From the Rectory

Last month, I reflected on Harvest thanksgiving, and as I walk Scamp at this time of year, I am struck afresh by the abundance of God's providence, free of charge, in our hedgerows! How times have changed, though (that makes me feel old!!) as there are so many juicy blackberries there, with nobody picking them. I can only assume this is because they are readily available in our supermarket freezer cabinets, tidily packed (in plastic of course) so no need to run the gauntlet of the vicious spikes and inevitable stinging nettles between the picker and the biggest fruit! I certainly enjoy grazing as I walk, especially up Honeysuckle Lane where they are particularly plentiful. Of course, by the time you read this, the season for gathering will be officially past, since country lore has it that after Michaelmas (29thSeptember) the Devil has spat on the fruit, rendering it inedible but also bringing bad luck should you eat the fruit! It is true that in the next few weeks, the sweetness will be gone from the fruit that is left, but no doubt there is a scientific reason for this.

One of my earliest childhood memories is of walking from Palatine Road (where I grew up) to Salvington Hill with my parents and brother, all armed with an assortment of containers, to collect blackberries, which my mother would then bottle for winter's treats. Of course, the novelty soon wore off (especially after several stings and scratches) but our pleas to return home fell on deaf adult ears until all the containers were full. Depending on the year, this could take longer, as sometimes others had got to the hedgerow before us, taking the best fruit, or in some years, there

just weren't as many. It certainly taught us children to be patient, and allowed me time to enjoy the surroundings, absorbing the variety of birdlife and trees around me almost without realising what I was learning, and developing my sense of imagination. This is denied to so many of our children, as parents work long hours, and unless they have a dog to walk, more often go shopping or prefer to stay at home in their leisure time. Our beautiful countryside has so much to offer, and when money is tight, it doesn't cost anything!

Another similar memory is of going mushrooming with mum, seeking out not just the regular white field mushrooms, but delicacies of different shapes and shades of brown, found among bracken in the woods and on heathland not too far away. I can still smell the cooking aroma from so long ago as these too were bottled. Sadly, my husband doesn't trust my memory, refusing to eat what I picked, so I no longer gather! This is something that should only be done with an expert, as the poisonous varieties look suspiciously like the edible ones!

The same can be said of people, can't it? At first sight, we can't really tell what someone is like - it is only on closer acquaintance that character traits manifest themselves! But as Psalm 139 reminds us. God knows each of us through and through, nothing can be hidden from our Creator; the amazing thing is that he loves us in spite of what we sometimes do, and is always ready to welcome us back to his love.

So often, we can be so preoccupied with our own lives, we forget that others might be in desperate need of a little 'tlc'! St John the Baptist Church Bells

An inspection of the church bells in 2017 revealed that the headstocks on two of



the bells would need to be replaced. The headstocks being the metal fittings attached to the top of the bells that enable them to swing to and fro. This meant

that they would have to be transported to the bell hangers' workshop for the work to be carried out.

After going through the lengthy process of obtaining permission from the diocese to carry out the work, applying for grants and successful fundraising by the bellringers we were finally ready for the bells to be brought down from the tower on September 2nd.

This technical task was directed by James, from the bell hangers, Whites of Appleton, and he was ably assisted by three volunteer bellringers from Angmering to whom we are extremely grateful as their efforts greatly reduced the labour costs involved.

The two bells are the oldest of our six, being cast in 1530 and 1576 during the reigns of Henry VIII and Elizabeth I. Having been in the tower for nearly five hundred years they were somewhat reluctant to leave and a bit of a struggle ensued before they were freed.

It was an exciting moment when the first one appeared through the hatch and was lowered on a chain. This process was eagerly watched by some of our bellringing team from Findon and Angmering. I think we were all holding our breath. Some of the ringers had been ringing these particular bells for over 20 years but had never seen them so it was

quite an emotional moment for them. Richard Bell, who was relieved to find he wasn't the oldest bell in the village, was on hand with his camera to record this one off event.

Once both bells had been lowered they were transported on



a trolley to the lychgate, chains and manpower had to be brought into play in order to slow them down as the path is quite steep and the bells weigh 5cwt and 7cwt respectively.

More challenges presented themselves at the lychgate where a driver with a tractor and forklift, kindly provided by Richard Kennard of Puckamuck, waited to load the bells onto the lorry. Much careful manoeuvring was involved but finally everyone sighed a sigh of relief as both

bells were safely in place ready for their journey. We are very grateful for those who gave up their time to help on the day. We look forward to welcoming the bells back in either October or November when the ringers will hopefully



find them much easier to ring.



Paws Animal Sanctuary

We have Rabbits given to us who have spent their whole lives imprisoned in rabbit hutches. Sometimes they have lost the use of their back legs. We have had two in recently, one just laid on her side and dragged her back legs. The other Rabbit, whose owner was an 80 yr old lady, had lived in a hutch for eleven years. We always put the Rabbits out on the grass in a run on the lawn. We put both Rabbits in runs next to one another and they both perked up out in the sun. We always give them plenty of shade and a water bottle, and even with very elderly Rabbits the results are amazing. They sat next to one another in their pens for the first week, by the second week the female Rabbit could sit up on her legs, at the end of the week she started to hop. Everyone thought it was a miracle. The other Rabbit is able to hop around but sleeps a lot. We have been called by Volunteers who didn't know he was deaf and thought he was dead, he didn't wake up when they went in to feed him. When we have a sick Chicken we put them out on grass in the sun, they sometimes are better by the evening and can go back with all the others. Most are very old so the sun can't cure them.

A Pigeon was brought in that couldn't fly, and an hour later a very large young Seagull arrived starving hungry. I gave it three bowls of food and a bowl of water and it didn't stop hungrily eating and drinking. It had been picked up lying in a supermarket car park. It was very ungrateful and pecked me a few times when I tried to clean his cage. I put gauntlets on when I got him out to put him in a carrier to go over to Brent

Lodge Wildlife Hospital along with the Pigeon.

A lot of Companies ring us to ask if we would like help. They give their staff one day off a year to go and help a charity as volunteers. Today a Worthing Company called GSK sent 15 Volunteers all in orange t-shirts here to help out at the Sanctuary. They were all brilliant they asked me for a list of all the jobs needing doing. They painted fences and gates, cut hedges, completely turned out two stores and the greenhouse. They brought a trailer with them and went to the tip twice with all our rubbish. Some of them helped clean animal cages and mucked out the stables. They said they enjoyed it and said they would like to come back and do it all again next year. What a lovely happy hardworking bunch they were.

We read Turkey and Switzerland have banned fireworks. Please let's hope that they will soon follow suit in this country and ban all fireworks or at least only allow the sale of the new silent fireworks. We dread November every year and know all our friends who are Dog, Cat and Horse owners do too. from Stacey

So, it is October again and our two new trees planted in October 2018: mountain ash, sorbus "Pink Pagoda" and redbud, cercis "Forest Pansy," have had a hard first year in the ground. The punishing winds have blown them to pieces on what seems like a daily basis. They did not come into leaf until May and then they took an age to fully open. By the end of August they looked positively ragged and started getting their autumn colours, having produced hardly any new growth at all. Now they are shutting down for winter and we need to wait another six months to see if they do better next year. After the anticipated excitement in spring it has all been very worrying. At least they are alive and firmly rooted. Luckily "Pink Pagoda" gets clusters of pink berries and these seem to be doing well so far, despite the wind. It may even look better when the brown crinkled leaves drop off which are spoiling the show.

However, in the more sheltered back garden, some of the plants in my pond garden grew too well. Some smothered their neighbours while others grew so tall they cut off the view across the garden. Sedum "Autumn Joy" was perfect the year before. I did not believe it needed splitting but this year it grew to more than twice the size. Even with six thick stems taken out it still smothered heather "Springwood White" growing underneath. So I have potted it up into a large clay pot where the huge flat seed heads will look good all winter covered in frost and cobwebs. I replaced it with dwarf sedum "Blue Pearl" with blue-grey

leaves, turning purple as the season progresses. This is a compact variety approximately 1' x 1' with a striking slate-blue colour to its new leaves. I find sedums quite fascinating. I kept trying to give my son some but he was never interested. Finally, he is hooked!

"Willmottianum" is still in full bloom. I brought a seedling with me and planted it in the driveway area facing south, with the red hot sun burning down on top of it. It loves it. The hotter the sun the more vibrant the small bright- blue flowers become. It is a lovely welcome as I drive in. Although I have grown this plant many times, the shelter of the south-facing wall and the totally open position have given it a much longer flowering season than I have had in the past (Jul-Nov).

I do not know what to do about rose "Darcey Bussell". At its best it is beautiful with a wonderful scent and at 3' x 2' it is the perfect size and shape for its position. Then it rains and the large, dark red, quartered-flowers fill with rain causing the stems to droop with the extra weight, leaving the flowers hanging upside down. Then the wind starts up and blows them off completely. As long as its leaves look healthy I can live with just one flower on show because it is so bold and compelling and the scent is glorious. However, at the end of the year, black spot starts making it look unsightly, giving me 'itchy feet' to dig it out. My husband loves it so I have given him the task of taking off any leaves with black spot before they annoy me. We shall see.

Parish Council Report -October 2019

Many dog walkers may have noticed a new replacement bench seat at the top of Nepcote Green, with the simple inscription "Monica and Bob 2019". The bench has been donated by the Eastabrooks to replace the old one which had started to disintegrate and was not repairable. Many thanks from the village!

On the subject of benches, the village should be very grateful to Gary Bond who has taken on the task of cleaning, repairing painting and maintaining all 13 village benches in the village, which includes the 4 seats on the Green.

Thank you to Men in Sheds who have very kindly offered to re-varnish the public Notice Board in the Village Hall car park, and have also provided some replacement rails/posts for Nepcote Green.

The Parish Council has been offered and accepted the very generous donation from Worthing & District Community First Responders of a defibrillator for Nepcote Green. This was agreed at the Parish Council

meeting on 16 September, so watch this space for further updates.

Arun District Council (ADC) Councillor Paul Bicknell announced the appointment of a new Rural Ranger, and plans are in progress to meet with the new Ranger to discuss the poor state of many bridleways and footpaths around the village. One of the keen horse riders in the village has provided some illuminating photos of the condition of some bridleways that need urgent attention. There is a separate article below regarding landowners' responsibilities.

Plans are well advanced to designate the area from Nepcote Green down to and including the Cissbury Estate as a Conservation Area, which will add considerable protection to the whole area from any further inconsiderate planning applications.

The Sheep Fair was held on 14 September – what a fantastic day and turnout! Thanks and appreciation to all village volunteers and others involved in making this annual event so special.

CALLING ALL LANDOWNERS WITH PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY (PROW) ON THEIR LAND

The Highways Act 1980 places an ongoing responsibility to trim back overhanging vegetation from a public path on the adjacent landowner.

As the bird nesting season is finished, now is an ideal time for landowners to clear vegetation and over-hanging branches etc to bring the PROWs on their land back to the original full width and height.




