SHEEP FAIR -FURTHER VOLUNTEERS URGENTLY REQUIRED

Exceptional circumstances mean that the Sheep Fair needs more volunteers to help with tasks key to the Show functioning. If you can help with any of these tasks please contact Lesley Chamberlain or Su Pearce (details below). You will be working with others who have done this task before.

Cone & Sign Placement - We place No Waiting cones, direction signs, barriers etc at locations throughout the Village. We need 2 persons to assist in this task, either in the morning (05:50 – 09:00) or afternoon (16:30 –17:30), or both!!

Marquee Setup - The main marquee is used for differing activities over the 2 days. Changing the setup is done over a very short time period of 1-2 hours. This requires all hands to the pump to place tables and chairs, position a stage and straw bales for the evening events and for removal of all of this for the main day event. Can you help between 16:30 & 18:30 for the "Get Ins" or 07:00 – 09:00 for the Saturday am "Get Out"? We need a further 3 people to help.

Stall Holder Marshals - The Craft Stall Holders arrive between the hours of 07:00 & 10:00am. Marshals help to direct them to their allotted pitch so that they can off-load and setup. We need 2 more persons.

Field Helpers - Throughout the day we have marshals acting as a point of contact for the public who need assistance. 3 hour shifts operate throughout the day from 10:00 until 48:00. The later shift assists in safely directing stall holder traffic off the Green when the show finishes. We need a 2-3 people.

Sunday Helpers - To help pack everything away into the Wattle House for another year. Barriers need to be collected, road mats stacked, tables and chairs put away and the fields "walked" to ensure that no litter is left on landowner's property. If you feel you can help any time between 09:00 & 13:00 we would gratefully welcome your assistance!

From the Rectory

Autumn approaches, school holidavs are over and our thoughts turn to Harvest thanksgiving. Surrounded as our three villages are by beautiful farmland, we are daily reminded of the passing of the seasons, and I don't know about you, but there is something wonderful about watching a combine harvester at work. Hard to imagine how, not such a long time ago, all this would have been done by hand, or with teams of horses. Those of us with allotments or vegetable gardens will be busy harvesting our own crops before the weather turns, freezing, pickling or storing in a cool dry place, giving away excess to friends and neighbours. If you happen to be making jams or pickles, we would be glad of any donations (labelled with ingredients please) for our Christmas Tree Festival in December

There's a biblical precedent for such generosity; in Deuteronomy 24, verse 19, the Israelites are taught not to go back for a forgotten sheaf of corn, but to leave it for the alien, the orphan and the widow, so as to be blessed themselves by the Lord in all they undertake. Similarly verse 20-21 advise leaving what is on the olive trees after they are beaten, and some of the crop on the grapevines, for those who have nothing. It is only right for us, who have so much, to share our bounty with those who have little or nothing. Traditionally, we have collected various tins and packaged goods at our Harvest Service in Findon, as the schools in our villages also do at their own Harvest Thanksgiving Services, and these goods are most gratefully received by the local charity that supports the homeless. Turning Tides. This Service will take place in St John the Baptist Church at 9.30 on Sunday 22nd September, If you would like to donate goods, but are unable to get to the Service, these may be left in the Rectory porch during the preceding week Thank you!

On Friday 27th there will be a Harvest Supper in Findon Church at 7.30pm, with a ploughman's supper and musical entertainment from a local group, 'Harvest Home'. Tickets are available from Peckham's the butcher. Clapham and Patching Friends have their Harvest Supper the same evening, at the Fox in Patching. We then have our Parish Harvest Festival Service in Patching Church at 10am on Sunday 24th September, after which there will be the traditional auction of harvest produce, with all the proceeds going to a cancer charity.

There cannot be anyone reading this whose life has not been touched by cancer in some way, whether a family member or friend or neighbour, so please support this event if you can. Our thoughts and prayers are particularly with Bryan Sayers and the family at this time as we remember with thanksgiving Jane, who lost her battle with cancer last month.

We all have reflective times in our lives when we take stock, look back and think about what lies ahead. Our churches are lovely peaceful places for just such times and Patching and Findon Churches are usually open during the day, with Clapham open over the weekend, for passing visitors to pause a while. In addition, there is the monthly 'Quiet Time' between 6 and 6.30pm, in Findon Church on the second Monday each month, This is not a Service, just an opportunity to pause in our busy lives for half an hour, to think, to pray if you want to, and perhaps light a candle. There is quiet music plaving, and a short praver to signal the end of the time. Why not join us on September 9th? Every blessing, Helena

Findon Parish Council News

The council has been exceptionally busy over the last few months, and its time we brought villagers up-to-date with our business.

For some time we have been searching for 'new blood' to fill our 3 vacancies, and at our last meeting on August 5th we co-opted David Porter and Steven Villanueva-Last. Both councillors are relatively new members of the village, and should prove very able and welcome additions to the council. There is still one vacancy for a co-opted councillor which we would be keen to fill. If you are even vaguely interested and would like an informal chat just call the Parish Clerk (Fiona MacLeod) on 01903-877225.

The council have been considering for some time the request from the Village Hall Trust (VHT) for a £50,000+ grant by way of a Public Works Loan in order that they complete the extension to the Hall which has been put on hold since their funds were exhausted. The loan would have to be given to the VHT as a non-returnable grant, with the cost of capital repayment and interest being borne by the village as a whole within an increased council tax and repaid over a 50-year period. We have now sent the request file from VHT to our supervising body, the Sussex Association of Local Councils (SALC). who will advise us on the procedure that must be undertaken before the Public Works Loan can be raised and approved. Findon has never had to raise money in this way before, and its annual Parish Council budget of £45,000 is well below any means to merely 'grant' the amount requested.

The Updated Findon Neighbourhood Plan is gradually moving towards its final stages, and David Hutchison, who is chaining the working group is expecting an Independent Examiner to be appointed shortly to assess the Plan, and its merits, before a ruling to the South Downs National Park Authority, whose Local Plan has been published following approval by the SDNPA on 2nd July 2019. David has to be thanked and commended for his unstinting work on behalf of the village. Please see the separate article from David for more information.

The planning committee has been exceptionally busy of late, and much time and effort has been spent on the applications relating to the Soldiers Field House development (12 houses) and the contentious development of the old stables at the north of Soldiers Field Lane (4 houses and Stable Barn).

Grants have now been approved in various amounts for several village bodies, including the Swimming Pool, Findon Pre-school, Friends of St.John the Baptist Church, Findon Village Hall Trust, Lambstails and St.John School PTA.

I'm sure many villagers will have seen the Open Spaces Working Group around the village with their 'Hi-Viz' jackets, clearing footpaths and overhanging vegetation. The Group are very keen to attract more volunteers who can spare a few hours every Wednesday morning, call ClIr. Robin Carr for more information.

Gardening Titbits

I love the late summer garden because of the light more than anything. The lower sun creates more shadows and wonderful contrasts. The deep, rich colours are mesmerising and I can sit for hours soaking up their beauty.

The burgundy flower heads on the sedums look gorgeous against the small orange berries of the rambling roses. Fuchsias are in full swing and I read a useful tip recently: Fuchsias in tubs grow towards the light so to keep them from being lop-sided, turn the pot every day by just one inch. What an ingenious idea; so simple and yet so effective. It really works.

Against my better judgement I moved a plant in the height of the summer, at its full height and just beginning to flower. It took four watering cans and 2 finemist-sprays on the leaves to keep it going the very first day and then shading from the sun every day and watering at the slightest droop for another week or so to ensure it survived. I hope it is not like moving furniture, where I say, "No, put it back where it was!"

Something is eating my clematis flowers. If it is earwigs I cannot find them. What with insects and high winds I am not doing very well with clematis. One clematis had a new three foot stem above the arbour which was blown continuously backwards, forwards, side wards in 40 mph winds until the stem eventually cracked. When the winds stopped I tied it in, in the downwards position. It still managed to flower but how lovely it would have looked wafting in the gente breeze above the arbour. Pigeons are trying to nest in the nearby holly tree; flapping endlessly. So, we made a very long pole called our pigeon-poking-stick and every time they settled into the tree we poked the stick high up into the branches to annoy them. It took a long time to deter them but I think it has done the trick.

I have been using soft-tie for a few vears now but this year I have found it to be most worthwhile. Because soft-tie is rigid as well as being soft and pliable I was able to thread it through my rambling rose from the trellis side of the arbour collect it at the other side 18" away, loop it round the thick rose stem and thread it back through the thorny rose once more to the trellis side. twisting the two ends together to secure it: without a solitary scratch on my hands and arms. Elated, I cut two 6" lengths to be used as ties for our handcoiled hosepipe, which can be untwisted in a jiffy to use it and replaced in a jiffy after watering. No more fiddly bows or searching for the discarded thin green garden string on the green lawn with no alasses on.

In April/May time the leaves on my evergreen hebe "Heartbreaker" suddenly changed to a most peculiar colour, which I can only describe as "wet putty". I thought the hebe was dying but feeling the leaves each day proved they were moist and the plant was alive. This apparently is its summer look. Thankfully, mauve colouring is now returning slowly to the centre of the small linear leaves giving it a warm glow. So hopefully we can look forward once again to its spectacular winter leaves of vivid pink.

Progress on the updated Neighbourhood Plan

The updated Neighbourhood Plan (UNP) has at last reached its final, formal consultation stage and will be subject to an independent examination by an experienced planning consultant, following on from the consultation period, which ends on 16 September 2019.

Posters giving details of the consultation have been displayed round Findon and on the Findon Parish Council website where the UNP, the supporting Consultation and Basic Conditions Statements and the Evidence Base can be viewed. A paper version of the UNP and the supporting statements are also available at the Village Store. The South Downs National Park Authority (SDNPA) website also includes the documents under the 'Neighbourhood Planning' section. The SDNPA are our local planning authority (LPA) with strategic responsibility for planning matters in the South Downs National Park.

Most of you will recall that the UNP was primarily undertaken to allocate housing sites to meet the housing provision for Findon of around 30 new dwellings over the 16 year period of the UNP and that the housing site locations that emerged, as community preferred locations, are fundamentally different to those locations brought forward by the SDNPA and which are now included in the new SDNP Local Plan, adopted in July 2019.

The housing sites proposed in the UNP are at significantly less landscape sensitive and less local heritage sensitive locations than the EIm Rise and Soldiers Field sites which have been included in the SDNP Local Plan. The UNP sites also have considerably more community support, demonstrated through the housing site preferences surveys undertaken last year.

Although the independent Examiner will see the community comments which were made during the previous two local consultation stages and which have been incorporated into the final version of the UNP, this final consultation is a chance to demonstrate community support, or not, for the UNP and the way it was undertaken with proper local consultation.

We would encourage as many of you who can to take up this opportunity, either by email or by writing a letter to the SDNPA. Comments can just be an overall statement of support, particularly if you have already engaged in the earlier local consultations, or can include particular concerns about any part of the UNP or the proposed housing site allocations. You can also comment on the SDNP Local Plan housing site allocations and on the process by which these allocations were made, in practice, with little or no local consultation.

You will of course also have the opportunity to vote in a local referendum on the updated Neighbourhood Plan, if the independent Examiner recommends that it can proceed to a referendum, with or without modifications and the SDNPA accepts that recommendation.

Comments can be made either by email to neighbourhood@southdowns.gov.uk or by post to Planning Policy, South Downs National Park Authority, South Downs Centre, North Street, Midhurst, GU29 9DH by Monday 16th September 2019.

Thank you for all your support during the lengthy preparation of the UNP, which has had to run in parallel with the various stage of preparation of the SDNP Local Plan. We trust the UNP represents a fair balance of aspirations of the majority of the community in Findon parish and that the SDNPA will give full weight to these UNP aspirations and policies, when taking decisions on planning applications for new housing in Findon. Paws Animal Sanctuary

August is always a very busy time for us, all our Volunteers seem to go on holiday at the same time. We have never had so many animals to feed: cages to clean and animals to groom: so many new Guinea-pigs: so many extra vegetables to go and buy. We also have had a steady stream of pigeons brought in. The adults we can care for and release when they are better, but the tiny babies blown out of their nests in the high winds we cannot cope with. We need to drive them to the experts at Brent Lodge Wildlife Hospital in Sidlesham near Chichester, where they go into incubators. It is a 60 mile round trip and always takes over two hours. It has been difficult because Sheila has had a (very successful) operation - a new hip, but she has not been able to drive for a few weeks and we can never find a volunteer to go at short notice; everyone says it's too far. I keep the baby birds warm under a heat lamp overnight then get up really early in the morning to try and miss the traffic. It's always far worse coming back. Poor Brent Lodge Staff have so many baby birds and they are always desperately in need of Volunteers. Luckily, because we open to visitors every Sunday we have lots of people wanting cats. One

week we actually re-homed every single cat, even a grumpy bad tempered Bengal cat that we have had since May. She hated other cats and would hiss at them if they were in the next pen or walked by. A family came in and the two young sons spoke to the cat and asked to stroke her, well she was purring and all over them, so they reserved her. The came and collected her later and took her home on a week's trial. Sheila rang them up to find out how they were getting on. The mother said "We won't be bringing her back, she is a wonderful, friendly cat, on our laps all the time and she loves the children" Sheila and I are so pleased for her, we love a happy ending.

Fraudsters Targeting Social Media Influencers - Be Aware

The National Fraud Intelligence Bureau has received intelligence to suggest that fraudsters are contacting social media influencers, based in the UK and abroad, offering them the opportunity to market a bogus product, service or investment opportunity.

Fraudsters will present professional and credible pitches to the social media influencers and try to convince them to feature the opportunity for a tee on their social media profiles in order to entice unsuspecting followers of the influencer to sign up or make a purchase.

Additionally, fraudsters are using the names of well-known public figures, implying that their opportunity or product is endorsed by the figure when it is not.

The public should be aware that any apparent endorsement by celebrities, influencers or personalities does not necessarily mean that an investment, product or service is genuine. The public is urged to exercise a cautious approach to any such offer of investment, product or service with the same caution they would at any other time.

What You Need To Do

If you are purchasing goods from a company you don't know and trust, carry out some research first, or ask friends or family for advice before completing a purchase.

Professional-looking websites, adverts or social media posts do not guarantee that an investment opportunity or product is genuine. Criminals can exploit the names of well-known brands or individuals to make them appear legitimate.

Avoid paying for goods or services by bank transfer unless you know and trust the person or company. Payments via bank transfer offer you no protection if you become a victim of fraud. Instead, use your credit card or payment services such as PavPal as they offer you greater protection if you become a victim of fraud.

SCAM WARNING

Action Fraud has received 63 reports about a scam in which fraudsters target people with offers of "low cost" loans or "free" government grants. What the victims aren't toid is that the money they! In cecive is actually an advance payment for Universal Credit. The criminals use the personal information they've obtained under false pretences to make an application in the victim's name. After the fraudsters have taken their "fee" from the advance payment, the victim is then left to pay back the total amount once their repayments begin.

How you can protect yourself:

Never share your personal or financial information with someone you don't know and trust, especially if it's in response to an offer of "free money" or a "free grant".

Department for Work & Pensions (DWP) staff will never approach you in the street or ask for your personal/financial details over social media. If you have concerns about your benefits, you should visit
