Findon Parish Council –

Traffic Issues During Long Furlong Closure: Action Taken on Behalf of Residents

Findon Parish Council received a large number of reports from residents during the early days of the Long Furlong closure and associated CityFibre works. Villagers experienced dangerous driving, excessive speeding, verbal abuse directed at pedestrians, and periods where parts of the village became gridlocked. Councillors live in the village too, and we were seeing the same issues first-hand.

As soon as these concerns were raised, the Parish Council acted. After speaking with West Sussex County

Council, we were advised that responsibility for signage and traffic management lay with the contractor. We therefore immediately escalated the matter directly to the company responsible.

For transparency, and so residents can see the exact action taken on their behalf, we are publishing the full letter sent by the Lead of Findon Parish Council's Roads & Parking Group:

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From the Rectory

As we move from the Easter celebration of the resurrection of Christ which brings a message of renewal, we find renewal reflected in the growth of spring flowers and the blossom on the trees. Birds are beginning to build nests for their young and soon there will be new born lambs in the fields.

It is a delight to live in the rural village of Patching, surrounded by nature and a privilege to be churchwarden of the ancient church, St John the Divine. The title St John the Divine, refers to John the Apostle, who is credited with writing the Gospel that bears his name. A stained-glass window on the west wall of the church, shows a figure of St John with a pen in his hand and an eagle which is a symbol of St John, holding an inkwell.

The first reference to a church in Patching was recorded in the year 947. Today's church was built in the early part of the 13th century circa 1200, replacing the former structure. A noticeable feature of the church is the asymmetry. The pews on the north of the nave are shorter than those on the south and the aisle is not central. In the late 17th century, the church was badly decayed and in danger of falling down. In 1703 partially rotted timbers caused the roof to collapse. At that time the cost of timber was high and availability low due to the demand

for oak for shipbuilding, construction, and other industries and lack of replanting. Much oak, which is difficult to replenish, had been used by Henry VIII to build his fleets including the Marie Rose. In order to trim and re-use the rotted timbers, the decayed north and west walls were demolished and rebuilt 4½ ft. inside of their original position. This reduced the span and the number support timbers needed.

In May we celebrate Pentecost, the coming of the holy spirit which brought encouragement and peace to the disciples. I recall that joyous time in my home town in the north of England. On 'Whit Monday' church congregations marched behind their banners to the local parks accompanied by The Boys Brigades playing bugles and drums. The beautifully illustrated materials of the banners depicting biblical scenes, were held as high as the roofs of the terraced houses.

In the park from our roped section round a dais, we sang hymns ending with a doxology, a short expression of praise to God. Small boys giggled on its announcement whispering to each other, "Dogs 'oliday" In the afternoon huge baskets of crockery, cake and sandwiches were taken to a local field for tea and there were races for children. Everyone went home tired and happy.

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Letter Sent on Behalf of Findon Parish Council

Dear Adrian,

I am writing on behalf of Findon Parish Council and local residents to formally raise serious and rapidly escalating concerns regarding traffic conditions in Findon as a direct result of the Long Furlong closure and associated CityFibre works.

I have been speaking to WSCC and they have said that the responsibility for signage and traffic management lies with your company? Therefore, I am redirecting our concerns and issues to you and your company.

Within just three days of the planned nine-day closure, there has been a substantial and wholly unacceptable increase in through traffic. Residents are reporting incidents of verbal abuse directed at pedestrians (now reported to the police), excessive speeding on narrow residential single-track roads, and consistently unsafe driving behaviour. At peak times, parts of the village are now effectively gridlocked.

It is deeply concerning that through traffic is being allowed to pass through the village at all. The current signage is clearly inadequate: it fails to discourage general traffic to use the village as a rat run and instead only advises that routes are unsuitable for large HGVs.

Furthermore, the apparent diversion of traffic towards Nepcote Green via Nepcote Lane is inappropriate and unsafe, given the road's narrow, single-track nature, poor visibility, and blind bends.

The current traffic management measures are ineffective and are placing public safety at risk.

Immediate intervention is required. In particular, urgent action is needed at the southbound junction of the A24 onto Horsham Road to prevent through traffic entering the village.

Signage needs to be urgently reviewed and strengthened, with clear and enforceable measures such as "Village Access Only" or "No Through Road" restrictions, alongside steps to prevent non-local traffic from being routed through unsuitable roads.

We would appreciate your help and an urgent response outlining actions to be taken so that we can get back to concerned villagers who have been affected so far. We still have six more days of disruptions to manage. Please could you confirm receipt of this email so that I can tell residents that you are aware of the issue and are dealing with it?

Residents reported a significant drop in through-traffic that same day, and the situation improved noticeably as a result.

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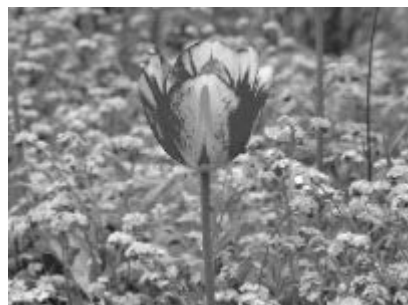

Paws Animal Sanctuary

Looking at an old newsletter from October 2005 I was surprised to read that we had a total of 72 animals! 9 cats, 14 rabbits , 10 gerbils, 14 guineapigs, 11 hamsters, as well as ferrets, chinchillas, ducks, poultry, quail, 2 horses and a donkey.

We hardly have hamsters, chinchillas or rabbits anymore. The craze is for guineapigs. Every day we have requests for female guineapigs (the males fight so they are not so popular because you have to split them up). Because guineapigs do not need vaccinations and if you only keep females you can keep lots of them together, and they do not fight. Also vets do not spay female guineapigs as an anaesthetic is too dangerous, vets only neuter the boys.

All the vets fees have increased so much It is so expensive to neuter rabbits now and they need inoculations, so it is much cheaper and more practical for families to keep guineapigs.

Our Tortoises are now all out of hibernation eating bananas, little gems/romaine lettuces and

dandelion leaves, and they all love strawberries. It is always a worry in case they don't wake up. It's a long time over 12 weeks for them to be asleep. We put them a cool bath every single night for them to have a long drink and bath and then they all eat so much when we get them out of the water.

None of our Hens are laying, they must be so confused hot sunny days then cold windy days and they all hated all that rain they would just put themselves to bed early.

So far the Moles have left our lawns alone this year.

Let's hope we have a long Summer from May until September.
