

Comit's new life

This handsome horse is Comit. He lives alone alongside the Monarch's Way bridleway, between Findon High Street and the A24.

His field is

uneven and full of ragwort, brambles, nettles and poor grass. It's not a great place to keep a horse, and you're probably wondering how he ended up there.

Sadly, Comit's back story is one of mistreatment and neglect. He was a pacer horse, owned by travellers, and used for trotting races. A vet, who had previously treated Comit, told us that he would have been given drugs to make him go faster.

The drugs ruined his hooves and so the travellers lost interest in him. Luckily, they'd asked a young woman called Alice to look after Comit and she agreed to take him on properly. Comit is starting a new life under Alice's ownership.

Comit is a very friendly horse. Even the vet noted how extraordinarily goodnatured he is with people. There is something special about him, for sure. Many a dog-walker has fallen under his

spell since he's been in Findon, as he loves a bit of chat over the fence, and the occasional carrot or apple.

In the last month or so, some of the village parish volunteers have been trying to help Alice improve Comit's situation. Under the imaginative title "Project Comit", we've been clearing and burning the sweet brown ragwort in Comit's small bit of field (it's really not good enough to call a paddock).

Alice had been trying to keep Comit away from the worst areas of ragwort with some rudimentary tape fencing. So, some of the volunteers very kindly improved the fencing. However, Comit is a bit of a bulldozer, and we soon discovered that this horse has attitude. To sum it up, his attitude is "Pah! Fences mean nothing to me!"

At first, we thought that someone was breaking the fencing deliberately. But we soon realised Comit was biting the tape fasteners and pushing his way into other parts of the field where there was tastier grass and nettles. He got through taped fencing, then wire fencing and then through barbed wire! This has been such a worry, not only because he might hurt himself, or get a taste for the ragwort, but also because of his proximity to the A24!

Alice is keen to find a better place for Comit but there are obstacles to negotiate before this can happen. He has recently been gelded (castrated). Alice hopes that this will help him live happily with other horses. But he's 12 years old, which means that his

behaviour around other horses may not be improved by becoming a gelding. Only time will tell.

In the meantime, Alice needs help and support to give Comit the care and good life that he deserves. The ragwort needs clearing properly (ideally with machinery), the fencing needs to be made Comit-proof, and the stable needs fixing up. If you have practical skills and time to share, please contact Alice on 07805 254507.

Most Project Comit volunteers are from the litter-picking team and are used to shifting stuff. So we are also helping to move the manure heap away from the side of the stable to a safer place. Its current location risks rotting the stable end and is a fire risk. It's also better for Comit to be away from the flies and parasites that are attracted to the heap. It's proving a great workout for our volunteers! Unfortunately, the manure is contaminated with ragwort seed so is unsuitable for gardeners to use.

So, please, come on down. You'll find a friendly face, and a light and cosy space, as well as almost certainly finding that particular item you were looking for.

And, while I'm on that subject, can I just mention our manager, Angus, who goes well beyond the call of duty. On occasions when a certain item isn't delivered to the shop, he has been known to go down to supermarket further afield to source it so that our customers don't have to go without. You wouldn't get many managers doing that.

That's the whole ethos behind the shop – everyone, from the management committee downwards, giving above and beyond to ensure the success of the shop. A big thank you to the volunteers who come in faithfully, week after week, to take their turn on the rota. And a special thank you to volunteers who come in at very short notice to cover emergencies. A whole army of volunteers work together to make the shop right at the hub of village life: to collect stock, maybe from as far away as Brighton, or put stock out on shelves, or even keep the shop looking so clean.

Which reminds me. We could always do with more volunteers, and, this month, we're particularly looking for someone to organise the stock and shelves prior to our Thursday delivery coming in. Storage is at a premium in the shop, especially as our range increases, and things can get a bit jumbled as we are always filling shelves against the clock, at the same time as serving. So, if there is anyone out there who loves organising, we'd love to hear from you! An hour or so on a Wednesday afternoon would be great.

And thank you to our customers who support the shop. It's lovely to see and chat with all our regulars, and maybe share a joke or two. The men's talk seems to be dominated by football, which I don't get at all, but there we are. It takes all sorts. What I do get, however, is how we try to listen to our customers. A number have told us recently that there have been problems with the milk not staying fresh for as long as it should. So, accordingly, we have done our research, and changed our supplier. Any feedback is welcome, and of course we hope that it'll be positive!

The 2023 Christmas stamps will be released on 2nd November! I think they might depict Christmas carols, but best to go to our local post office to check! Village Hall News

I would like to start with a big thank you to the Parish Council - because the extension is just being desnagged and we are already using it! Sean Hellett, on behalf of the Parish Council has done a super job in managing the project with Cloud 9, the contractors. We don't have heating yet because organising an uprated gas meter was a much greater challenge and took me (not the council!) much longer than I expected! Fingers crossed, the meter will be in and the gas connected by 8/11... We are also now in a position to install the new kitchen and, all being well, that will go in at much the same time. The sound system, so kindly sponsored by the Village Shop is up and running already. Now that we have the two rooms we have decided that "Main Hall" and any of the various terms we have been using for the extension lack a little something – so we have decided that the original hall will now be called the Chanctonbury Hall and the extension Nepcote Hall.

We held our first Tea, Biscuits and chat session of the season on Monday, 16th in Nepcote Hall and had a very good attendance. This will carry on until well into the New Year now – the fact that we have a second room means we don't have to hope for gaps in the booking anymore! Those who attended the tea biscuits and those who have joined us for previews will know that, just as in Chanctonbury Hall before our jury rigged "acoustic modification", we have an issue with echo in the new

hall. This was not something that was covered in the original project and therefore neither could it be included in the Public Works Loan project. The trust will be addressing this with a more permanent solution applied to both rooms in the near future.

The other activity that has been taking up some time lately is the application for a premises licence to cover alcohol sales at events without the need for us to apply for an individual "TENS" licence each time. This was further prompted by the reduction in the permissible number of licences from 21 to 15 next year - which would have been a real problem for us. The application was submitted some weeks ago and the consultation period finished yesterday (at the time of writing!), on the 19th. We don't know if the licence will be granted yet but, having had useful and extensive discussions with both the Police and the Arun Environmental Health Department we are cautiously optimistic. By the time you read this we should know.

Film nights have started their new season although please note that some are on Saturday nights this year. The fact that we now own the projection equipment ourselves reduces our costs significantly which is a welcome relief given other costs! We look forward to seeing you for the future showings!

Inevitably, as we exploit our new capacity to take more bookings, pressure on



Ann gave us a very interesting history of the college founded by musician and song-writer Richard Stilgoe, His vision was to create a place where disabled people and students could work together for longer than a week – to change their own and other people's lives by creating new music and performing in public. The Orpheus Centre opened in 1997 at Richard Stilgoe's former family home. This year they celebrate their 25th anniversary. Starting with five disabled students, the college now has sixty-eight, twentythree residential places and day students who study for a minimum of three years. A transition programme helps them to develop individual strengths and many go on to paid or voluntary work. Ann finished by sharing some case studies with us, talking about young people and adults she has supported during her twenty-three years as a volunteer.

fascinating collection of theatre programmes.

Findon Parish Volunteer Groups

Findon is so fortunate to have active voluntary groups helping in and around the Village. We have three regular "outside" working parties all of which work under the backing of Findon Parish Council. These are the Open Spaces Working Party which meets every Wednesday morning, The Litter Group which has one main session per month on the last Friday, with additional litter picking in between, and The Findon Wildflower Group which meets roughly every Spring and Autumn and occasionally in between. Whenever you see them working, they'll be in their Findon Village Volunteers hi-vis jackets.

The overall aim of these Groups is to help keep Findon looking clean, tidy and attractive and a village of which we can all feel proud.

The Working Party has been "going strong" since 2016. During the last 12 months, its members have spent much time keeping footpaths clear in the village and also those adjacent to the A24. They have also cleaned out blocked road gullies in High Street, Cross Lane, Nepcote Lane and near The Quadrangle. Other jobs have included churchyard leaf clearance, repairs to and painting the Preschool building and maintenance of the bus shelters. Last winter we helped the tree warden, Matthew Ward, with tree planting in the village and helped water them later in the year. Another job was tree trimming to make room for The Sheep Fair pony rides.

The team is out there every Wednesday morning come rain or shine - well more

or less but just a bit dependent on how wet it might be - enjoying the exercise and open air. The group is always looking for new members. Please email Robin Carr: grdcarr@outlook.com if you would like to join up.

The Litter Group, very ably led by Chess Thomas, meets on the last Friday morning of each month with some additional litter picking in between the main collections. On average about 15 to 20 bags of litter are collected every month, plus an assortment of car parts (often wheel hubs), packaging material and construction debris. The bulk of the rubbish comes from alongside the A24 and the Long Furlong layby. However, there is litter wherever people park their cars or walk around the village, which keeps the group busy. We are grateful to Arun District Council cleansing department for their help in collecting and disposing of the rubbish.

The fact that so much litter is collected on such a consistent basis is a sad reflection of the "throwaway" society we live in today.

News from Paws Animal Sanctuary

Sunday evening it was getting dark just after six o'clock, all of the hens had put themselves to bed, I noticed one hen still out sitting on the lawn, I bent down and picked her up, I slipped sideways on the wet grass and fell down heavily. I couldn't save myself because I had my hands out holding the hen. Emma, a young volunteer, heard me scream and came running, it took all her strength to haul me up. The pain was excruciating. I had landed on my side and hit my jaw, shoulder, elbow, hip, knee and ankle everything hurt. It took ages to get back to the house sliding my feet an inch at a time. I sat in the chair until next morning thinking I was just badly bruised. My two dogs were with me when I fell and they thought they had caused my accident. They both sat together looking guilty until I called them over and reassured them it wasn't their fault.

I rang my daughter and told her I'd had a fall so she drove straight over. She called the ambulance and I was taken to Worthing Hospital. I had an x-ray and scan and I was told I had cracked a ball joint in my hip and fractured my Pelvis. Fortunately, I have a Stannah stair lift and electric bath lift at home because I am waiting for a new knee so, after a week in hospital, I was allowed home. I cannot do anything at the Sanctuary for 6-8 weeks.

The volunteers are carrying on as usual. My daughter and granddaughter are taking excellent care of me, I can get out of bed with the help of a zimmer frame, although even with painkillers trying to walk is still excruciating. Luckily, we have a visiting vet checking on our animals and the day to day work at Paws still goes on. This week a cat has been reserved, and Desmond the Guinea-pig has gone to a new home.

Next year I am hoping to put all the animal poems together that friends and volunteers have written and given to me to publish The Paws Animal Sanctuary Collection of Animal Poems. Hopefully we can sell the books to raise funds for the Sanctuary. Hoping there are not too many fireworks this year upsetting our animals.




