My grateful thanks to Monica Eastabrook & Hilary Langford for their continued editorial assistance in compiling and bringing Findon News to you throughput the year.



From the Rectory

When you read this, I'll be in Australia, meeting my new grandson; what a joy! A new baby is such a miracle, isn't it, especially around Christmas; as you hold them in your arms, your heart melts at the perfection of this tiny scrap of humanity. One of the particular joys of being a priest is the opportunity to rejoice with a family as their new little one is baptised into the family of faith.

In Advent, as Christians we prepare our hearts to welcome the Christ child anew into our hearts. How amazing it is to think that God, who created heaven and earth, chose to come among us in human form, born into an ordinary family, in refugee and traveller circumstances, far from home. How much God loves us all!

The Advent Season is an opportunity for us all to reflect on where we are in our relationship with God, how close we are to Jesus as we live out our faith in word and action in our daily lives. Advent Sunday begins a new church year, this year has been dedicated in our Diocese as a Year of Vocation. In 2019, there will be opportunities to find out more about how God is calling you (yes, YOU!) to live a life of faith. So often, people dismiss 'vocation' as the calling to be a priest; perhaps a teacher, doctor or nurse also comes to mind, but vocation is for everyone, we all have a special 'calling', through the unique gifts God has given to you and to me. On behalf of all the Bellringers I would like to express my sincere thanks to everyone for all the support we have been given regarding our Bell Project at St John the Baptist Church, Findon. We were delighted to welcome many people to our Afternoon Tea on the 6 October and the Coffee Morning on 3 November, and were encouraged by the enthusiasm of

all those who had 'a go at Bellringing'.

The total raised at both events was just under £1,000, however with the Smartie tube exercise and donations we now have in excess of £1400. This will go towards the cost of professional maintenance to the machinery and to replace two headstocks on the oldest two bells installed in the 16th century.

It is anticipated the work will be carried out in the New Year when the bells will have to be silenced, as the two bells needing new headstocks will be dismantled, lowered to the ground floor and taken to the Works of Whites of Appleton.

As the Publicity Officer for the National Garden Scheme, West Sussex I am currently masterminding a county-wide publicity campaign to raise our local profile and appeal directly to garden owners to consider opening their gardens under the scheme in 2020. We also welcome group openings where we insist only that the entrance fees are donated to the local NGS, thus enabling the option of proceeds from plant sales and refreshments to be retained by parish, village or other community organisations.

As you may be aware, the charity raised more than £4 million nationally in 2017 for various health charities including £500,000 to Macmillan Cancer Support, £500,000 to Hospice UK and £150,000 to Parkinson's UK. In order to continue

to raise these vast sums, we must

continue to attract new gardens to the scheme and replace any gardens whose owners are no longer able to welcome visitors.

Your support would be a huge boost for the primary aim of the campaign, to increase the number and range of gardens open under the scheme in 2020.






Old Findonians? See photo opposite →

Light Lunch @ 1

For about 5 years, on the last Tuesday of the month, we have been serving a lunch of soups and puddings in the Village Hall. This is a social event, open to anyone wishing to "pop in" and enjoy a light meal of freshly made food with no booking necessary.

This was always planned as a non-profit making enterprises, aiming only to cover our costs and provide a comfortable meeting place for people in the village. It seems to have become very successful, with the result that numbers are growing and we do infact make a small monthly profit, which we donate to various charities.

Over the last two years we have donated £500 towards a Shelter-box, £650 to the church and most recently £500 to the Indonesian disaster appeal. Last Christmas we made a donation to

the Mustard Seed Charity to help with the transportation to Moldova of the Shoeboxes packed with little gifts for impoverished children in that country. Our profits prior to that went to Findon's St John the Baptist Church. We are planning next to help Findon Pre-School in their endeavours to provide a new building for the children.

We would like to thank everyone who has supported us over the last five years, to all who attend (and say such nice things about our cooking) and all our loyal helpers. We couldn't have done any of this without you. Thank you all.

As the Village Hall will be unavailable due to refurbishment over the next weeks, our next Light Lunch will be on **Tuesday 29th January**.

Ditch the problem!!

Managing flood risk in Findon involves both private landowners and local authorities including Findon Parish Council, and West Sussex County Council (WSCC) works with its partners to tackle the issue. You may have already seen the WSCC grant funded Operation Watershed works that have just been completed at Pony Farm/Stable Lane and Steep Lane as part of the flood risk management.

However, if you are a landowner and have a watercourse, ditch, stream, river or culvert on or next to your land then you are a 'riparian owner' and you are responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of watercourses on your land to prevent flood risk to other people or properties.

Well maintained water courses can significantly benefit the whole community by reducing flood risk and creating habitats for wildlife.

On a happier note this month we have re-homed all of our stray cats. We take in cats when the owners die. But we can't bear to split them up. It's bad enough their owners have died and they have lost their homes, but at least they have one another.

December letter from the Bishop of Chichester

One of the aspects of Narnia, in C S Lewis's novel, *The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe*, is that it is always winter and never Christmas.

We get quite excited about the arrival of winter if it brings snow at just the right time for enjoyment – sledging, making a snowman, snowballing.

But in Narnia, seasons are suspended in the grip of a ferocious frost. Silence is a pervading atmosphere in Narnia as it is in today's world where justice is denied to prisoners of conscience, and the needs of women, children, the elderly and vulnerable are ignored.

Silence is the refuge of the deceitful, just as it can be the medium of corporate grief and respect for our dead. It is the symbol of our sin and our mortality.

One of the hallmarks of Christmas, however, is that the silence is broken. It is broken by the cry of a new-born child drawing breath and needing food – Jesus Christ, one with us. It is also broken by the

song of the angels who announce his birth to people of goodwill.

Music can plant a song in our minds, letting it inspire us, as one of God's gifts to us.

But we can take music for granted, and too rarely appreciate the skills and contribution of those who are our musicmakers.

This Christmas, as we sing our carols, let us be grateful for musicians, as they help us to be mindful of the silent places in our world and closer to home, where the good news of peace and hope and justice has not yet penetrated.

Those who are frozen in silent poverty and despair, await more than a seasonal handout. They look for a melting of hearts and minds that will bring social and material release and encourage them to join the angel song of peace that we are still trying to learn.
