## From the Rectory

Wet and windy it is as I write this, at the start of Lent and looking ahead hoping for better weather soon! Lent is named from the old English word for spring and with the milder weather, the primroses are out early in Findon Churchyard, but the snowdrops and crocuses don't enjoy the wild weather we've been having. If you haven't been up to the church, do go in between showers – the flowers are lovely, especially the flowering cherry tree.

The first Sunday of the month at Findon Church is a chance to enjoy different styles of music as we invite groups of musicians and singers to help lead our worship. This month it is a joy to have the choir of St John the Baptist School coming to the 10am Service on March 3<sup>rd</sup>. This is part of the partnership between school, community and church and this year the school choir is particularly talented so do join us if you can! We are so lucky in this Parish to have strong links with both our Primary Schools and all three Villages benefit greatly from the church and community links, as do the pupils at the schools.

Through March there are a number of exciting things going on in the churches. Mothering Sunday is always the second Sunday of Lent and is an opportunity to remember and give thanks for all who have 'mothered' us through our lives. Mothering means caring for, and is not restricted to our biological mothers, although our parents usually are those whom we remember most as providing the love and support we all need in our childhood. Often misnamed 'Mother's Day', Mothering Sunday has a long history in this country, going back to the days when young people left home to

go into Service on big country estates or town houses at a young age. This Sunday was often the only opportunity they had annually to visit family and their 'Mother Church'. As a child, we celebrated both Mothering Sunday (2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Lent) and Mother's Day (Finnish Äitien päivä: 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in May) and the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in May is commonly celebrated in Europe, acknowledging the part played by mothers with gifts of flower posies or chocolates. Use of the word Mothering allows us to give thanks for dads, grandparents and many others who have supported our lives. In church, we offer flowers as thanksgiving symbols, and often people will place these on a loved one's grave in thanksgiving and remembrance, in addition to children giving them to mum.

The following Sunday is called Passion Sunday in the church and marks the start of Holy Week, when we remember the last days of Jesus' life on earth. On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday that week, there is the opportunity to walk the Way of the Cross in each of our churches in turn (details at the back of this magazine) through the Stations of the Cross. If you have never experienced this, why not try it this year? It is a prayerful and thought-provoking experience, giving time to thank God for all Jesus did for us on the cross. On Maundy Thursday this year, we will have a Communion Service in Findon Church at 7.30pm, followed by a bowl of soup and roll before the Watch of the Passion, which will be in the Lady Chapel as usual.

Please sign up on the list (in all 3 churches) if you would like to join us for soup, so we know how much to prepare. On Palm Sunday the Findon Service starts later (at 10am) as we meet in the Rectory garden for bacon rolls then process through the Village to the church. Good Friday has an extra Messy Church event at the Rectory before we process to Pond Green and details of this and the later meditations can be found in the table at the back of Findon News. We are trialling the Easter early Service at 7.30am (instead of 6am) as the clocks change on Easter Sunday, in the hope that families might join us for bacon rolls after that Service before the main Family Service at 10am followed by the traditional Easter Egg

Hunt. The Easter Candle is blessed at the early Service and we welcome Jacob and Evie Thwaites with their family and friends as they are baptised at Findon in the 10am Service. It is wonderful to have baptisms in this Service as we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus and traditionally this was when families were baptised in the early Church.

# Findon Parish Council Report

*Linda Martin - Chairman*

I am very pleased to announce that we have another councillor who has joined us following co-option at the FPC meeting on 22 January 2024, Mrs Lisa Kenna, and we are looking forward to working with her. There are still two vacancies for co-option and if you want to find out more information, please do get in touch with our Clerk, Fiona 01903 877225) or (Clerk@findonparishcouncil.gov.uk.

Findon Parish Council (FPC) has finalised and approved the annual precept/budget which will help fund changes within the village during the course of the 2024/2025 financial year. The precept will be £58k (an increase of £2.63 per annum or £0.05 per week for a Band D equivalent household).

You may have seen the recent press releases from West Sussex County Council regarding Operation Watershed. Findon received positive press regarding the works undertaken at The Quadrangle/A24. FPC had successfully submitted an application for this location and the costs were fully funded by Operation Watershed.

The planning application for the land at Elm Rise (SDNP/23/04993/FUL) was considered at the FPC Planning Committee meeting on 15 February 2024 and was well attended by residents. It was clear that the residents and the Planning Committee shared the same concerns regarding the application, and the lack of information and detail contained in the application. As a result, the Committee felt unable to either support or object and this will be reflected in the response to the SDNPA. The FPC response will be published on the SDNPA Public Access System

Simple Search (southdowns.gov.uk) FPC is a statutory consultee for Findon planning applications and consultations, however the decision maker for planning applications is the SDNPA.

With winter behind us, we can now all look forward to spring and hope for drier spring weather. There is always plenty of work to do in the garden I have found.

This month I want to highlight the work carried out by the Findon Wild Flower group who have done a sterling job in developing beds to encourage wild flowers back to the village. You may recall that this is a new project which has been backed by the Parish Council in conjunction with South Downs National Park Authority (SDNPA). It was certainly a challenge to name some of the varieties of wildflowers. Just to help you, a number of spring flowers have already been planted, ie, snowdrops, bluebells, primrose, violets and cowslips and it is hoped these will flower in the spring and summer of this year and/or next year. The feedback from residents has been very encouraging and the group are continuing to thrive. Sian Keating is the knowledgeable lady who leads the group and it is worth noting that the group was only established a year ago. There are eight volunteers who meet intermittently from spring through to autumn.

Hurrah! Spring is definitely around the corner, and we see signs of it everywhere: daffodils, lighter evenings, and birdsong. And, by the time you've read about all the ways in which the shop is 'springing' into spring, you'll be heading straight down there with a 'spring' in your step!

This March is full of Spring celebrations. First off will be Mother's Day. Many customers comment on the fantastic collection of cards we stock, and I'm sure our Mother's Day cards will be very popular. So don't leave it too late to pop in and buy yours. ## **MORE ON FINDON SWIMMING POOL**

### **– *HELP WILL SOON BE NEEDED!***

In last month's FN we advertised that we would soon be able to call a public meeting to discuss how the rebooted Findon Swimming Club will function once the pool reopens after its renovation. Unfortunately, we cannot yet advise a date for this meeting but will try to do so next month.

In the meantime, we can still appeal for help with all the tasks that will have to be undertaken so that the club can run successfully. To run the pool this summer we will need an army of volunteers to help out. Duties to be undertaken include daily water testing, general pool management/on-going maintenance and most importantly life-guarding at every swimming session. Training will be given for all of these roles, especially in First-Aid and pool operation. With enough volunteers the shared workload will be both easy and enjoyable.

**Findon has done this very successfully in the past – we now need to do it all again.** If you have been a volunteer in years gone by and now, quite understandably, feel that you have done your bit (and so its time for others to help), we would ask that you please still consider stepping forward to advise others on how this was done.

The running to the pool is done by the outside community via a constituted swimming club to facilitate access for all: doing the dual roles of providing pupil access to swimming during term-time **for all those at our school**, and public swimming sessions (and private

pool hire), during the summer holidays. The pool's operation is quite different to that of most other pools, although the standards that must be met are the same. The original club had some excellent admin systems in place to ensure a continuous stream of volunteers guaranteed coverage throughout the season. Garnering all of these skills will be one of the aims of our first public swimming pool club meeting.

During the last 18 months a great deal of hard work, fund-raising and renovation activity has got the pool close to reopening. Thanks to the help of local businesses and kind individual donations the pool walls and lining have been repaired and much of the plant restored. Everyone has done a tremendous job to get us to where we are today. The first step to doing this involves a **charity quiz**.

Whilst going into training, trekking the local Downs as many times as she can over the next few months, Melanie will be working very hard to raise funds for CoppaFeel! Her biggest fundraising venture to-date is this “CoppaQuiz” which is being hosted at St Mary’s Church Hall in Goring-by-sea on **Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> March** from 07.00. Ticket prices are £15 and include quiz entry; a fish and chip supper and a glass of wine and there will be a raffle as well with plenty of prizes that have been generously donated by local businesses and national companies. Therefore, please see this as an invitation to come along to an amazing evening in which you will be fed and watered, entertained, could win some fab prizes and can rest assured that it is all in aid of a really brilliant cause.

Having applied to do this, without really thinking that she had a hope of getting on the trek, Melanie was absolutely thrilled to learn that she will be one of 120 people trekking the Brecon Beacons alongside actress/author/podcaster, **Giovanna Fletcher**, and Strictly Come Dancing’s **Amy Dowden**, and other not-yet-announced celebrities. And, even more important than this, she will be walking with many incredibly awe-inspiringly

strong women who have experienced, and are still experiencing, breast cancer.

Melanie was inspired to enter this event by her sister-in-law, Clare, and her bravery and strength following diagnosis of secondary breast cancer in her 40s. Melanie’s grandmother also had breast cancer and her mum was a breast care nurse specialist at the breast unit at Worthing Hospital for over 15 years, so this is a cause that is very close to her heart. The importance of early detection and the impact that it can have on a prognosis cannot be emphasised enough. CoppaFeel! works to raise awareness particularly in young people and encourage them to check regularly and accurately so that they can get diagnosed early.

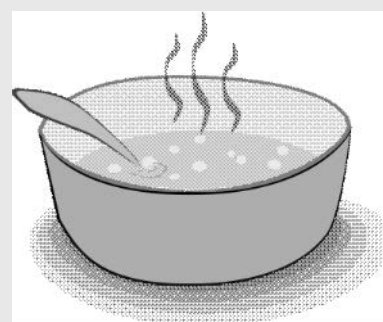

## Village Hall News

A bit of a mixed month for the hall this time – a lot of good things but one unfortunate incident which will result in an insurance claim.

The good news is that the first sound absorption panels have been fitted in both halls. Nepcote, of course was in most need and has had quite a few panels fitted. This has made a dramatic difference and the reverberation performance is now acceptable – however, we are not quite satisfied and will be fitting two more 2m x 1 m panels which will, we expect, give us a very good result. Those panels will be in place by the time you read this. The connecting door between the halls has also been fitted with an acoustic seal which should reduce hall-to-hall significantly too. In Chanctonbury we fitted a smaller number of smaller panels in the reduced height section of the hall and this has made a significant difference in this area. However, the acoustic performance of this hall is still dependent on the “temporary” and rather scrappy stage curtains on the far wall. We are now investigating two possible solutions – replacing the curtains with new ones, purpose made for the application, or using more panels, covering a smaller area of the end wall but located at both ends of the hall. We need to understand which is the more cost effective and most functionally appropriate and discuss further within the Trust. We have also adjusted the lighting in Nepcote so that the glare has been significantly reduced. We will seek user feedback on the results as there are further improvements we can make but this will require hardware replacements.

Further good news is that the level of bookings for the new hall is very encouraging and we are seeing usage of both halls on most weekdays with frequent overlaps – so our increased capacity is being used already.

The defibrillator has been fitted, is wired up and ready for use – it is on the outside of the porch and clearly visible from the road.

The bad news is that we had a water pipe failure in the Chanctonbury kitchen - the armoured flexible hose supplying hot water to one of the sink taps perished and split when there was no-one in the hall. The leak carried on for an unknown period of up to 4 hours before a hirer arrived and raised the alarm (Thank you Enzo!). There was a LOT of water, flooding the entire kitchen and extending over the wooden floor of the hall over a roughly triangular patch 7m along the wall by the kitchen and around 4.5-5m across the hall. The damage is not immediately obvious if you simply walk into the hall and most hirers would barely notice – but the dance groups DO notice as the planks have “cupped” – turning up at the edges and the floor is no longer smooth and level plank to plank. The insurers have accepted the claim and we will have authorised the work before you read this. There will be a drying out period before work can start and Chanctonbury will have to be closed for several days while the work is done.

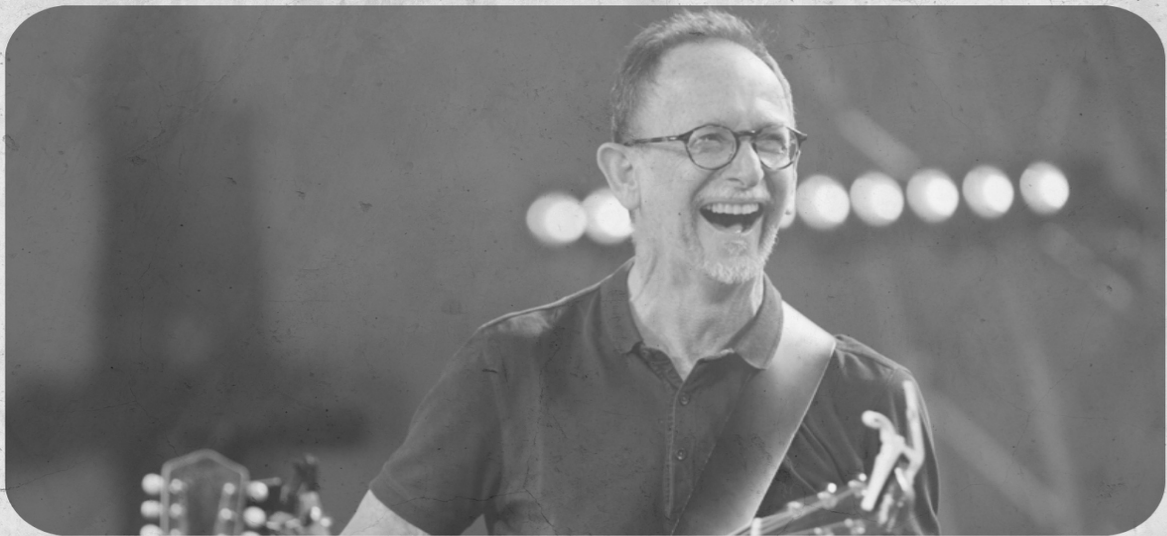
