North Green Restoration

Members of the North Green Rescue Group with help from the Village's Working Party have been working on the completion of the bund built next to the new fencing surrounding North Green. The intention is that the combination of fence plus bund (like Nepcote Green itself) will make North Green as secure as is possible against future travel incursion.

Following initial work carried out by a contractor, the volunteers got to work,

which included the final shaping of the bund following deliveries of soil, spreading the top soil, helping sow grass seed and in view of the dry weather watering when needed.

The accompanying photos show rakes being used in the final shaping of the bund and watering being carried out (on 15th August) to help consolidate the bund before the Sheep Fair on 14th Sept.

As you read this, I hope you have managed to find time to enjoy some of the good weather we had in August. Fingers crossed now for a fine September.



All 3 churches are open daily, as well as for weekly Services, and are well worth a visit to admire the architecture and enjoy the peaceful surroundings. There are seats outside too, where you can admire the view as you listen to the birds. Often, I see walkers resting outside one of the churches, perhaps enjoying a wellearned snack.

Of course, these ancient buildings take a lot of looking after, and I am hugely grateful to our Church wardens for all their care in ensuring any building work necessary is addressed as soon as possible (and for applying for grants from various organisations, some of which are successful!). This is of course expensive! We would not be able to maintain our lovely buildings without the support of the Friends of St John the Baptist Church and Friends of Clapham and Patching. Both groups run fundraising events through the year, which are always great fun, and this means that our Church Council can approach them for financial support when needed. All funds are generated for the maintenance of the building concerned.





As I type, the flood damage to the floor in Chanctonbury floor is being repaired and the soundproofing modifications to the wall between the two halls are also in process. The improvement in soundproofing won't be properly effective until we have modified the interconnecting door as well as the wall as we have to address both "leak paths" before we get the proper effect. We have a plan for the door and should complete that soon too. We hope that this work will significantly improve the hall to hall sound

By the time you read this, the second new heating controller should be in place and the heating connected up to the new system which links the heating to the Hallmaster booking system. This should save us a good deal of money and reduce our carbon footprint.

The work on the toilet floors has not started yet but will be started in the coming months and will be undertaken, as mentioned last month, one at a time – so we will always have two in service at any one time.


The "Light Lunch" discussions were very successful and we are now definitely planning to maintain the tradition when the current team hand over in the New Year. Thus it will metamorphose from a regular activity supported by volunteers AT the hall, into a regular activity, supported by volunteers, organised and supported BY the hall. I think we should thank the team that created the light lunches and turned them into a valued village tradition in the first place – we will look forward to seeing you as guests rather than volunteers in future.

The Hall usage figures are still very encouraging but there are also still plenty of "slots" than can be made available should any readers be looking for a wellequipped, regular venue or a place for your one off event.

In September, as the evenings draw in, we will see the return of Film Night/Race Night etc. So keep your eyes open for the posters advertising the first event, which will be an unusual film. Shot in the Worthing area, "Vindication Swim" is an award winning film that tells the story of the first woman to swim the channel and who then went on to many other feats of endurance. The producer of the film, Simon Hasler, will join us and hold a Q and A session afterwards.

Now the grass is becoming established in the area outside Nepcote that part of the garden is now starting to look its best too - so, once we dispose of the remains of the hoardings that have been sitting next to the Biffa bin for a long time, only the car park will remain. Speaking of the car park, we are now in discussions regarding a potential solution for the required resurfacing and hope we will be able to declare a plan in the near future. Once that is done, fingers crossed (because we didn't foresee the toilet floors being so expensive), the period of high investment should be pretty much behind us. Then we can move (back) into a regime of general maintenance, replacement of worn equipment, relatively minor improvements, redecoration etc - basically, the day-today stuff. We do, of course, have ideas for improvements which we can implement as funds become available and ideas are, of course, always welcome.

Bell Ringing at the Sheep Fair Simon Knights Tower Captain & Church

As newly appointed Tower Captain of St John the Baptist Church, Findon, I am sorry to have to announce that the mobile Belfry we were going to demonstrate at the Sheep Fair on the 14th September, is now not going to take place. The mobile Belfry is broken and awaiting Taylor's of Loughborough (the only bell foundry left in the Country), to attend, and fix and modify it. We were hoping to show off our tower skills and let you see how bell ringing really works. The reality is far removed from Monks leaping up and down on ropes in a TV advert from a well-known chocolate bar beginning with M, that apparently also helps you work, rest and play. The good news is that the tower is now booked for the Sheep Fair 2025 on the 13th September.

As you can see, the Sheep Fair really does take 12 months of planning and hard work! Our ringing technique is a method of ringing unique to England, where of the 7140 towers worldwide (2015), 95.2% of them are in England, with half the others in Wales. The bell moves through a full 360 degrees. Bells in other churches are either static and struck by a hammer or pulled and sway from side to side and tolled. It takes practice to perfect the skill, but you don't have to be musical, just willing to have a go and learn. You can see for yourself next year. We are always looking for people to ring and would like anyone who would like to have a go to get in touch. Any age from 12 upwards is fine. We have practice sessions at St John the Baptist Church, Findon every Tuesday evening, 7.45pm to 9.15pm.

We are holding a memorial service for my predecessor, Barbara Harbut on the 2nd November at 2.00pm at St John the Baptist Church. She was an excellent Tower Captain for over 40 years and a ringer for over 70 and is sorely missed. There will be ringing before the service and after, and it is a chance for ringers who knew her to say goodbye, in the manner she would have wanted. If you knew her and wanted to attend, please do come along.









As we approach Findon Sheep Fair weekend we should, as always, recognise the excellent work undertaken by the Findon Sheep Fair Committee to create such a terrific event. FPC would also like to recognise the support provided by the "Save The North Verge" group who worked in the clean up and bunding of the Nepcote North Verge, following our most recent incursion. The new bund has now been grass seeded with the help of the "Findon Wildflower" group and again thanks are due.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind all residents, with thoughts or concerns should Findon be unfortunate to have another incursion, to contact Sussex Police in the first instance on Report antisocial behaviour | Sussex Police or by calling 101 or 999 to report the incident. Following a full day servicing of Nepcote Pond by "Pete the Pond" and his group, which included removal of the duckweed covering, pond re-planting and edge clearance the pond is in excellent condition. Unfortunately the covering returned after a couple of weeks and, although this is to be expected in the early days of the pond's biodiversity, we now know how to remove it and will do so just in advance of the Sheep Fair. Following advice we also plan to introduce sticklebacks, ducks (who will eat the weed) and also to encourage Kingfishers for who there are now perches in place. FPC was delighted at the refurbishment of some of the benches around the village by the "Men in Sheds" and are looking to further extend this to all benches across Findon.

Paws Animal Sanctuary

I am going to write to the Prime Minister and complain about the increased price of vet bills, also because they add VAT on top. Most vets have been taken over by an American company, MediVet. The charges have rocketed, gone up so much that people are struggling to pay for treatment for their pets. One vet is charging £95 to microchip a cat or dog, and they include a consultation fee! Local mobile microchip service will come to your house charging only £20 per cat or dog.

A stray cat was given to us recently, a dear little friendly girl. She needed to be flea'd, wormed, spayed, have her inoculations and was also microchipped. After this we noticed she was having problems eating and made an appointment for the vet to investigate. She was in overnight and had nineteen teeth removed! The vet said all her teeth had been broken, cracked, and damaged, she could have been in a car accident. Poor girl, I'm so glad she came to us, she must have been in agony. She is now on really strong painkillers. Our bill was £886.50, the VAT was £147.75. Outrageous!! Most cat health problems are covered with insurance but not many cover expensive dental problems !

There is no Blue Cross or PDSA in this area to help pay for treatment when animals are ill or in an accident. When I was a child in Kent everyone took their pets to the PDSA and just put a donation in a box on the way out. They would give us free flea and worm treatment for our dog, cat, rabbit or guinea pig.

When the animal flea or worm treatments in our medical boxes here at the sanctuary are out of date, we discard them, (and vow to check them more regularly) they are so expensive. I checked one box today, that we were given, for 3 treatments in a box for a large cat on 02/05/2024. A really good all round spot on product, Prinocate. It treats everything fleas, mites, all worms, cannot believe the expiry date - 03/2027 !! To think I almost threw it away.

Every single cat pen is in use, we cannot take in any more cats. We don't find many new homes when it's holiday time.

A lot of schools hire incubators and hatch out chicks and ducklings every year for the children to experience. Children are allowed to adopt them and take them home. A parent rang me this week to say she had rescued all this years chicks, every single one has turned out to be a cockerel. Fortunately, The Old Gardens Animal Rescue Centre in Sidlesham takes in Cockerels. I wish the schools would show videos of chicks hatching to the children, instead of hatching out unwanted cockerels year after year.

A very upset lady brought a brown hen in, the foxes had got in and killed six hens leaving one behind uninjured. The hen has settled in as if she has always lived here, out on the lawn, and having dust baths. She gets on with all the other hens, and now lays a big brown egg every day.




