From the Rectory

Helena and I wish you a very happy and blessed Easter. As I write this article we are still in the depths of winter. Outside my window snow is blowing in the wind and is adding to the white carpet already lying on the ground. It's incredibly cold but also very beautiful. But even in the midst of winter we are looking forward to the promise of spring, with its abundance of flowers and new life. We know that the wintertime of death and decay will give way to the springtime of hope and the promise of warm summer days to come.

Easter is a bit like that. We follow our Lord through his passion in Holy Week. The cold and bitterness of his suffering on the cross is replaced by the immense and amazing joy of the resurrection. As Christians we are known as Easter people for Christ's resurrection is our guarantee that one day we too will pass through death to new life.

The exchange of Easter eggs is an ancient custom intended to symbolise this new life. An egg is like a tomb on the outside yet full of new life inside. At one-time painted chicken's eggs would have been given and received but I expect that like me you might prefer the chocolate version. Although chocolate bunnies or even dinosaurs may taste just as nice I rather think someone has missed the point.

As we wait in hope for the coming of Spring there are many signs that it is not

far off. Snowdrops with their delicate and beautiful flowers have been out in the churchyard for a while, and just lately daffodils are starting to make an appearance. In the same way, as a church we look with expectation for signs of new life in our communities and congregations.

In the Chichester Diocese we are in the year of prayer, so this Lent we have been focusing on our prayer lives and thinking about the importance of taking time to listen to what God is saying to us. God meets us in such a variety of ways, sometimes when we least expect it. It may be through the church services we attend, through reading the bible or looking at a piece of art, through the beauty of creation, but most especially through each other. We are all part of God's amazing creation and as such we bear the imprint of our creator.

The big message of Holy Week and Easter is that each of us is loved by God as a precious child, for who we are, with all our faults. Jesus' death is our gateway to new life and a fresh start. Although we may go through tough times in our lives God always promises to walk alongside us and will never abandon us.

ROAD CLOSURES IN FINDON

3RD April - 6th April

Road works will be taking place as detailed below. They are part of the village enhancement scheme that is being implemented by WSCC Improvements to install high friction surface and road markings. There will be work in The Square, High Street, School Hill and Cross Lane. Emergency vehicle, residential and pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.

Man Betrays Best Friend -

An habitual criminal offence

With the recent spate of sheep being attacked by 'uncontrolled' dogs another problem that gets on people's nerves is the increasing scourge to our area of owners who don't clear up after their pets. Few things irritate people quite so much as the abandoned deposits produced by our furry friends!

You would think that it shouldn't be a problem. You own a dog, it eats, it does its business and you clean it up. Failing to do so is anti-social, smelly and can spread diseases.

The law is clear, says Keep Britain Tidy. "It is the responsibility of the dog owner or the person in charge of the dog to clear up any dog foul left by their dog."

And simply being oblivious - or pretending that you are - is not an excuse.

"The regulations state specifically, that being unaware that the dog has fouled, or not having a suitable means of removing the faeces is not a reasonable excuse for failing to clean up after your dog."

There are also those that "bag it" but fail to "bin it" - just leaving the contents bagged but thrown by the wayside. A bizarre habit!

Leaving bags beside a bin or just throwing it out of your car window in the direction of a bin IS NOT ACCEPTABLE.

In response to the increasing "foul" problem Arun District Council have requested local Dog Wardens to be more vigilant concerning the abuse. Offenders can be fined up to £1,000 or issued with a £80 fixed penalty ticket.

Chances are that the 'criminal' owners among us are too ignorant to read this. Therefore leaving the responsible dog owners to find a solution.

Apart from bringing back the 'stocks' to shame offenders, as usual it is caring members of the public that are left with clearing up after others who blatantly refuse to care.

If you can't pick it up, don't have a dog. A dog is supposed be man's best friend let's keep it that way.

Do you know?

The church may seem wealthy because of the tangible assets it has but it needs money to function.

The cost of running the churches comes from donations from individuals. Costs include clergy stipend and expenses, for those that work voluntarily, lighting and heating the churches, insurance of the buildings contents and personal liability, administration costs, printing, music license and organist fees. The weekly cost is £1,500.00

Monetary donations can be made in a number of ways; *Legacies*.

Collections in services. For those who pay income tax, donations placed in a completed yellow envelope will enable gift aid.

Parish giving scheme. Completion of a non-incremental direct debit form enables collection of donations from the bank. There is an option for increments if wished. This scheme pays gift aid to the church regularly, removing the need to make an annual claim.

In spite of the current cold snap, there is the feeling that spring is round the corner. If you are reading this over Easter, you may still have time to bring your children or grandchildren into the shop and enter our first ever Easter Egg hunt. It's free to enter, a short walk round the village centre, answer a few questions and come back to the shop for a possible prize!

As most of you may know our Shop Manager Auds Stapleton decided to step down. We were sorry to say goodbye as Auds did a sterling job getting the shop restored and equipped last summer between the beginning of August and it's opening late in October. We have already started the recruitment of a new Shop Manager, several applications are now to hand and interviewing will start soon, with the hopeful intention of having a successor in place in May.

On the Volunteer front there has been a seamless handover from Julie Leitch to Margaret Bamford, who has now succeeded Julie as Volunteer Coordinator, and will be working closely with Annie Whitchurch who is making great strides with her Training role for

volunteers. Both Margaret and Annie's roles are vital to ensure we are a volunteer led shop supported by our more experienced paid shop staff.

In the meantime Angus Charlton has joined the shop staff team. Many villagers will know him as he managed the Findon Manor Hotel for 19 years until joining Worthing Golf Club as Bar Manager. Angus holds a Personal Alcohol Licence, which will allow us to continue to sell alcohol, an important contributor to sales.

Most critically we are now in the final stages of re-negotiating our contract with the P.O. Ltd. Until now we have had to open the PO counter whenever the shop was open, an unreasonable amount of staff time and costs for little return. So in future the Post Office will only be open during the more normal times of 8.30-5.30 on weekdays, and mornings only on Saturday and perhaps Sundays.

A local villager, Helen, has also joined us on a locum basis to help man the PO counter when we are short of trained PO counter staff.

Crime Report

Since the last edition of Findon News the following local incidents have been recorded:

Police 'incredibly frustrated' by more sheep attacks on Cissbury Ring

Further dog attacks on sheep at Cissbury Ring have been reported. Sergeant Tom Carter said: "Given all the publicity around these attacks I'm incensed that dog owners are still letting their pets run loose among livestock.

The most recent attack on Saturday March 10 caused injuries to a ewe that was so terrible the police wouldn't release photos of the incident. Although the sheep was still alive, its wounds were so severe that it was destroyed.

The owner of the dog involved in a second incident acted responsibly and

admitted to the attack.

The public are requested to report any sightings of dogs attacking flocks to Sussex police by dialling 999. Responsible dog owners who use a lead around livestock will encourage others to do the same.

The Police are still investigating the first attack and anyone with information is asked to report online or call 101 quoting serial 242 of 10/03.

You can report crime and incidents such as anti-social behaviour and vandalism by ringing the 101 telephone number or online at www.sussex.police.uk/reportonline.

If you see any people acting suspiciously and you believe a crime is in progress or about to occur call 999.

Potholes.

The Parish Council have been lobbying WSCC Highways endlessly, some holes have been attended to, others have not. Apparently there is a categorisation and prioritisation system which places main trunk roads higher than side roads unless you can lose an elephant in it. In our conversations with our local WSCC councillor she urges us to use WSCC's "Love West Sussex" website to report highways faults; including potholes. This can be found at

Loathed as I am to suggest a more compensatory approach WSCC do have a process for seeking compensation for ACTUAL financial loss or injury. This can be found at:

Letter from a Resident

I read in the March edition of Findon News that the 2nd preferred allocation for housing is part of the paddock to the south of the garden centre. Have the planning committee viewed this plot I wonder? If this plan is to build at the back of The Quadrangle I suggest they think again.

This field has an historic drainage grid visible after rain and frost, and as this winter has been a wet one large areas of standing water are apparent. We have photos.

Wet grazing land will be available at, no doubt, huge expense to build what will be damp accommodation.

Remember when the village flooded some years ago in 2002; where did that water finally reach?...that very field and into our back gardens!


According to the Findon Neighbourhood Development Plan 4.2 titled Core Objectives clause 4;

We put a photo of the Budgie on Facebook this week saying she was looking for a new home and we were inundated with offers. Never had such a response like that before. At the same time we took in an unwanted Chipmunk. We put the photo on Facebook saying he was looking for a new home. The Chipmunk is a rare white colour with cream stripes, looks like a small squirrel, but not one offer of a home so far, very disappointing. Although it was bitterly cold with snow still around on Sunday we still had lots of visitors. One cat went on a weeks trial and three Guinea-pigs found new homes. (As long as Guinea Pigs are going to be kept inside in the warm for the winter we let them go to new homes.) One little boy was promised a Guinea-pig for his 10th Birthday, he was so excited and chose Rodney a Guinea-pig that couldn't live with another because he was such a bully. We have tried him with lots of single ones that arrive with the same result, he is so




