Well, I'd like to be able to say that blue skies and a gentle sun welcomed us on the morning of the 'Queen's Award for Voluntary Service' ceremony, but, instead, we woke to the sound of driving rain. Not the best weather when a marquee had to be erected and preparations completed within a tight timeframe. But, thankfully, the weather improved suddenly and dramatically, and things were able to go ahead without too many tweaks.

Sometimes it's easy to take what the shop does for granted; everyone focuses on their bit, and we lose sight of the bigger picture. So, it was opportune when the Lord Lieutenant of West Sussex, Lady Emma Barnard, the mayor of Worthing, Henna Chowdhury, and Hugh Bonneville, who was on the interviewing panel and needs no further introduction, spelt out exactly what the community of Findon has achieved. Together, we have bought shares in the shop, set it up, stepped forward during lockdowns, and now, five years on, 'second generation' volunteers are coming on board to consolidate and maintain momentum. They were, quite simply, wonderful.

The afternoon was very well attended: volunteers past and present (and maybe future?); committee members; shareholders, and customers. It was a wonderful opportunity to meet new people, familiar friends, to put faces to the names we see on the volunteer rota, and enjoy the wonderful canapés.

And now to other matters ... You have probably seen Maggie Martin's beautiful greeting cards of Sunflowers, to support Ukraine. Maggie will create Findon Village Store Christmas cards this year, which will hopefully be for sale in early November.

Royal Mail workers are stepping up their strikes in November. Strike dates include Black Friday week and Cyber Monday. Findon Post Office will be open throughout, but advise that overseas Christmas posting is done as soon as possible to avoid any backlog. It might be good to get parcels tracked or signed for so that customers can monitor packages throughout any strikes. You don't want that precious pair of socks for great aunt Edna to go missing! You may have noticed that postage stamps are getting bigger, and are coming into the digital age. The theory is that customers will be able to watch and share exclusive Shaun the Sheep(!) videos via the barcode using the Royal Mail App. What it means in practice is that the stamps we have been using will not be valid after 31st January 2023. So, please, look through your pockets, wallets, purses and drawers, and root out all your nonbarcoded stamps. You can either use them before 31st January 2023, or swap them for barcoded ones using Royal Mail's 'Swap Out service'. **PLEASE NOTE: You cannot do this through the post office**. Please go to <u>www.royalmail.com/barcodedstamps</u> for more details and to print a form. Your old stamps can then be swapped for new, barcoded ones using the FREEPOST address. Good luck!

Findon's Dairy History. Part I.

In the 1920's Findon was home to two of the best dairy herds in the country. These were British Friesian's. This breed had developed from black and white cattle imported from Holland in the late 19th c. (Most of the cows on farms today are Holstein-Friesian's. A slightly bigger animal, carrying less fat, developed in America and Canada with a higher milk yield.)

One enthusiast of British Friesians at the start of the 20th c. was Horace Hale, a farmers son from Hertfordshire. Tolmare Farm, Findon was up to rent and Horace applied to the landlord Col. Margesson from Findon Place. The Col. took a liking to young Horace and gave him the tenancy on two conditions, and made one promise. The conditions were that he married his fiancée, and bought, at least, some sheep. The promise was that if he was successful, the Col. would build him a new cow-stall and dairy.

Horace hurried got married and went to the Chatsmore Hotel for his honeymoon. The trouble was that this clashed with Findon Sheep Fair. He left his new wife at the hotel and attended the fair to buy some sheep. This caused some residents, in good humour, referring to her as the 'abandoned bride'.

Local farmers were sceptical about keeping dairy cows on land previously only used for sheep, but he proved them wrong, and the Col. kept his promise and built a dairy complex. Horace was a master cattle breeder. He combined some of the best bloodlines of the breed and had a big influence nationally.

So successful was he that in 1920 and 1921 he won a gold cup for the best dairy herd in the country. The herd name was 'Kingswood'. I thought that Horace may have lived at Kingswood on the A24, but no, he lived at The Kennels. He seemed to be well into village life, with a place on the Parish Council, then in 1923 he moved to Surrey. In 1948 his son took much of the herd to South Africa.

I came across 'Kingswood' soon after starting work in East Sussex. The farmer went to a sale in Surrey and bought a cow called Kingswood Diekmar Judy 3rd. She was a large deep bodied cow with three large black spots on one side. These were slightly over lapping, two symmetrically, slightly apart at the top and one at the bottom. The herdsman told me "Those spots cost us an extra 500 guineas because the boss was all set to drop out at 1,500 but his missus kept digging him in the ribs and saying 'have another bid for Mickey Mouse', so she cost us 2.000."

News from Paws Animal

What a hectic month we have had, times flies so fast, the telephones have never been so busy. People returning to work found they had problems leaving their dogs alone in an empty house. With adults at work and children back at school, dogs were not used to being left on their own for hours. Some dogs bark every day as soon as they were left on their own. Neighbours start to complain. If the dogs were also ripping up the carpets and destroying the furniture, dog owners at their wits end would try to find homes for their dogs. All the Rescues were soon full and unable to take in any more dogs.

Discussing it with friends, that we always contacted in the past when we were asked to take in Rottweiler's, Dobermans or other large dogs, they understood our worries with our phones ringing constantly from people needing to find homes for their dogs. What could we do? The owners have already tried all the phone numbers for all the dog rescues.

We are so busy at PAWS every day with all our other animals, with four old resident dogs, we couldn't take in any more dogs.

So we got together, and my friends decided they could help out and build a couple of kennels and take in unwanted dogs and find homes for them. Nobody realised just how many dogs they would have, they are run off their feet every week. They are very successful at calming the dogs down, not locking them up in kennels, actually free to roam indoors with constant attention, and not left alone they all blossom. At the kennels it is like therapy for the dogs they are living with people who understand them and their fears. Three Yorkies arrived last week all matted, needing clipping, bathing and their long nails cut. They've been to the vets for worming and flea treatment and now all three need their teeth sorted out.

We have had so many cats this year, stray cats, dumped cats, old unwanted cats. So busy, we were constantly running out of cat litter and cat food. At one point we had pens of only black cats. We put pictures of them online and facebook every week as 'cat of the week' and eventually they all found new homes.

We have stray rabbits all the time and so many Guinea-pigs. As soon as the dark and cold nights arrive we get constant requests asking us if we can take in more animals. All the animals are cleaned out every day needing feeding and grooming. We continually need to buy hay, straw, sacks of animal food, fruit and vegetables, rubber gloves, disinfectant, and need a steady supply of clean towels. We use extra strong black bags by the hundred and can only find the ones strong enough to put horse manure or cat litter in from The Trading Post in Barnham. We are busy all the time and couldn't cope without our wonderful reliable hard-working team of volunteers.

Peace reigns until morning when the Cockerel starts crowing.
