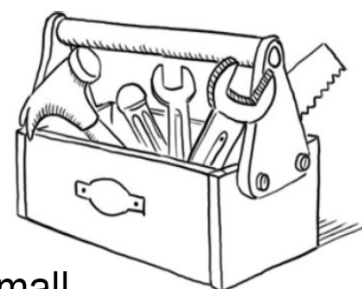

It's often a fairly quiet time in the village shop with a sense that we are all waiting out the end of Winter and saving our energies for the Spring. But this year the momentum has kept going through the early months, with extensive roof repairs (fortunately finished before Storm Eunice rolled in) and lots of internal decoration as well as many hours spent by the Management Committee ensuring that all our paperwork is in better than perfect order. And of course, great team work in the shop led by Angus, all the Post Office staff and the volunteers to ensure that we continue to supply all our customers with so much more than might be expected of a small community shop.

We have had several deliveries of new stock to refresh the choices in our grocery department. Dilys was born in South Wales but moved to Sussex aged three, so no Welsh accent. She attended Murray's School in Horam, East Sussex where her headmaster was Walter J C Murray, a well known naturalist. The Family moved to Swiffe Farm, Broad Oak near Heathfield and she worked with poultry at a farm in Burwash Common. Here she met Norman and in time they married at the nearby St. Phillips Church.

Norman was milking cows, and they lived in several tied cottages in Sussex before a spell in Somerset. They came to Findon in 1965, first to Tolmare Farm and then to Southview Road, known to some older residents as Quality Street.

For the last 20 years she lived in Beech Road. The family enjoyed modest success training and showing dogs and Dilys is best remembered for walking her dogs through the village. Shetland Sheepdogs (Shelties) were her first choice but she also had Tibetan Spaniels (Tibbies). Earlier hobbies were knitting and gardening. The last few years were hard with illness preventing her from doing the things she loved and she passed away in Worthing Hospital on 3rd of February.

The last Film Night was a welcome return to “business as usual” with a good turn out and a most enjoyable film – let’s all look forward to the next one.

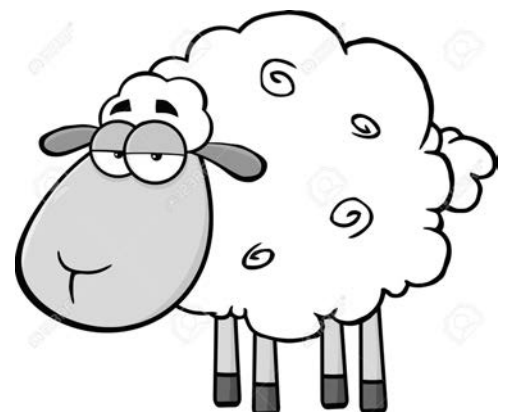

Nepcote Flock News

Sheep farms are entering the period when preparation for lambing takes centre stage. Six weeks before the planned lambing period, pregnant ewes are being given sheep nuts called concentrate, to help with the final growth of the unborn lamb. 80% of the lamb is grown in the last 4 weeks so extra feeding is very important. Also within this six week period Heptavac is given to the expectant ewes for the active immunisation of sheep and to aid the control of clostridial diseases and pasteurellosis.

We bring in turnips as an extra food, but you will see a lot of flocks eating turnips or sugar beat in fields especially locally on the Long Furlong towards Clapham. This again helps to provide good condition in the ewes at this time of year.

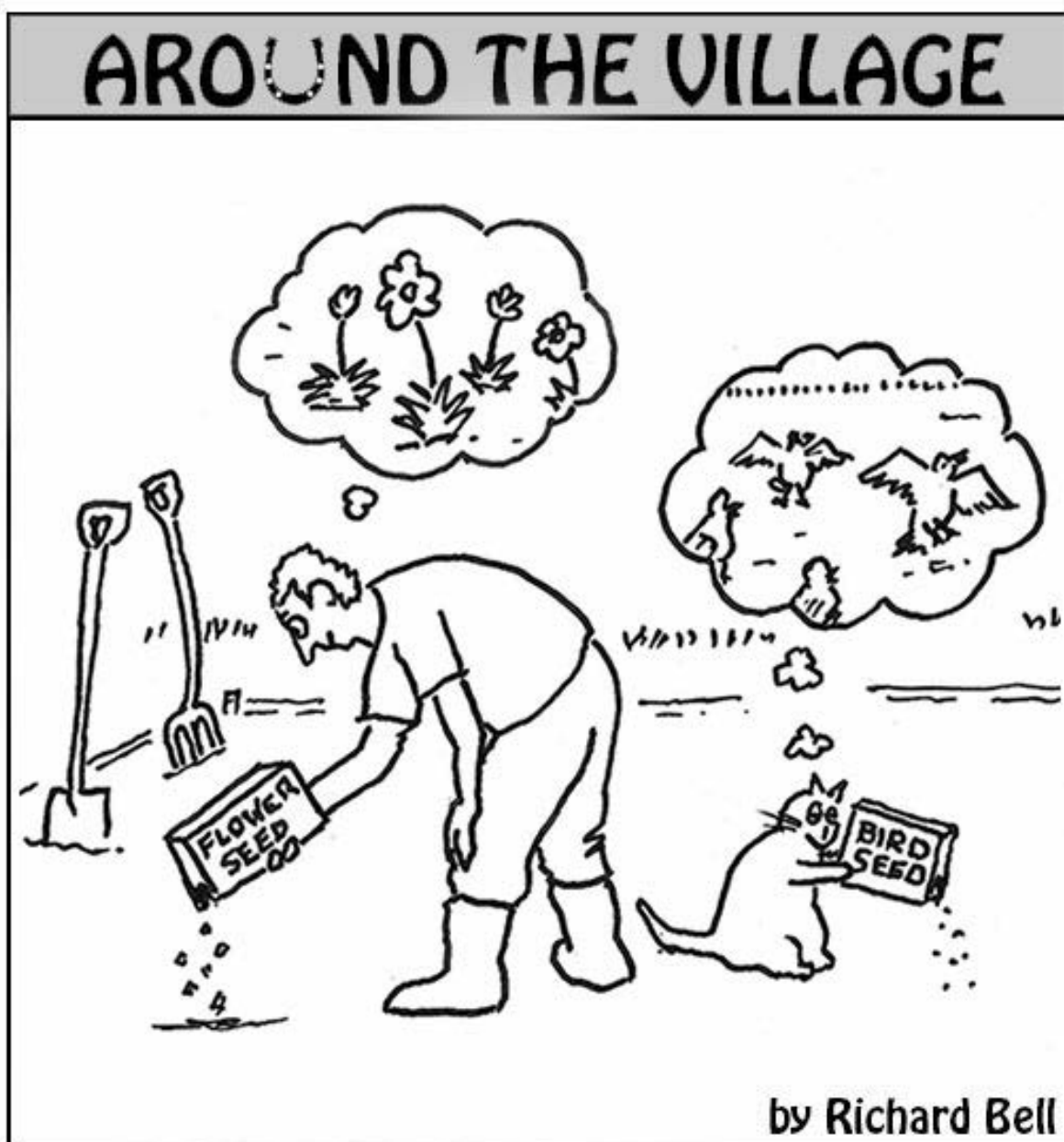

Findon Parish Council

Findon Parish Council (FPC) has agreed that the precept (the funds which the Parish Council receive to carry out our obligations) will remain at the same as last year £47k. This amount has been confirmed with Arun District Council for the financial year 2022/23.

There has recently been a campaign run by the Woodland Trust to plant more trees. FPC has been given about 500 saplings (all provided free from the Woodland Trust) and our noble and ever busy Open Spaces Working Group volunteers and the Findon Tree Warden have already planted 169 saplings and counting around the village since 2020. There is still more to do and if you would like to join the group on a regular basis, in addition to the litter picking, tree planting, maintenance, clearance of paths and some carpentry work to name but a few of the works undertaken, then as set out in the February edition of Findon News, Councillor Robin Carr can outline in more detail the work that is carried out.

It is expected the works will commence at the end of May/ beginning of June 2022. Once we have a date for the completion of the works, we will let you know. We are nearly there!

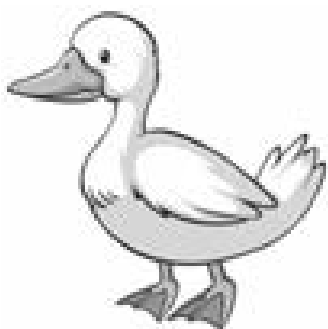

Unfortunately, we are still not opening to visitors with their children on a Sunday to look around until we are absolutely sure it is safe from Covid. Open only to people adopting cats, rabbits and guinea-pigs.

A man bought four Duck eggs but only one hatched which he gave to the lady next door for her children. This lady asked me to take the Duck, because it wanted to be with her all the time, expecting her to cuddle him all the time. She said she couldn't cope with a Duck, four children and two Dogs. They called him Puddles. What a character. Everybody loved him. He was out on a pond on our lawn all day, until a lady came in and adopted a very friendly cat from us. She sent the news and a photo of her new cat to all her friends and family, and told them about our sanctuary and our Duck called Puddles. Some of her family live on a farm in Dorset. They keep ducks who like to go indoors in the evening to watch TV. They asked if they could give a home to Puddles. We agreed he would be happier with other ducks and the whole family came up from Dorset to pick him up. He really enjoyed all the cuddles and attention.

Puddles didn't know he was a duck and wanted to be friends with our hens, but they didn't like him and would give him a peck. Then he would come running for a cuddle. He is now very happy with



a lot of female ducks and a big pond, they all go in and have watermelon every night for supper. They told me he

likes to sleep on his own every night in his own igloo. He must be so confused as we would bring him in at night, he always got a cuddle before bedtime; we put him in a pen for the night with his own bed. All the volunteers would make a fuss of him. We all miss him.

He went to an ideal home. His new owner said she is getting married soon, he follows her everywhere so she said on her wedding day he will follow her down the aisle as her ring bearer with a ring round his neck on a ribbon.

We have some really thin and neglected cats. One came from an owner who is seriously ill in hospital. Luckily he was found in time but this poor cat had gone without food for some time so all we can do is feed her well and hope she will recover. She is so friendly.

We also have three black cats that were rescued from a terrible house, all kept in a cage. Two girls saw an advert for puppies for sale. When they called at the house they were horrified to see dogs, cats, puppies and kittens everywhere in appalling conditions. They foolishly bought two puppies and paid £100 for the three cats they said to get them out of there. They asked me to take the cats. The cats arrived starving and are eating everything in sight. We will treat them for worms. I advised them to inform the RSPCA and the Dog Warden.

One of our Volunteers had a phone call from a friend working on a farm in Hertfordshire.

He said there were 5 feral kittens needing rescuing. He drove 200 miles there and 200 miles back but only managed to catch 2 of the kittens. They arrived hissing and spitting trying to bite and scratch anyone daring to go near them. He later arranged with another Rescue in Hertfordshire to go and trap the other adult cats and kittens he was unable to catch. One of the local Vet's nurses offered to take the two kittens home to tame them for us.

Yesterday, 18th February, Storm Eunice arrived. Fences and trees were blown down. Friends were ringing saying their chicken houses had blown down and they had been out trying to round up their chickens. One man asked me for a cage to put his rabbit in, his cage had been destroyed. Our dogs wouldn't go out and all stayed safely indoors. I thought the Donkey and Pony would be frightened, but they seemed to enjoy the wind and kept galloping down through the full length of the paddock racing one another all the way back into the stables and then off again over and over. I kept well out of the way or could have been sent flying.

People have been buying dogs and puppies with a lot of them working from home. When they were told to go back to work the dogs were not used to being left on their own. They bark and howl all day, and destroy the home pulling up carpets and chewing up

furniture. We have been inundated with phone calls from owners asking us to take their dogs. A couple of our wonderful Volunteers have had a couple of kennels built in their garden to help us out. They found homes for five dogs just before Christmas, and last week a Great Dane went to a new home.

As soon as the kennels are empty we have more unwanted dogs arriving.

We have a headache at the moment. A man rang to say he had tried all the other rescues who said they were full. Could we take a 3year old American Akita? They had just bought a new baby home and the dog had growled at the baby. We didn't have room at our kennels so the dog has had to go to boarding kennels until we can find a home for her. But oh dear, the dog has been neglected, is thin, and has a matted coat. It is quite agitated and not able to go with dogs, cats or children, so we will have quite a job finding her a new home.

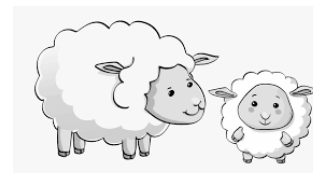
