#### From the Rectory

Over half-way through January seems an odd time to be wishing you all a Happy New Year, but both Colin and I would like to do so, along with thanking you all for your cards and good wishes to us and our families over the Festive period. Now as February begins, we turn our minds away from the Nativity towards the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus that we celebrate at Easter. The feast of Candlemas (the Presentation of Christ in the Temple) on 2nd February marks the official end of the Christmas Season in the Church. Here, we remember how Mary and Joseph took their baby son to the Temple, as was customary, to give thanks and present him to the Priests, and it was here that Jesus was recognised first by an elderly priest, Simeon, then by the prophetess Anna as the long-awaited Messiah. Simeon's words (known as the Nunc Dimittis) are still said or sung daily in churches at Evening Worship.

Easter is early this year, falling on April Fool's Day! This means that we celebrate Shrove Tuesday on 13th February this year – do join us in St John's Church at 3.30pm for pancakes! Traditionally pancakes were made to use up rich ingredients before the austerity of fare during Lent, and people still often 'give up' a food or drink they enjoy during Lent. Known as a penitential season in the church's year, it's seen as an opportunity to reflect on our lives, pondering what excesses we could well do without, but also more importantly, what we could do more of, to help others, and so help God. The sign of the cross can be made on the forehead of people on Ash Wednesday

as a symbol of both our sorrow at where we have fallen short of God's will (individually and as a nation) and of our wish to amend our lives. Our Bishop has, over the last few years, offered this to passers by in Chichester city centre for example. Here, we have a Service in Patching Church at 10.00am or Findon Church at 7.00pm; it is also Valentine's Day – why not come to renew your commitment to our God of Love?

As I wrote at the end of last year, this year has been designated as a Year of Prayer in this Diocese, and this will be reflected in our Lent Course, 'Inspiring Vision', which uses art as a medium to open windows on to God, recognising his saving work in the world through Jesus his Son. Each week, a different well-known public figure (including the Archbishop of Canterbury) will reflect on a piece of art that has inspired their faith and journey of prayer through a podcast, which we'll look at together, leading on to discussion and reflection within a small group. Colin will be leading the course in the Parish and through the sign-up sheets in churches, has decided the best time for people will be 2pm on Friday afternoons. The course will begin on Friday, 16th February, held at Findon Rectory and everyone is welcome. Please let the Office know if you'd like to join us if you haven't already signed up, so we have an idea of numbers, thank you.

Chris and I will be having a time later this month with our family in Australia, so I am away for much of Lent, but the Office is open as usual and Colin will be checking mail and phone messages regularly too.


#### Franciszek (known as Franek or Frank) Kornicki (December 1916 - November 2017)

Patience Kornicka (August 1923 - November 2017)

Known to many Findon residents Frank & Patience lived in Findon Village since 1983. They moved to a Worthing care home last summer and died 9 days apart in November. In March this year they would have celebrated 70 years of marriage.

An article in Findon News last February covered details of Frank's 100th birthday and Frank & Patience were fully in support of the consortium purchasing the Village shop and Post Office - many will recall the photo of Frank with the fundraising thermometer gauge.

On hearing of Frank's death Findon News was only able to make a brief comment before going to print for December's edition.



Published a week after his death an obituary in The Times newspaper carried a detailed history of Frank. Although requested, The Times have not given Findon News permission to reproduce it.

However, as a tribute to Mr & Mrs Kornicki Findon Valley, resident Alex Clouter has kindly allowed us to include the article he wrote following a recent interview with Frank.

Franek (shortened from Franciszek) I recounts his earliest years in Poland...

"Well I was the youngest of six boys, the first sadly dying in infancy. We lived in Wereszyn, a rural village in Hrubieszow district and we were involved in estate management and when I was of the age, I was keen to go into the services and decided to go on two gliding courses." This decision was the foundation of Franek's remarkable flying career that saw him start as a cadet in the Polish Air Force in his early years and within a few years a fighter pilot on Hurricanes and Spitfires carrying out many sorties over occupied territories as well as coastal

Marauders and Flying Fortresses. In 1943 Franek became Commander of 308 Squadron. For his service in the Second World War, Franek was awarded the Silver Cross of the Virtuti Militari (War Order No. 08487) and the Cross of Valour with two bars.

Franek was in England when the formal announcement was made about the end of the war. He spent a short time there before returning to the HQ in Germany, where Franek was struck by seeing first refugees hand all the of nationalities and the dire camps as he toured around. Then there were thoughts of what Franek will do after the war leading him towards revisina mathematics which he persevered with as he was learning in English not Polish! Late 1945 saw him return to England: RAF Station Newton, near Nottingham, in a Flight Lieutenant rank and very proud to have served as Squadron Leader for three years. Franek took up a textile chemistry course and actually enjoying it over time! Early in the following year he heard that his mother and his three brothers with their families were well and that his dear father had died in the summer of 1942.

On his 30th birthday, 18 December 1946, Franek joined the Polish Resettlement Camp in Framlingham, Suffolk thus leaving his course in Nottingham Technical College and began another – plastics chemistry – in the camp. A trip to London in spring of the following year to see off a friend, Cecile, to Scotland from Paddington Station and there Franek met someone else, who was wishing her cousin a happy trip. Her name was

Patience (Pat) Williams and on 6 March 1948 they married!

Two sons arrived into their lives, Peter and Richard, over the next few years and the Kornicki family started a new and colourful chapter in their lives, taking them around England and overseas and gaining new experiences, new challenges as they all grew older, wiser and loving life to the full! When Franek and Patience finally decided to retire they settled in Cornwall initially, then a decision to go south easterly and the couple found a beautiful home in Findon village, after 35 years of marriage.

#### A stroll up School Hill

Walking around Findon is a good thing to do for many reasons: apart from easing traffic congestion, doing our bit for the planet and not polluting the air, it means that we are able to view a number of rural delights including our lovely early 19th century village school. By the way, walking to and from our school (especially if you are a parent), benefits others too as it eases considerably the parking log jam that occurs twice a day at morning rush-hour and home time.

Two of our school's many delights are its clock and its Findon Windows – a design of window peculiar to the village – which have recently been renovated thanks to people's efforts and the kind patronage of our villagers. Both projects were challenging and required specialist expertise.

The clock was renovated a while ago thanks to our Parish Council (in particular the late Len Prior), and to other kind donations.

The Findon Windows have been an ongoing project whose urgency increased as the existing windows crumbled before our eyes, presenting a safety risk to school as well as increased heating bills due to their thermal inefficiency. Replacement presented all sorts of problems both financial and structural – the windows are set in the stonework of a listed building meaning stone masonry skills were required; this being not just a simple window replacement project.

As we know from recent media reports school budgets are very tight and our school is struggling as much as any other and we have more works to do

this year. For all capital building projects for C of E schools the Government and the Diocese provide only 90% of the cost meaning that the Governors have to make up the remaining amount via fund-raising. We are very grateful to the villagers of Findon for their kind contributions to schools' many fundraising events and initiatives. In particular the PTA and our Findon Sheep Fare Committee have made large donations which triggered the building work necessary to complete the Findon Window project.

If we could somehow measure community spirit levels in Findon they would register high. This is especially so now as we enjoy a boom time thanks to everyone's efforts to refloat our village shop; the shop is another asset which, along with a school and a church, help to create local facilities for the benefit of all.

We would make just one more appeal to our stakeholders and fellow villagers that will also help our Parish Council as they instigate improvements designed to keep us all safe from increasing traffic volumes: please try hard to keep School Hill and its surrounding areas free from cars. We have had several dangerous incidents of late that have threatened the safety of both parents and children; we all need to do whatever we can to ensure that a stroll up school hill, for whatever reason, is a pleasant experience.

#### From The Bishop of Horsham

Early in February, the Church remembers Jesus being presented in the Temple. Wise and holy old Simeon, utters the words of theNunc Dimittis, including: to be a light to lighten the Gentiles and to be the glory of your people, Israel. It is the proclamation that Jesus is not simply for those associated with him, the Israelites, but for everyone else as well, the non-Israelites, the Gentiles.

Clergy get used to people casually referring to God and to prayer as 'your department' or 'your business'. 'Have a word with your boss' people joke; 'say one for me.' It is as if people acknowledge prayer as valuable, even important, but consider it someone else's business. Perhaps there is too much truth in those jokes that imply prayer is for the specialists or professionals rather than everyone else. The 2018 Year of Prayer reminds

us that prayer in the name of Jesus, like Jesus himself, is for everyone and not just for those most publicly associated with him.

Certainly clergy should pray for their people daily at Morning and Evening Prayer, but they are also bidden to ring the church bell to tell everyone that it is happening. Church bells both announce that people are being prayed for and call them to join in whether in Church or elsewhere. If you cannot hear a church bell, you can set an alarm on your watch or mobile phone creating a regular reminder to pray. There are many opportunities to learn about praying this year, not least in Lent which also begins this month, but let me commend to you the Daily Prayer of the Church, which you can download to your PC, smartphone or tablet. Just visit your App Store, search for Church of England, download and join in.
