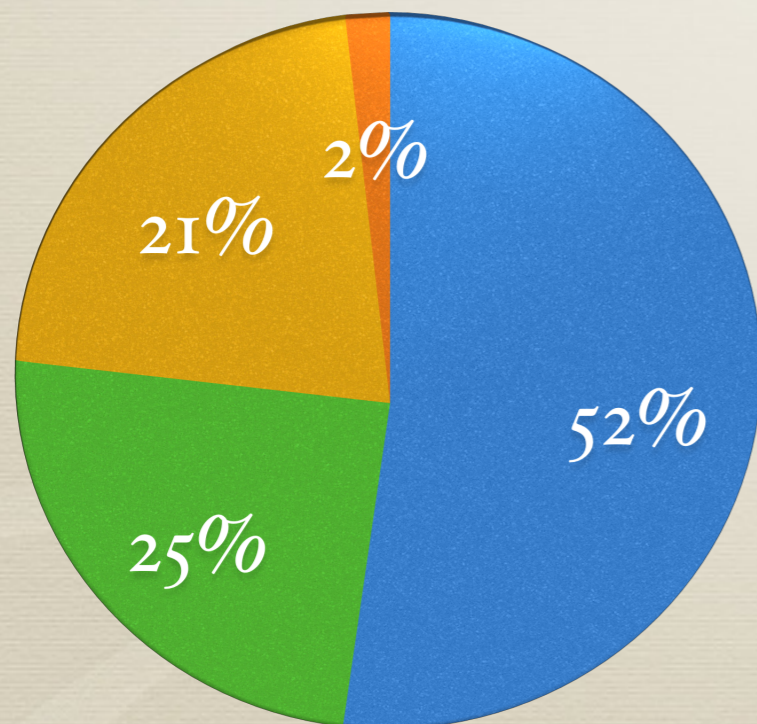
View of the Parish

The plan should include policies seeking to prevent the conversion of important retail or business premises into non-retail or domestic homes.



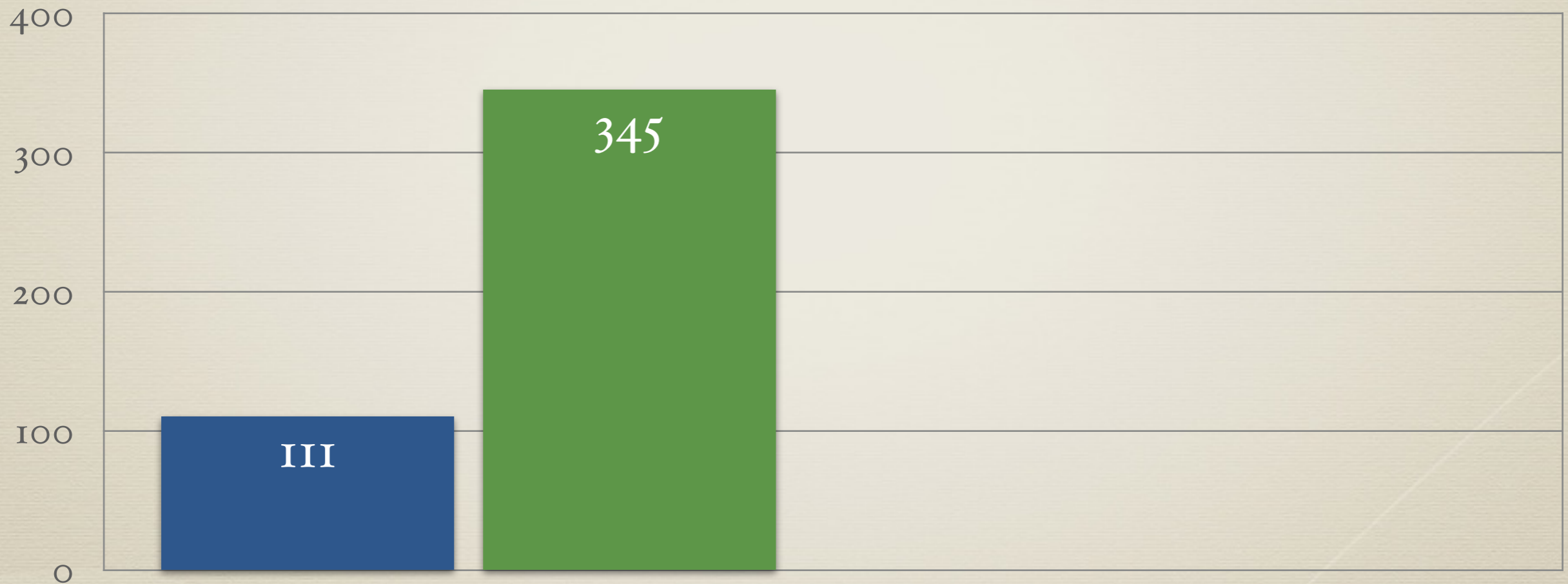
The plan should introduce greater flexibility in the use of buildings to ensure shops, offices or indeed homes can be converted into other uses if there is a need.

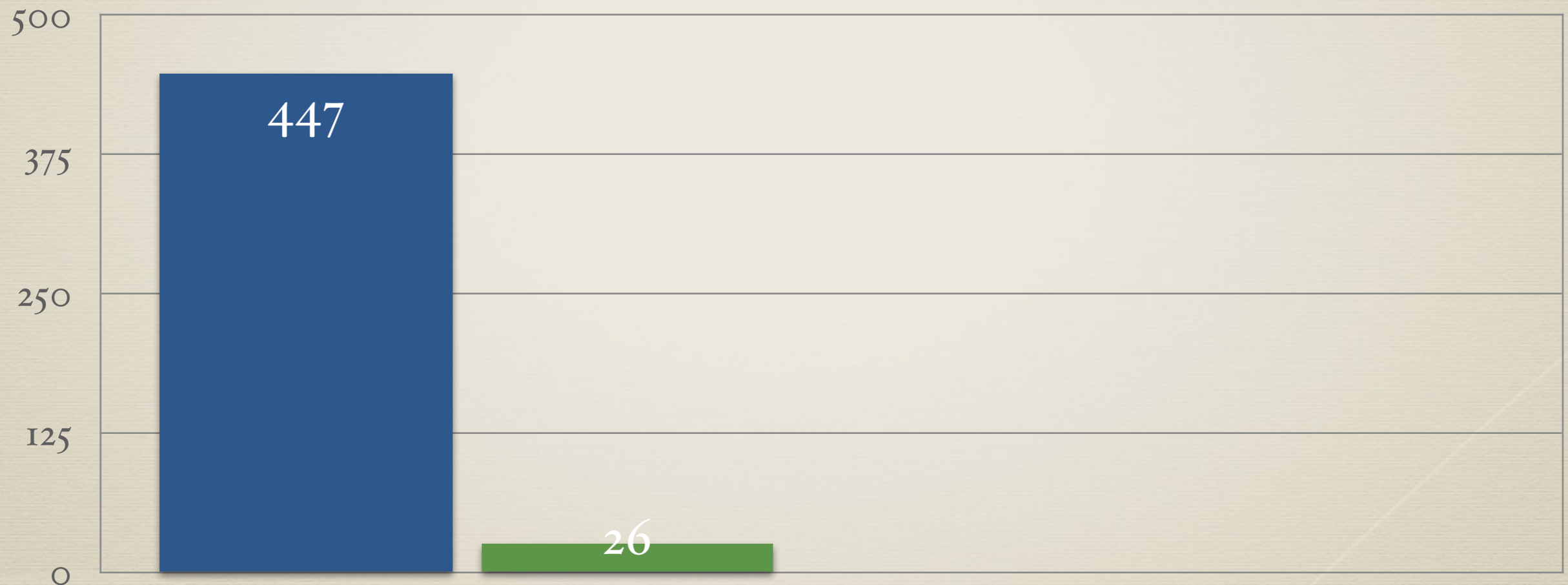

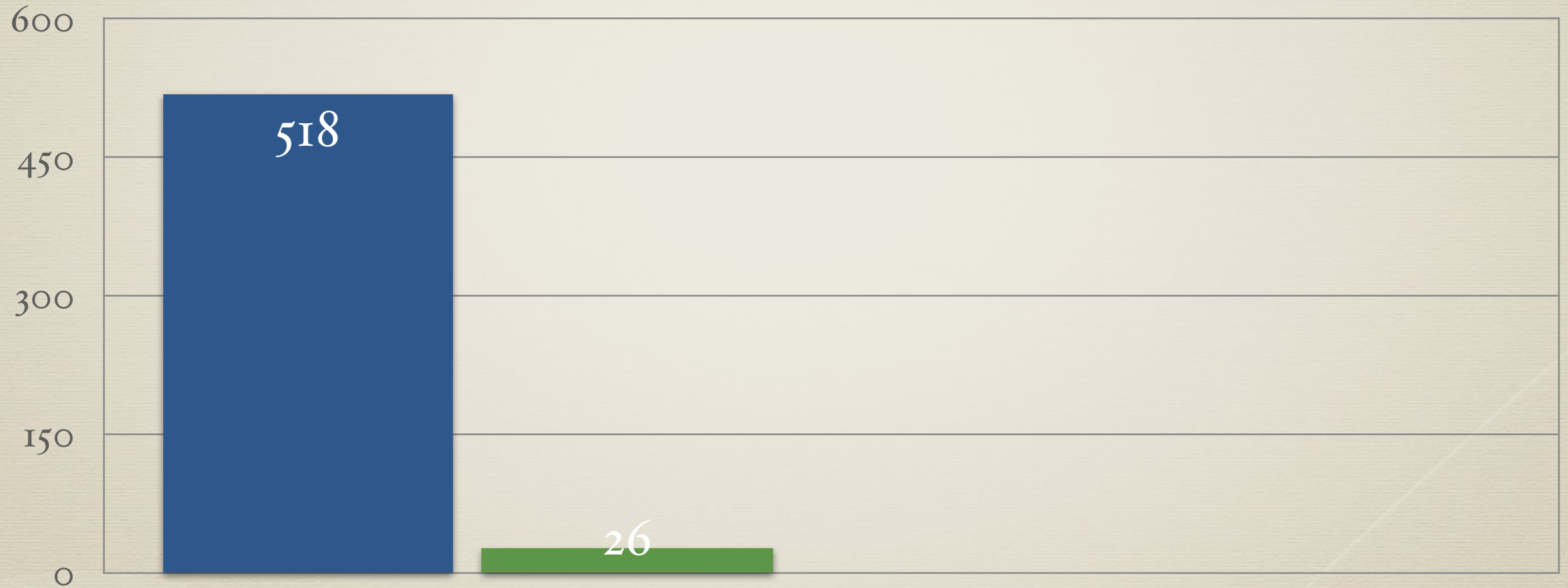

The parish benefits from a good variety of food and drink establishments.

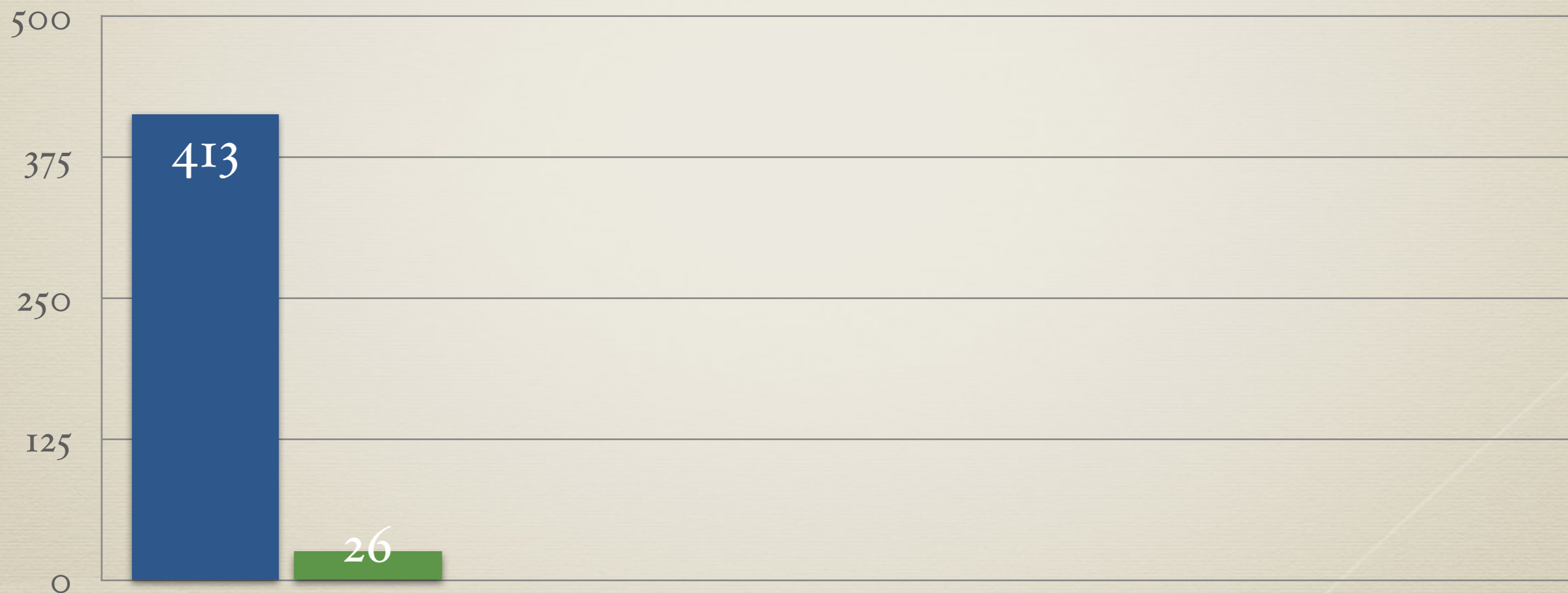
