




Findon Village Store News

Last month's article ended with the promise that there would be "more exciting news next month". Well, the time has come and we are now able to celebrate winning the enormously prestigious

Queen's Award for Voluntary Service.

The announcement was made on the day of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, which made it even more special. To put this achievement into perspective, the



The village will host a Ceremony in the Autumn, when the Lord Lieutenant of Sussex, Lady Emma Barnard, will present the award to Steve Smith, who chaired the committee through the rigorous application. There are however many others whose vision, sheer hard work and determination ensured the survival and ultimate success of the shop from the day the original Post Office closed in 2017. It was the inspirational Peter Goldsworthy who set up the famous meeting in the Village Hall when villagers' interest in saving the shop was tested. Many of you will have been present and soon afterwards become "shareholders", not quite in the traditional sense but more as members of the group that was to become the "Findon Village Collective". Peter became our first Chairman; you have probably seen the plaque bearing testament to his achievement outside

the shop. With him were Jan Vandevelde and Helen Woods, appointed Company Secretary and Treasurer respectively, and Jo O'Dell, whose experience in the Post Office proved so useful.

Once the property purchase had been

finalised, the delightful and much missed Bob
Eastabrook calmly led a team of volunteers who redecorated and refitted the premises with almost as much expertise as enthusiasm. Indeed, over 60 wonderful volunteers

have given up their time to serve customers, clean the shop, take deliveries, restock shelves, collect orders and contribute to the Management Committee. Most are still very much involved and keen to encourage others to join. Others whose efforts have been invaluable, whether "front of house" or behind the scenes, include phenomenal fount of all knowledge, encouragement and support, Margaret Bamford, who developed the role of Volunteer Coordinator so brilliantly, and Marketing guru and buyer Becky Fagan. It's thanks to Becky that the shop always looks so stylish as well as appropriately stocked. The gleaming and hygienic shop has been kept sparkling by Ann Hughes and her team including Sue Line and Health and Safety expert, Anne Colville. This is a crucial job and deserves our sincerest appreciation. Annie Whitchurch took responsibility for training new volunteers and has since become Vice Chair of the Management Committee,

Why outdoor play is important

Woodland FINDONVILLAGE PRESCHOOL

Natural environments have long been recognised as great places to feel refreshed and explore. Playing outside gives children the chance to experience nature, have adventures and enjoy the space and freedom for big movements like running, jumping, kicking and throwing. Physical activities like these are good for fitness and physical development.

Spending time outside with friends allows children to test their physical limits, express themselves, and build self-confidence. Having the freedom, time and space to learn, grow and demonstrate independence can help children relax and feel calm. Engaging with nature and experiencing the outdoors boosts cognitive development and promotes healthier, happier minds meaning outdoor play can be good for children's mental health and well-being too.

Outdoor play allows young children to explore who they are and what they can

do. It supports them as they learn to think critically, take risks, and form a true sense of belonging with their peers and with the wider community.

Moreover, when children feel connected to the natural environment, they're more likely to care for it in the future.

Outdoor play can also mean getting messy - and more mess means more fun!

News from Paws Animal Sanctuary

Almost every day I get calls from owners wanting us to take their dogs, cats, rabbits, guineapigs or hens. A Lady this week asked could we take her three cats. I told her we were full and suggested she put them in a cattery. She said "I don't want them back, and one is Diabetic and needs injections every day". I said we have a waiting list. She said "But I'm going on holiday on Tuesday I need you to take them now or I will just let them out". I suggested she postponed her holiday but she said "No I'm not doing that". I told her to try other rescues or ask her neighbours or family to feed them. She slammed the phone down. I hope her poor cats didn't get let out.

When people come home from work in the evenings is the time I get the most phone calls, usually injured birds or hedgehogs or foxes with mange in their garden.

Although yesterday it was a sheep stuck on a ledge. It took all evening ringing round trying to find who owned the sheep. A dog walker was below the sheep and had already rung the fire brigade who wouldn't come out. I tried a list of the local farmers I know. I couldn't fathom out where she was exactly. She was near Hill Barn, up a long tree lined lane opposite the Charmadean Centre, not possible to be reached by car and it was getting dark. In the end she asked some other dog walkers for help. I never did find out if the sheep was rescued as the phone number just records my messages.

We have a flock of Jackdaws who are causing me stress every day. They

sit along the fences. It is like the film "The Birds". As soon as I walk away they all swoop down and eat all the food in my big chicken run, even though the food is hanging up and they have to go through the door inside the hen house. They show no fear and there are so many of them. I need to buy a giant net to put over, although one of the volunteers said we could make a scarecrow. We have put a large realistic owl on top of the henhouse but they ignore it.



The Moles are still here ruining all the lawns. I have tried all the remedies and the solar buzzers down the molehills. They get on everybody's nerves, except the moles.
