### From The Rectory

Although the grass is still brown at the Rectory as I write, there are glimmers of green now here and there after the welcome rain earlier this week. Rain falling on parched, cracked ground tends to run off rather than soaking in for the thirsty roots; only sustained gentle rain can really make a difference. As we think during September of the wonder of creation, and give thanks for a harvest safely gathered in during special Services in our churches, the analogy of rain falling on parched ground is a useful metaphor for our faith too. Only too often, we become complacent, taking all we have for granted, but not recognising that it is through God's bounty, can lead to our becoming parched spiritually, growing ever more selfish and self-centred. As we give thanks for the blessings of the harvest, we must also remember those whose harvest has failed through drought as in East Africa, those who go hungry because of military blockades in the war against Ukraine. We mustn't forget those in our own area struggling either, and this year the local Homeless Charity, Turning Tides, has asked for monetary contributions rather than the tins and packets we usually collect at our Church Harvest festivals. This is so they can target exactly what their clients need through our generosity. As you appreciate the skill of our flower arrangers this Harvest-tide, please be as generous as you can in the retiring collection for Turning Tides after Findon's Harvest festival on 25th September or that Clapham Church on

October 16<sup>th</sup>. Donations can of course also be made via the Turning Tides website directly, as you watch their promotional video. Thank you.

Walking Tilly around the village, I've noticed a number of properties for sale, with some recently sold. If you have a new neighbour, it would be lovely if you let me know so I could welcome them to our Parish and to the village (whichever of the 3 it is!) We have produced a 'Welcome' leaflet which can be given to new residents, and to avoid duplication, Wendy is keeping a record of addresses where one has been given. There are leaflets available in each of our churches, so if you deliver one yourself to a new neighbour, please let the Office know the address.

Congratulations to Evelyn Stanford whose tireless and dedicated work in our Parish has been recognised by the Diocese awarding her the Order of St Richard. This award was instigated by the Bishop of Chichester in 2019, to thank people across the Diocese in our Parishes who quietly get on with essential tasks without being asked and without expecting thanks. Evelyn, along with other people from across the Diocese, will receive her award at a special Service in Chichester Cathedral in the autumn.

Finally, my thoughts and prayers are with all children and young people as they head back to schools and colleges


#### Cinnamon Trust Cream Tea

Our next meeting, Thursday 8th September, 7.30pm is a change from our planned talk and is entitled 'All Things British'.


As always, there will be a raffle and coffee, tea and cake for all Visitors are very welcome - we look forward to seeing you.



The Hall continues to be busy and it's great to see it fully utilised again. Before long we will be starting film nights again too – so keep your eyes open for the posters!

The safety fence at the rear of the hall has now been completed and I would like to thank all those who helped get it done – we were very lucky and a large number of people mucked into what was hot and hard work as it turned out. Apart from Trust committee members, we also had support from Men-in-Sheds, Findon Volunteers, Richard Thomas and, especially, Chris Buqué who provided the skill (and remarkable hole digging expertise!)

Now that project is done we have plans for one or two more in order to improve the facilities at the Hall for everyone's benefit. The pile of hardcore is still available for those who need it – from a barrowful to a truckload

The work to sort out funding and get the extension completed is continuing and we are in process of supporting the

Parish Council in receiving and evaluating responses to the request for tenders to complete the job. The contractors we have met so far have given us a good impression and we are confident in their capability – cost and availability remain to be determined. Availability is an issue because there will be a significant gap and another public consultation before the funding can be agreed and the work started. However, onwards and upwards we are now making faster progress than has been possible for some time.

I am very pleased to report that we have the extra volunteers we were looking for to bolster the events team – but it's not too late, if you'd like to help, we can always use more. We are still looking for a secretary.....

The more people there are with the knowledge and confidence in how to operate these life-saving machines is not only reassuring for the community as a whole, but for each of us individually who may one day be in a position to help should an emergence arise.

The next practical/refresher course will be held at the Village Hall on

Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> September starting at 6.30pm. The course will again be run by Hayley, who is responsible for first aid training at the David Lloyd gym - where some of you may recall she was instrumental in saving my husband's

life by using a defibrillator & CPR back in 2018.


The course is free and open to all. Newcomers to the village will be particularly welcome, as will current Village Shop volunteers (since one of the defibrillators is located very close to the Shop).

#### News from Paws

We have had some lovely friendly cats recently, and we really hate to see them go. The volunteers have a tea-break every day at eleven o'clock, when they usually let all the cats out to have some fussing. Most are very frightened when they arrive but when they see all the other cats let out they soon come out and join in. We have two kittens who are tearing around chasing balls and this makes even the old cats want to join in. But one cat arrived who was from a bad home. We were told the children were unruly and treated the cat badly, even throwing it down the stairs as a kitten. The cat will only come out of her bed late at night and sits and waits for me to give her some treats. She eats all her food during the night and nobody can get near her; she attacks anyone who goes in her pen. It is so sad and is going to take a long time for her to trust us.

We have so many calls a week from dog owners wanting us to take their dogs. Our kennels are in Lancing and Denise (Dee) who runs the kennels is so good with the dogs. Some dogs are aggressive when they arrive, out of fear, but after a day or two she lets them out; in and out of the kennels and in and out of her house all mixing together and they wag their tails and soon settle down. She has found homes for so many. We had an Akita who was very aggressive at first but was so friendly when he left to go to a new home. Last week a Lurcher, a Bulldog, and a Bull Mastiff all went to new homes.

Here at the Sanctuary, we have Guinea-pigs coming in almost

every week, but also have lots of calls from people wanting Guinea-pigs. Some stay permanently if they are blind or disabled. Johnny Depp and Kevin went to a new home today.

We get lots of injured Pigeons. One arrived today with no injuries but both wings lying on the floor so he cannot fly. But no vets, or wildlife rescue will see them because of bird flu. The hot weather made our wild life pond smell so bad it needed emptying. I removed all the fish, put them in our big pond, took out all the plants, rocks and water and was lying on my stomach wiping out the empty pond with an old towel when a couple arrived to adopt a couple of Guineapigs.

### Let Movement be your Medicine

### **Amanda Evans**

Did you know that there is a creative and inspirational way to let go of stress and break old unhelpful patterns of behaviour by using mindfulness, movement and dance?

Our body is full of memories, even the ones we can't remember. When do we ever honour our body's memories? As we experience life, we embody our thoughts and emotions creating intrinsic lifelong patterns of thought and behaviour. Our bodies move as our minds think. By bringing awareness to our body at these times, we have the opportunity to acknowledge and let go of those patterns that no longer serve us well.

Dance of Awareness is a group movement practice that aims to increase self-awareness and selfacceptance. It allows us to acknowledge and celebrate our experiences; using breath, movement and dance to perfectly selected music and gentle invitation, helping us to experience ourself in new ways by shifting the thought from the mind and out through the body. The wave of music starts low and meditative but changes up gradually to an energetic peak returning low again to bring a satisfying completion to the whole cycle. It gives you the opportunity to celebrate yourself and each other as a whole group; it is quite an experience.

You have the opportunity to stretch your boundaries a little, come out of your comfort zone {not too much if not ready) but sensitively with awareness... learning to understand that you are in control of your own experience and putting that into practice.

Try a very small experiment for one week, such as sitting in a different chair to watch TV... take a different route to walk the dog... use the other hand to open the front door, whatever it is, become aware of your automatic patterns, change things up a bit, do it with awareness, it might feel weird for a while but who knows it might encourage you to implement some small changes elsewhere in your life ... Change, Evolve, Transform. As you see yourself more completely, you will have more compassion for your own patterns supporting self-awareness and selfacceptance.

Dance of Awareness gives you a whole new perspective on your everyday life; it is a nonverbal group practice with many years of research behind its method and works with skill and care providing you with a safe framework for your experience.

No steps to learn, you can't do anything wrong just experience the moment you are in; it can be great fun and the least you will come away with is having had a great dance about on a Friday night. Things my participants have said... 'beautiful' 'profound', 'transformative' 'such beautiful music' 'I feel so free' 'I feel alive' 'I feel long held tension release'


