# From the Rectory

Nearly a year ago I was ordained a deacon of the Church of England at Chichester Cathedral and was licenced as an assistant curate to the Parish of Findon, Clapham and Patching. This last year has flown by and on 19<sup>th</sup> May I was ordained to the office and ministry of a priest at a lovely service held in St Mary's Church, Storrington.

I am writing this article first to say thank you to all who have supported me in whatever way in my first year. I am so grateful for your kindness and encouragement, and especially to those who came to my ordination service and First Communion. My especial thanks go to Mary and Irene who made beautiful cakes and Dorothy for the provision of refreshments.

When I was initially ordained I was what is called a transitional deacon in that one lives and works as a deacon for one year before being priested. There are also what are called distinctive deacons, who always remain a deacon throughout their ministry. It is a matter of vocation and I believe I am also called to be a priest. I will however always be a deacon as well as a priest. One can think of it as a bit like a layer of an onion. My ministry is always a calling to humble service in the same way that Christ came to serve and not to be served.

Ordination to the priesthood entails more than just taking on new functions because it involves a whole change in one's being. As one bishop said to me later 'do you feel ontologically changed?'. Actually, it does feel different. It also means that I am now authorized to undertake new types of ministry. As a deacon one is restricted in what one can do, although deacons have specific functions, for example to read the gospel and prepare the table at the Eucharist. I can now celebrate the Eucharist, conduct weddings and baptisms, give absolution for sins and pronounce God's blessing on his people. The role involves the rather amazing aspect of standing in the place of Christ, which is a clear reminder that it is not a ministry that can be done in our own strength and abilities.

At the ordination service those being priested receive the authority of the church to undertake these ministries alongside the bishop through the laying on of hands and through having our hands anointed and then symbolically held together as a sign of reconciliation. At the end of the service we were given a copy of the King James Bible as a reminder of our calling to preach the word of God and to minister the sacraments.

Although I am now a priest I am still under the same licence as a curate in the parish and curacies usually last three to four years. I therefore hope and expect to be with you for at least another two years. Hopefully that's not bad news!


and stunning flowers, £1500 of

# Joshua the Gardener The no dig garden.

July is a busy month in the vegetable garden with lots to sow and harvest. Growing vegetables, herbs and fruit is a passion of mine so last year I really wanted to have a garden that would feed our family organic home grown produce for as much of the year as possible. After a lot of research I discovered no dig gardening. Fewer weeds, higher yields, healthier soil and obviously no digging. Sounded perfect. The principle of no dig gardening is that you build up layers of organic matter and by doing so you create a undisturbed healthy soil structure that you can then begin growing in immediately. This can be done directly on top of your existing ground such as your lawn, and rather than digging and forking over your soil you maintain it by applying an annual mulch of compost.

When making our no dig vegetable garden we used old railway sleepers for the sides of our beds which doubled up as narrow paths. Once the sleepers were in place I laid down a layer of cardboard straight on top of the lawn, followed by a good bed of straw. On top of the straw we added around 6 to 8 inches of horse manure and then finally topped it with a good quality garden compost around the same depth. These layers block out light killing off the weeds and grass, which then break down adding to the soil condition and quality.

We started this in January 2017 and as soon as the weather was warm enough we began to plant and sow.

Thankfully the garden has been a complete success! We've had very high

vields of lettuce, beetroot, fennel,

onions, beans and peas as well perfectly straight carrots and parsnips. By having the organic matter build up in layers it allows the carrots to grow straight and strong. It enjoys each layer at a time, so to speak rather than spreading out in search of pockets of nutrients, as can happen with recently manured-dug ground, resulting in forked root vegetables.

When we harvest a crop such as lettuce, we will cut it off at the base and leave the roots in the ground to break down naturally. This allows for better soil structure and promotes beneficial fungi such as mycorrhizal fungi, helping crops grow strong and healthy.

After the last harvest of the year and the beds are empty, I apply a mulch of garden compost across the top approximately two to four inches deep. This feeds the soil and buries any weed seeds blown in from elsewhere. That is all the soil work I will do until the same time next year.

Using this method we feel we have achieved our goal of being able to feed our family on fresh home grown produce for most of the year as well as having a good supply stored away for winter. But is it less work? I can honestly say that apart from running a hoe over the surface every now and then, my weeding was reduced tenfold. The garden is now in its second year and the odd bit of bindweed still pokes up from time to time but then I didn't expect miracles. However having fewer weeds has allowed me to spend more time planting, sowing, harvesting and most importantly eating with my family.

# **Updated Findon Neighbourhood Development Plan (2018 - 2035)**

Regulation 14 Pre Submission Version Consultation Period 23Jun-10 Aug 2018

The 2016 'made' Findon Neighbourhood Development Plan did not take up the opportunity to allocate housing sites to meet the housing requirement for Findon included in the 2018 SDNPA Local Plan currently under review by the Planning Inspectorate.

In response to community aspirations that sites allocated for housing should be in less sensitive landscape locations, an Updated Neighbourhood Development Plan has been prepared, which includes housing site allocations to meet the housing requirement proposed for Findon in the submitted version of the 2018 SDNPA Local Plan, in full.

The Regulation 14 Pre Submission 2018 Updated Neighbourhood Development Plan has emerged following extensive local consultation and two housing site preference surveys and is now formally published, to invite comment from statutory consultees, including the SDNPA (the planning authority), Arun District Council (the housing authority), Historic England, the Environment Agency, Utility Companies and other bodies, local landowners, businesses, community groups and residents.

The Pre Submission 2018 Updated Neighbourhood Development Plan (the 2018 Updated Plan) is in the form of the 2016 'made' Neighbourhood Development Plan with deleted policies, texts and maps 'lined through' with new or replacement policies and text clearly identified in blue and new maps clearly

labelled and numbered. The main parts of the 2016 'made' Neighbourhood Plan however remain substantially unaltered with new housing allocation policies included in Section 5.7. There is also some clarification to part 8 of the Local Green Space designations.


































# Paws for thought - Parasites

Parasites can cause significant disease with debilitating effects for pets. Some can also have an impact on human health.

Their ability to hide, survive and multiply make them pretty impressive pests, but not the kind of things pets and pet owners want in their homes!

# Paws Animal Sanctuary

We are so fortunate to have reliable volunteers (we need more). Without their help Sheila and I couldn't cope with all the work. If volunteers are on holiday or phone in sick we struggle to get everything done with no time to eat. The telephone rings constantly with everything from baby birds, lost cats and dogs, unwanted pets, and schools and colleges asking us to take young people for work experience. Also, every day people ask if we have any kittens. Sheila tries to keep up with answering all the post, and I the emails. Some days there are just two of us cleaning out the stables, grooming the donkey and pony, cleaning cat litter trays, feeding and grooming all the cats, cleaning and feeding rabbits, guinea pigs, turkey, hens and quail, degu, hamsters, gerbils, fish in the pond and the wild birds. We also have 5 resident elderly dogs.

Animals on medication, feeding baby birds or hedgehogs, and never ending vets visits take up an awful lot of time. Also running injured ones to the Brent Lodge Wildlife Hospital in Sidlesham.

Every week we take in stray cats mostly from local vets who cannot keep them when they are not micro-chipped. We are so happy when the strays are claimed. We are so busy evenings and weekends when the public bring in baby birds and lost animals. Usually they find them when they come home from work and we are the only ones open or answering the phone. One of this week's stray cats was claimed but we still have another little cat found in Findon Village 30th May in local stables.

He is neutered, very friendly, healthy, black all over, but not microchipped.

We found a lovely home for a dog this week in Findon Village. The beautiful dog was so sad because her owner had died.

Sometimes we are asked to do the impossible! This week we were asked to find a home for a small pedigree Maltese dog. The owners are going abroad to live in mid-July. I was told the dog doesn't like cats or children, and definitely doesn't like meeting other dogs, and is not neutered. So we will probably have to get him neutered. He is staying with the owners until they leave.

We were given 3 black kittens about six weeks old that were found dumped in the middle of nowhere. Luckily when they arrived, one of our volunteers here offered to take them home and care for them. So we let her name them, and they had their first vaccinations this week. But knowing her she will fall in love with them all and we won't be getting them back!

### PROFILE OF A VILLAGER

Dr GEOFFREY ROBERTS as told by his wife Pauline Roberts.

In 1964 when we moved to Findon with our two children (Ann 10 years old and Nicholas 7 years old), general practice was very different from today.

Most practices were one or two doctors, generally male, and there could be 100 applicants for any post available.

We counted ourselves fortunate to have an interview and subsequently a partnership with a Doctor Beatson. They cared for patients in Findon Valley and the Village without secretarial help, just the two "wives" who took all the phone calls. There was a surgery in the Valley and at our house in the Village which was purpose built in 1962 to include a waiting room and consulting room. The two doctors shared surgeries and day and night calls, with some extra help at weekends. We had a half day off during the week!!

Joan Day (who came to the Village in 1938) as a district nurse/midwife/health visitor was amazing, highly regarded and loved by everyone. She retired in 1968 and was replaced by a district nurse and a health visitor.

1974 saw a big change when Dr. Beatson retired, and Geoff combined with Doctors' Martin and Cameron. The practice moved to a bungalow in the Valley in 1978 with secretaries, nurses, receptionist and an excellent practice manager.

Doctor Isobel Edwards joined the practice in 1976 with Doctor Mannings joining in 1984 and Doctor Shipley in 1985/6.

Doctor Edwards was part time (doing only surgeries) leaving the four male Doctors sharing visits and out of hour calls including night calls of which there seemed to be an increasing number.

Geoff retired in 1988 when the practice moved to a purpose built surgery "Lime Tree" in Findon Valley. There was also a surgery at Nightingales in Findon Village.

On his retirement Geoff's interests were many including astronomy, classical music, walking (the downs, Malvern Hills, and the Lake District), and engineering (trains and traction engines).

Sadly Geoff died in 2010.

Findon was and still is a lovely place to live with Cissbury Ring; the sea four miles away, and in 1964 a coach service to London stopping at the Gun Inn. Fares were 10 shillings for an adult, 5 shillings for children.

Our children Ann and Nick attended the Village school and have carried a love of the countryside into adulthood.
