WANTED: New Committee for Findon Swimming Club.

As readers will know a lot of work has been done by the existing committee of Findon Swimming Club to repair and renovate our school swimming pool. This has all happened since the Covid shutdown, when inactivity caused much damage to the pool, and equipment failures meant expensive replacements were needed. Thanks to the generosity of some kind local people and village organisations all the money needed was raised and we are nearly ready to open.

We are now going to need a lot of volunteers from around Findon to help us run the pool. In particular we are going to need a new Committee to help run things. Our current excellent chairman, Mick Dicker, a parent at our school, has brought to bear his professional skills of running a sporting facilities company

(Raw Energy Pursuits Ltd.) to enable us to get to where we are now. Mick and his committee are ready to step back (and quit whilst at the top of their game) and make way for willing volunteers to oversee the day-to-day running of our pool. Our present committee comprises parents at school who live outside Findon and whose children have now left us; it is felt that people living nearer, and with the requisite skills, are best suited to perform this role.

Our pool is managed by a committee of volunteers forming themselves into The Findon Swimming Club. This committee effectively runs the pool on behalf of the school, generates income from entrance fees and pool hire and pays the school for what it uses in electricity and water.

What a wonderful summer we are currently enjoying as I write this. For once, it is comfortable rather than cold in the Rectory Office, and recent wedding guests have commented on how lovely and cool it is in Findon Church – what a shame we can't bottle the warmth to use during the winter months!

A recent wedding had a lovely string quartet to provide their music, and the players commented on the great acoustics in our St John the Baptist building. If you haven't experienced the great sound quality of our Parish Church yet, and I'm aware that we have a number of new residents here in Findon Village, do come along to our Cotillion Concert at 7pm on Saturday 26th July. Tickets are available from Peckhams Butcher (thanks, Nick and Dave) or from the Parish Office. Money raised will help to maintain our lovely ancient building and support our work with families across the Parish.

Speaking of newcomers to our Parish, for anyone I've not yet met, welcome! Dog walking offers a great opportunity to chat to people around Findon, but I'm always glad to see new faces around our churches. If you haven't yet had time to explore them, all three historical churches are beautiful, with interesting individual features and ancient gravestones, and are open every day

for visitors. Of course, it would be lovely to see you at one of our Services too.

This year, our Church Electoral Roll was renewed (this happens periodically as requested by each Diocese) meaning that it starts again from scratch. Existing members are always contacted but still need to complete a new form. This has now been submitted to the Diocese, but new names can always be added through the year! Anyone who is 16 or over and lives in the Parish can apply to be on the Roll and new members are very welcome. This entitles you to vote at the Annual Meeting where new members are admitted to serve on the Parochial Church Council, having a voice in what happens in our churches.

Much as I dislike talking about money, as I'm sure you appreciate, the cost of living is constantly rising, and maintaining and running three Grade 1 Listed buildings of historical significance as well as religious importance is an ongoing challenge. There are a number of ways that you can help with this, whether you are a churchgoer or not! Supporting us through regular financial giving enables us as a Parish to plan ahead with any necessary maintenance work on the church buildings. The Parish Giving Scheme is a National scheme we have adopted in our Parish, and completing your details on

a form allows us the benefit from regular donations reviewed annually at your discretion, with the Diocese administering the reclaim of Gift Aid, reducing our workload. Another way you can support us is by leaving the PCC a gift in your will. I had a lovely surprise this week when a letter arrived from a solicitor informing us we had received a bequest from a Findon resident who had been a very active member of the congregation before his health declined in later years. Past generous bequests have enabled us to flourish as a Parish for some years, but as money is used and interest rates decline this will not be an endless buffer against rising costs.

We are greatly appreciative of the time and effort spent in fundraising activities by the small band of regular supporters of the Friends of Clapham and Patching Churches and the Friends of St John the Baptist Church Findon. Joining either group (or both) costs a minimum donation of £10 annually, helps support the upkeep of our buildings and enables you to have lots of fun at a range of different events through each year. New members always welcome, every little helps!

Our churches are a precious legacy of which we are currently custodians, and I feel so privileged to be your Vicar here. Through the year, so many people just spend a short time of quiet reflection inside, perhaps lighting a candle or writing a short prayer to add to our Prayer Tree, some folk worship regularly with us, others come as and when they can or when they feel a need to. We are here for everyone. As I say at weddings and baptisms, only the generosity of this generation will enable our churches to be here still when those babies themselves want to get married or go on to have their own children whom they'd like baptised. Findon Parish Council

At our last FPC Meeting the Council appointed Cllr Sean Smith as the Chair for the next year and Cllr John Wilson as deputy Chair.

As a conclusion to the extension and renovation of Findon Village Hall, the car park will soon undergo resurfacing to make it fit for purpose and the funds to support this will come from the remainder of the Public Works Loan awarded to FPC for the extension. The process should be relatively quick over a week and notice to that effect will emerge soon.

Following due process with South **Downs National Park Authority** (SDNPA) and subsequent discussion amongst Councillors at our recent FPC meeting, voting was in favour of inserting a gap of 1.52m with wooden posts into the newly erected bund on the North Verge at Nepcote Green. This was a Condition required by the SDNPA following the approval of the application to allow access to the bridle and pedestrian path detailed on some relevant maps. Notwithstanding that this route is in dispute and that path is not viable, this solution was agreed as the most straightforward. Contractors will be duly engaged to undertake this change.

FPC is supporting the renovation of Findon Pre-School in order to assure a suitable and long lasting facility for the Pre-School. These will not only ensure that but also expand the capacity of the school. At the meeting on 29 May 2025, the Chairman reminded all councillors the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) funding reserves were awarded to the entirety

of Findon Parish and to be mindful of that fact when reaching a decision on its whole allocation to the Pre-School. A vote was taken and the unanimous decision was to award the £31k CIL money to fund the renovation.

There is an article advertising for a Chair and Treasurer of Findon Swimming Pool in this edition and FPC would urge volunteers to step forward. Findon Swimming Pool was built by villagers for the village in 1966, since that time it has served as an invaluable resource for our children to learn to swim, keeping lives safe. It also represents an excellent family day available for private hire, an experience that I can personally can highly recommend.

Finally, FPC currently has vacancies for three councillors by way of cooption to the Council. Is this a role for you to consider – helping your community to thrive and engaging in projects and initiatives to enhance this lovely village? If so, please look out for the Expression of Interest forms in the Notice Boards and on the FPC and Community websites at the beginning of July. 



Findon Sheep Fair - Saturday 13th September 2025

With just under 3 months to go before the 2025 Sheep Fair the committee is starting to pull everything together with applications going to Arun DC, West Sussex CC and DEFRA to cover all the activities we will be offering.

We are looking forward to welcoming back the Sheep Show and their Dog and Duck displays which have been popular in the past and for a 3rd year running we have the Farmyard Circus putting on their unique show.

Applications are starting to come in from farms and it's always interesting to see if we will be welcoming any new breeds or old favourites. We hope to repeat the Mock Auction experience from last year which brought back memories of past decades.

There are couple of changes being planned - the Sheep Fair will be starting at 10am on Saturday 13th with the Sheep show starting the entertainment so we can fit everything into the programme.

On Saturday evening we are planning to have 2 bands performing in the marquee. In addition to Murdoch's Crazy Eyes we have another popular local band Blue Dakota who will be starting off the evening. There will be a small increase in the ticket price to £20 which we think is great value for a full evening's entertainment.

This year there will be a 20 page program for the Sheep Fair which will be free to people at the show. There will be a lot of information about the history, planned events on the day, as

well as a layout in the centre pages for people to find their way around the show.

I hope you are all enjoying the fine weather, as I believe there is nowhere better than a Green England under Blue skies.

Hall Work Updates: We have just had the Restoration completed on the Village Hall roof, this entailed hand brushing the North and West elevations to remove all of the Moss, replacing any broken tiles and then applying an agent to all three sides, which over time prevents regrowth. We are further planning to complete the resurfacing of the Village Hall car park in October/November, this has been a long time coming and is much needed to complete the freshen up, this was originally planned to coincide with the building of Nepcote Hall, but costs prevented its completion – until now..

The entrance Hall will be completed within the next couple of months and a complete redecoration of Chanctonbury Hall will also be undertaken, we hope at some stage later this year.



I am attempting to arrange an amnesty (with our mobile Vet Costa) to neuter male cats cheaply ,if he can find the time every Sunday. He brings His mobile operating theatre van to treat all our animals when we need him.


