From The Rectory

ALLELUIA! Christ is risen! Writing this the week after Easter Sunday, I feel justified in beginning my article with these words. Churches and Cathedrals throughout the land will be bedecked with flowers after the austerity of Lent, the scent of lilies in the air (allergy sufferers beware!) and bells will ring out joyfully to welcome the risen Christ. The Passion, death and Resurrection of Jesus that Christians celebrate through Lent and Holy Week and with joy at Easter, this story brings hope, reminding us that death is not the end but that through Jesus Christ we have the promise of eternal life. Coming as it does in springtime, new life is all around us; blue tits are busily going in and out of the nesting box in the Rectory garden, lambs can be seen frolicking around their mothers in local fields and fresh leaves in a myriad shades of green, sometimes tinged with pink or orange, adorn the trees and shrubs, with hedgerows white with May blossom. Seeds sown begin to sprout. Isn't creation wonderful?!

In stark contrast, we see the images of war-torn Ukraine on our screens, buildings razed to the ground, homes and livelihoods lost. Buildings can be rebuilt, but the human loss is devastating and many in these situations ask, 'Where is God in this?' Again I return to the Christian belief that death is defeated through Christ, and that through his agony on the cross, Jesus knows the pain of human suffering. Wherever there is agony or loss, Jesus himself is in the centre of it,

bringing hope and strength. We can feel so helpless in the face of this injustice and suffering, but through our prayers we can help to bring about change, as we pray for strength and comfort for the Ukranian people, and for wisdom and courage for the people of Russia, that they might stand up for freedom and justice. If enough people were brave enough to do this, perhaps the government would have to take notice. That is my prayer, that soon a way through dialogue and diplomacy might be found and a new, more compassionate government might come to power in Russia, so ordinary people there might also be set free from fear and deprivation.

Thank you to everyone who has left donations in the Rectory porch to support families in Ukraine. Unfortunately the local Barnabas Aid collection point seems to have now closed, so I am unable to accept any more donations at this time. Money can be donated through this and many other charities – details can be found online. Please continue to hold the people of Ukraine, and all parents who have lost children through the war, in your prayers. Prayer is powerful and does bring about change!

Don't forget, we are always there to pray on your behalf, so if anyone has a specific prayer request, do let me or Colin know; this is always confidential unless we have your permission to include it on our weekly pewsheet for general prayer.

Remembering Ian Swales

It is with sadness that I record the death of Ian Swales on 23rd March, but with confidence in the promise of Christ, especially in this Easter Season, that he now rests in peace and will rise in glory. A lifelong committed Christian, lan was a dedicated and respected member of the church community in this Parish, serving as the Secretary to the Parochial Church Council for many years, as well as having been a Church Warden at St John's and a member of the Deanery Synod. His integrity and diplomacy were an invaluable asset at meetings, as was his love of words and the ability to find just the right way to phrase issues as they arose in meetings in his clear and accurate minutes.

Unlike so many long-standing Christians, lan was always ready to learn more and was a valued member of seasonal study groups held in the Parish, with thoughtful and measured comments in discussions that helped us all look at things in a rounded way and learn together. He would often chat after a Service about something he'd read in the newspaper, and how this might relate to our shared faith. Whilst personally preferring a more traditional Service style, Ian had the vision to recognise that the church also needed to move with the times and develop the use of modern technology and his ability to negotiate between opposing viewpoints with insight and tact will be much missed.

Ian was a valued member of the village community, serving for many years as a Governor at St John the Baptist School and encouraging links between the school, the church and the wider community. He was involved with many organisations in the wider community, such as Rotary and Probus, through which he formed life-long friendships, supporting their charitable causes and enjoying the fellowship. The numbers at the Service of Thanksgiving in the Parish Church were a testament to his far reaching friendship across so many spheres as well as top his faith. Our thoughts and prayers are with Jan and the family as we remember and give thanks for lan's life, faith, loyal service, wisdom and friendship.

Findon Parish Council

FPC organised and supported the first Annual Parish Meeting (APM) since 2019 and full details can be found in the separate article in this Findon News. The APM is not an FPC meeting but provides the opportunity for parishioners and local organisations/groups to find out what FPC has being doing over the previous 12 months or so and plans for future initiatives, and vice versa.

FPC recently commissioned a Tree Report for every mature tree on FPC owned land. A very comprehensive 40 page Report was produced by Connick Tree Care and the condition of each tree recorded. To ensure that FPC adopts tree safety diligence, every tree in the Report will be checked on an annual basis and a report submitted to FPC for any action needed. A copy of the report is available electronically and can be requested via the Clerk clerk@findonparishcouncil.gov.uk FPC is currently in dialogue with West Sussex County Council (WSCC) regarding the condition of the road markings in the centre of the village and road drainage clearance work in School Hill and Nepcote Lane.

The next FPC meeting is on Monday 9 May 2022 starting at 7.30pm in Findon Village Hall. This is the annual meeting of the Council when, amongst other Agenda items, the Chairman and Deputy Chairman are appointed for the ensuing year, and Committee, Working Groups, Outside Bodies etc memberships are confirmed. As always, residents are welcome to attend this meeting. The Agenda will be placed in both Notice Boards on 3 May 2022 and published on the FPC web site, along with available supporting papers.

Village Hall News

Thank you! The Village Hall Trust would like to thank each and every one of you who responded to the consultation process relating to the future of the extension to the hall. The turn-out, after the extended time period for responses, was very nearly 34%, which we understand to be at the upper end of expectations for this sort of exercise. The verdict was that some 92% of the responses were positive which the Trust takes as a tremendous expression of support for the hall and by which we are very encouraged. This means that the Parish Council is now empowered to commission architects to assemble firm tenders for the work required, In fact they have already done this and, once again, the Trust would like to thank the Parish Council for their support.

Sadly, this is just the start of what will not be a swift procedure - I think most of us are aware that the building industry has lost both labour, over the past couple of years, and is currently very busy indeed, so we should not under-estimate the task the architects face nor the impact the situation may have on the final costings. There will be a second consultation with householders in the village once we have those figures, prior to the Council applying for a Public Works Board loan. In the meantime, we will continue to make small improvements where we can - the fence to improve security at

the rear of the hall will be erected very soon (with the help of lots of people and organisations in the village – for which we are, again, grateful!). We also hope to get a grant for a bicycle shelter which, if successful, would reduce the amount of work needing Public Works Loan support. Proposals for solar panels - which could halve our electricity bill and reduce our carbon footprint will be reviewed shortly.

I am delighted to report that the regular Film Nights are back up to normal levels of attendance and burger supply and demand levels back in balance! News from Paws Animal Sanctuary

Every single one of our guinea-pig pens is full. Every day we get calls from parents asking us to take their family guinea-pigs or rabbits, usually because their children have lost interest. We had two young guinea-pigs given to us, so thin their ribs were showing. Sadly, one died by morning. Even today a lady rang to say one of her daughter's guinea-pigs had died during the night could I take the other one because her daughter is off to university. How can I say no when all the other rescues are full? We will have to use an indoor portable temporary cage for him.

Lost cats, dogs and other stray pets are taken to Grove Lodge Vets because they never close. They rang to ask me to take a stray lionhead rabbit found in an alley in Worthing. It had been in Grove Lodge for over a week but not claimed. I went and picked the rabbit up. I have been putting photos on Facebook every day but so far nobody has claimed the rabbit.

Last week a man rang to say he had a white pigeon in his garden. He said he rang round all the other local rescues, but they are not taking birds because of avian flu. He said it was a young very healthy looking bird just hungry. I asked him to bring it in. How could I say no? I rang someone I know who keeps pigeons and told him it was coming in and he said one of his was missing. He arrived at the same time as the man with the pigeon. He recognised her straight away and the pigeon walked straight in to the cat carrier he had brought. The pigeon owner said she was one of his babies who usually follows him around every day.

Today a man rang to say a dog was barking at a tortoise on the Gallops. I asked him to pick it up and bring it in, they are such escapologists. They are nearly always claimed, but she was on her way to the woods. He said, "how do I pick the tortoise up?" I assured him it wouldn't attack him or bite him.

A lovely, very pretty cat came in today with the son of a man who died two days ago. Unfortunately, we only know the cat's name, no age or vet's card. He said his Dad rescued the cat from a very bad home six months ago but that's all he knew. The cat is very friendly and eating everything we give her.

We still need to find a home for the very neglected Akita bitch. She is no longer upset and frightened, and also a Border Collie, the Lurcher and Staffie have gone to new homes.

We always have free ready bagged horse manure outside in the drive if anyone has an allotment.

Many of our Volunteers have been ill with Covid or tested positive. With less volunteers and so many animals it has been a struggle. We desperately need a volunteer to feed the hens and clean the poultry houses on a friday morning. We also need a Volunteer to come in and do some gardening cutting down ivy and generally keeping the gardens tidy.

FINDON ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

After a two-year delay due to COVID restrictions, it was finally possible to hold the Annual Parish Meeting to explain to the residents of Findon just what Findon Parish Council (FPC) activities had been carried out in the previous 12 months or so, and also catch up on the activities of many of the local organisations and groups within the village.

The meeting was attended by local residents and representatives of local organisations as well as recipients of the grants given by the FPC. The Guest Speakers were Christine Austin, Arun Community Transport, and Ronia Rateiwa, PCSO for Findon Village.

The Chairman of FPC, Cllr Sean Smith, provided the following updates regarding FPC:

FPC has a full complement of eleven councillors who all bring different background experience which only seeks to give a rounded view of the many items which come up for discussion at formal FPC meetings.

Residents will be aware that FPC had been successful in completing the following projects and initiatives:-

• A24 speed limit reduction. After a prolonged struggle the works have finally been completed with the limit reduced from 50 mph to 40 mph. This should make life for those residents living in the village, on the A24 and The Quadrangle to have safer and easier to access the main road.

 Another success story is the work undertaken by the Open Spaces
 Volunteers who meet weekly and undertake a variety of tasks which are aimed at keeping the village in pristine condition and to ensure that any safety issues are quickly addressed. A new Litter Clearance Group has recently been formed with the aim of keeping the village tidy.

• Residents will be aware of the recent parking and speeding survey which surprised us all with the findings, notably that the speed limit of 20 mph is broadly followed. The issue of parking remains to be resolved but as with other villages, this is a common problem. We are shortly to set up a new group whose aim will be to investigate what steps can be taken.

• You may recall that the new Homewood play area is now in the final stages of development and work is expected to start in early June to regenerate the play area. This has been a good example of how FPC has worked in partnership with Arun District Council and the South Downs National Park Authority (SDNPA) to achieve a very satisfactory outcome.

• A project on the horizon is the restoration of the dew pond at Nepcote Green. We are looking to restore the dew pond back to its former glory which will enhance this area for both residents and visitors alike. Again, we are looking to work with the SDNPA for their support.

• The A24 cycle path is another initiative which is supported by West Sussex County Council (WSCC) which is seeking to create a cycle path between Findon Village and Findon Valley along the A24. More details will follow in future editions of Findon News.
