

Last month we celebrated the bringing in of harvest and gave thanks for the wonderful abundance of life in all its forms, the beauty of flowers and the many types of fruit and vegetables that we all enjoy. It is so easy to take these things for granted, so it is good to pause once in a while and to give thanks for the blessings we receive. It also gives us a chance to reflect on our place in creation, our relationship with the earth and with other creatures. We also remembered those who do not have access to this abundance of produce, even in our own country. As usual our flower arrangers decorated the churches beautifully, so our particular thanks goes to them. This year we had two harvest suppers across the parish to add to the variety, and both were well supported and very much enjoyed. Our annual harvest auction at Patching was not to be missed and raised the princely sum of £236 which was donated to Prostate Cancer UK.

As the year moves on and the nights draw in, we come to our annual commemoration of All Souls, and we remember with love those who have gone before us into that greater light. We have an All Souls Service in Findon Church on 3rd November at 4pm, to which you will be most welcome. There are lists in each of the three churches where you can add the name of a loved one whom you would like remembered, and they will be read out and a candle lit during the service. On the 11th November we will also remember all

those who gave their lives in the service of their country. There will be a special service at Findon Church starting at 10am and afterwards we will gather at the War Memorial, just outside the church at 11am.

There was a time when the church building would be the hub of community life. I believe Findon village moved in bygone years, so the Church is now a little remote from the village. However, it is still hoped that the building can be used for community events. So, we are very pleased that the Cinnamon Trust will once again be holding their Christmas Fayre in the Church on 30th November from 10am.

Looking further ahead to next month we have a bumper packed schedule and the Christmas Tree Festival is back at Findon Church! It will be open from Saturday 7th to Sunday 8th December, 10am to 4pm on Saturday and 11am to 4pm on Sunday. Not to be missed!

Findon Village Pre-school

The autumn term is in full swing. We have welcomed some new children and their families who have all settled in well. Quite a few families are beginning to make use of our new 8.30am drop off time. This is at an additional cost to the normal start time of 9.00am.

We made some small but positive changes over the summer holiday, mainly in the layout of the pre-school. We have made the learning environment more inviting, calmer and natural looking by adding different materials, texture and resources to help with certain lighting and noise etc. This helps the children to feel calmer; self-regulate; concentrate and focus easier. The areas are more defined and easily accessible, encouraging the children to access all of the resources available to them all the time. The layout is working really well and we have had lots of positive feedback from the parents.

We have also added woodwork to our curriculum which the children can use independently throughout the day. We are also very lucky as one of the dads has offered to come in once a week to help with this. It is amazing how quickly the children have learnt to use the tools appropriately and safely. (If anyone has any wood off cuts we would be very grateful for them.)

One of the best features of our pre-school is our lovely outdoor area which the children can use all the time. This half term we have been making the most of our natural elements - rain mud and conkers. We are very lucky to have a huge conker tree outside and this has caused great interest to the children. They hunt for the spikey conker shells on the ground and are excited as they burst open the shell to reveal the lovely shiny brown conker inside. They have been using wonderfully descriptive words as they play with them, counting and sorting them and using them in their imaginative play.

The children have been busy building bridges over puddles to walk across and lots of squelching in the mud with their wellie boots this has inspired them to act out The Three Billy Goats Gruff and The Bear Hunt story many, many times. Lots of digging in mud, mud painting, making moats and seeing how many worms they can find. They have learnt to be careful with the worms and look after them and always put them back to find their families afterwards. They have loved splashing and jumping in puddles as well as finding out about mixing colours by adding different coloured powder paint to the puddles to see what new colours they can make. They also have been making bubbly puddles by adding washing up liquid to them and realising the more they splash about the bubblier the puddle gets. It is obvious how much fun they have had by the shrills of delight and happiness on their faces, but apart from being fun, the learning processes that they have gone through during these activities are endless. Despite all this fun the teachers are hoping for some dryer weather in the 2nd half of the Autumn Term!!

We are very lucky to live in such a lovely community and the Findon Village volunteers have been working very hard making repairs to our building and getting it ready for the winter months. We are in the process of trying to raise money for a new building. The pre-school is a vital part of the community; encouraging young families to move to, or come into the village. If anyone can help with raising money ideas, fundraising, donations etc please contact us.

Findon Village Store News October

Since the questionnaires were placed in the shop earlier in the year we have had many respondents to the feedback survey. The responses have been overwhelmingly positive, with some useful ideas put forward.

One point that has been raised on several occasions is that of our pricing of shop products and the misconception that we are too expensive. Many of our products are in fact cheaper than other local shops. Mainly everyday items such as toilet rolls, teabags, biscuits, tinned goods and stationary to name a few. I decided to undertake a comparison exercise to look at the different prices between ourselves and our nearest rival in Findon Valley, I compared the prices of six everyday items (Liquid soap, Andrex, baked beans, Bisto, Yorkshire Tea and honey) we were cheaper on all of these items - a great result!

Our fresh daily bread, free-range eggs, fresh cakes, local ice-cream and milk are a little more expensive

but we are proud to support those local businesses, selling the best fresh produce.

Since we took over the shop we have had to contend with the closure of P&H, our biggest grocery supplier, which has inevitably caused wholesale prices to increase. This is coupled with Tesco taking over Booker Wholesale, giving the Tesco brand a huge market share of both the wholesale and retail market. As a community shop we aim to cover our costs and our pricing strategy reflects this; by making a small profit to ensure the future of our shop. The main reason we are able to keep our pricing down is due to the huge free workforce we have - our volunteers!

We appreciate the feedback received and we are still seeking practical assistance for our regular shopping trips.

The shop is doing well and every item bought helps to keep the shop viable, so thank-you!

Thoughts in remembrance of Gillian Ruth Light

It is with great sadness that I write about the unexpected death of Gill Light, yet it is a joy to remember her great contribution to the community of this village and this church for more than 30 years.

Gill was a very private person, but under her sometimes prickly exterior was a deeply caring and compassionate person. A retired nurse, Health Visitor and midwife, her second nature was to care for others. If a neighbour was in any way needing help or support, she would be there for them, shopping, making cups of tea and just chatting to make sure they still felt part of this community. Just a few months ago, Gill appeared on my drive after church to warn me she was going away for a week and if Colin and I didn't visit a housebound Parishioner daily (as she had been doing) there could be dire consequences. This for me makes what happened to Gill herself so difficult to come to terms with, a sentiment shared I am sure by a number of you, but her own wish for privacy and her fierce independence meant that it was assumed Gill had gone away for a few

days without telling us, as had happened before!

A staunch member of the small choir at Findon Church, and a long-term member of the ladies group meeting monthly (now called 'Afternoon Plus'), Gill also took personal responsibility for keeping the Findon Memorial Book up to date, which meant a day return train trip to the calligrapher. Her meticulous attention to detail made sure that bereaved families were well supported in their choice of inscription.

Photography was a passion for Gill, and before regulations tightened, she would be at every Messy Church meeting, taking pictures of the families enjoying the varied craft activities and drama sketches. Without doubt however, the thing dearest to Gill's heart was the welfare of animals, notably cats, and she was a very active member of the local Cat's Protection League Group. She undertook home visits for a wide geographical area locally, vetting potential new homes for rescued strays and cats whose owners could no longer care for them.

Gill, we will miss you; may you rest in peace and rise in glory.

George Goddard

Sadly, just a few days before the copy deadline I heard of the death of George Goddard, peacefully at home. His ready sense of humour and endless supply of jokes will be much missed in the Village! A real village character and the son of the village blacksmith, he also was a lifelong member of St John the Baptist Church, having sung in the choir from a boy. In later years he became Crucifer, Sidesman and Welcomer, until only a few years ago when his deteriorating

mobility meant an end to his smiling welcome at the door as he handed books out on a Sunday.

Grateful thanks to Daisy (DeeDee's) for her alertness in noticing the absence of George and alerting his family.

George's funeral will take place at St John the Baptist Church on Tuesday 12th November at 11.30

Paws Animal Sanctuary

I got up one morning, and spotted a huge mole hill on the lawn. The next morning there was another the other end of the lawn. Every morning after that another appeared, even under paving stones. Now all our paving stones are uneven and loose, with puddles and further down in the paddock the mole has caused heaps of wet mud everywhere. I bought some bulbs from Squires Garden Centre that said they keep moles out of your garden, I put one down each of the first three mole-hills and so far he hasn't dug them up again. But the flower bulbs cost three for ten pounds and we now have about fifty mole hills that he keeps going back to and digging up again. Today I looked on line and found solar powered posts that you put down the mole hills to drive the moles away. I hope they work.

Two weeks ago all our cat pens were empty, but today they are all full again. Also we have never had so many Guinea-pigs. We used soft chopped straw for the floors in the cages but with so many we have been using three

of the huge bales per week (costing £9 each) but were always running out and having to drive all the way to SPR at Fontwell to buy more. Sheila suggested experimenting with newspapers instead with hay on top, so we cut the papers down the centre and it worked just fine, that was until we ran out of newspapers. When I asked all the Volunteers to bring in their newspapers I was surprised to find I am the only one who has a daily paper! Luckily they have all been asking their neighbours and friends and we are now been getting a supply. from Stacey.



Last meeting we enjoyed a fascinating talk given by Roger Clark. Roger told us about the vital role the Spitfire Girls played in the Second World War. At the outbreak of war pilots were needed to ferry aircraft from factories to airfields and, after a brief struggle, female pilots were allowed to fly Tiger Moth trainers. By 1941 they had proved their worth and were allowed to fly operational aircraft, including the Spitfire.

FPC plans to re-locate the North End shelter to the Homewood Junction bus stop (west side of Horsham Road). The routes of underground services have been checked and in addition West Sussex County Council (WSCC) is happy with the proposal.

It is hoped to start the work within the next few weeks and the work will be undertaken by the Open Spaces Volunteers with some professional help.

The Operation Watershed grant application for the next phase of drainage improvements in the village will be submitted to WSCC shortly.

FPC has reviewed the Findon Village Winter Management Plan 2019/202 and this will be published on the FPC web site following approval.



GARDENING TITBITS

Catherine York

Hesperantha/Schizostylis (kaffir lilies) are wonderful plants for this time of year. With strappy leaves and flower stalks holding crocus-looking blooms all down their stems they are so beautiful they fly off the shelves in garden centres. The first one I encountered (coral, Coccinea Major) was at the Sheep Fair twelve years ago. We had walked there from Storrington Rise in the Findon Valley so it was a fair weight carrying it back to the car on a red-hot day. Now I prefer the blush-pink one, placed in front of our dark green shed. Last year we bought "Mrs Hegarty" (salmon-pink) for the pond. It never bloomed but in June 2019 it produced a preview of two 1' flower spikes so gorgeous it was well worth the wait. In early October it began its proper autumn flowering season.

In our first winter, I planted violas in the empty vegetable plot but this was hard on my knees and back. So, this year I have planted them in black plastic troughs maintainable from a standing position. I remember opening the back garden gate and being greeted by a glorious scent all through the winter. The draw-back with violas is that they need constantly dead-heading to create an endless display of flowers and this can be hard if you are not in the mood. On our patio we have a seat facing south, capturing the winter sun, so I take one trough at a time and sit on the bench with it, dead-heading and soaking up the sun at the same time. Happy days.


