

The Hall Farm, Rotherfield, Christmas 1851

The party is over, the food and drink consumed. The Mummers have performed. St George has killed the Turkish Knight and the Spanish Doctor has brought him back to life.

Now it's time to get the children home to bed. Ann Moon goes into the kitchen to light her lantern. (Ann is a 39 year old widow with four children from Treblers, the farm next door.) The host, Elizabeth Allcorn, says that her son Fred will see Ann home. (Fred is a 33 year old bachelor only interested in the farm and his prize Sussex cattle.) He has no choice but to agree.

'Just let me get my boots on and light my lantern'.

They go out the back door and pass the cattle sheds. Several pairs of yellow eyes are picked out by the lights. The youngest child, Lizz speaks up.

'Mr Allcorn is it true that the oxen pray to baby Jesus at midnight on Christmas eve?'

'Well I'm usually in bed by then unless I go to midnight mass'. He thought quickly. 'One thing I do know is that they are always practising.'

He kicked the wooden food trough with his boot and called out to the bullocks. One by one the dark red Sussex cattle rose to their feet. (Horses get up with their front legs straight, but cows get up on their elbows first. In this position they look as if they are praying.)

'Oh look at that', cried out the younger girls.

'But that is what they always ..' said their elder brother. Ann put a hand on his arm and stopped him.



'Yes, they are always practising' she said. 'Here George take my lantern for the girls, I can see by Mr Allcorn's'. Then she stumbled and clutched at Fred's sleeve. Only she knew whether it was by accident or design.

'Here, you had better take my arm.' said Fred. Which is what she wanted anyway. On the way they talked about stock and crops and all things farming. Which was unusual for Fred as he was shy with women.

When they reached Treblers, Fred was wondering how to say goodbye. Ann solved this by leaning forward and giving him a peck on the cheek. 'Thanks for a lovely evening'. Then she was gone. Fred's heart was beating a lot faster. How could a little kiss do that? Something had happened, but he could not figure out what. Anyway, he had agreed to look at her barley in the new year.

Ann married Fred 1st September 1852 and a little Fred, my great grandfather, arrived in January 1853. They should have known better at their age, surely.

The Bells' Return

Our two ancient bells complete with smart new headstocks were returned to the church from the bellhangers on Monday November 18th. The event had been eagerly awaited by our bellringers who are looking forward to ringing the bells, especially the newly restored pair, at Findon once more.

Once again we are indebted to Richard Kennard of Puckamuck for the loan of his tractor and driver. It turned out to be much easier to transport the the bells from the lorry to the lychgate than the other way round.

The next task was to get the bells up the church path which according to many parishioners gets steeper each week. Luckily our four volunteer bellringers from Angmering were standing by to assist although they were somewhat disappointed when they realised that no

therefore to see
how quickly they
got the job done.
Several villagers
took advantage
of the opportunity
to view the bells
while they were

still on the ground.

The final challenge was to raise the bells back up into their places in the tower. Firstly the wheels which had also been refurbished were hoisted up into the tower, the clappers followed and finally it was the turn of the bells. A vast length of chain was lowered into the ringing chamber, the first bell was attached and slowly the bell was winched up inch by inch. Once the bell

was in position in the tower the second bell made its ascent. Richard Bell was on hand once again to record the occasion.

We are very grateful to our four bellringing volunteers who worked with good humour in very cold conditions,



only appearing infrequently for a hot drink to thaw themselves out.

Our thanks also go to those who have helped with the cost of the work, The Friends of the Church who have donated £5000, the bellringers who raised over £3,000 and four charities who have awarded us grants, Church Care, The Sharpe Collection Trust, Sussex Churches Bell Restoration Fund and The Central Council of Church Bell Ringers.

It has been a long process starting in 2017 and so we are all delighted to have our wonderful ancient bells back home.



At the end of 2019, and looking back over the year, our numbers have remained fairly stable with about twenty plus children (mainly aged between 5-11 years), plus the adults who have accompanied them, attending each session. We have covered many stories from the bible and made craft items related to those stories. When the



children arrive after school they have a welcome biscuit and a drink and then they get stuck into the activities which usually includes a food related task, which they can eat later, and working with materials as diverse as clay, beads, card, papier mâché, stones, yarns, fabrics, etc. They are always keen and hardworking. Following the craft session we have a short service of story, song and prayer. We find the children very well informed and eager to participate. The afternoon ends with a shared meal and we are very grateful to our cooks for the fabulous food they have provided every month. In addition it has become the tradition to have a mini Messy Church on Good Friday, with hot cross buns, before we carry the cross along the High Street to Pond Green for a short service.

There will be no Messy Church in January but we're back on **4th February**, as usual on the first Tuesday of the month. All children accompanied by an adult are very welcome.



Findon Village Hall Trust Chairman's Report 2018/2019

January 2019. Chairman Angus Watts resigned. He reported that the building fund was exhausted, and work had ceased. New Chairman- Judith Davies was voted in as new Chairman by the Committee. As no paperwork was handed over by previous Chair, I felt it necessary to understand the situation fully. I obtained:-

* Copies of original supplier invoices obtained *Meeting with Builders and Suppliers

*Breakdown of Building costs.

*Survey of the existing building and extension, including existing hall floor.

Plan of Action

As finances were low, it was vital that the existing hall must be brought up to an acceptable standard, so we could continue to let the Hall to regular organisations, and occasional hires.

As the existing Hall floor was found to be sound, and did not require a complete replacement. Three quotes were obtained, to extend the existing maple flooring. To finance this we accepted loans from local residents. This work was complete in March, and a full clean up, made the Hall attractive to perspective hirers once more.

Outside the building site was fenced off, the damaged lawn levelled and seeded by volunteers. Planters were donated, and flower beds planted.

Finance

With the erratic closures the Hall suffered during the latter half of 2018, revenue suffered.

A budget review took place, which resulted in a price increase implemented on 1st July 2019. A meeting with the Events Team to increase fund raising took place.

September 2019 – Revised terms with cleanings, resulting in a 50% decrease in charges

Revised Terms & Conditions of Hire -

New Extension

Working with Findon Parish Council, we have an application with ACRES to raise the funds to complete this project.

The extension is approximately 85% complete Quotations to complete the work have been obtained, and agreed with the Parish Council. A grant from AIRS will pay for 50% of the cost of fitting the new kitchen and flooring when the time comes.

Grant applications to several organisations are ongoing

The exterior paving will be financed by selling memorial paving slabs, which will pay for both the slabs and fitting costs.

Our Events Team have gained a great deal of experience over the last few years, and we now have a very professional approach to our events, resulting in raised profits at our events.

Conclusions

The Village Hall is once again fully operational.

We continue to work with the Parish Council and other organisations to raise the funds to complete the building project

On completion of the extension, we intend conducting a full marketing campaign to attract prospective hires.

Opening the new facility will increase overheads by an estimated 25%; however increase in revenue is estimated at 50% of existing income.

As you can imagine this time of year is a very exciting time in the Preschool what with Halloween, Fireworks and now moving on to Christmas it is all go go go!! Over the Halloween period the children's curiosity was sparked when we put an array of different types of pumpkins, squashes and Gourds around the Preschool. The children were looking at them through magnifying glasses and drawing and decorating on them. They found out about how they grow by looking at information books. It also inspired them to use their creative skills to paint some lovely pumpkin interpretations using a variety of media and materials. We read the enormous turnip which the children loved acting out and used different mathematical language for sizing such as heavy, light, enormous etc. When one of the Pumpkins fell on the floor and burst open the children were very intrigued to see what was inside so we cut them all open for them to explore the different textures and scents. This helped expand their descriptive language as they used words such as slimy, gooey, seeds, flesh etc. They used their fine motor skills to dia out the seeds and flesh with spoons. Around fireworks the children were very animated about what they had seen and they used their critical thinking skills to recreate a bonfire with our loose parts eg planks of wood, crates branches etc. Some of the children found sticks and things to put on the end and pretended to toast marshmallows around it. We talked about safety and how to be careful around fires. Some of the children used their large physical skills to act out the different firework actions and noises eg crouching

down and jumping up and twirling around as they made loud bang sounds, whiz and wheee noises.

Now we are busy practising our Christmas songs for our Nativity Play, we have some old favourites such as "Away in a Manger" and "Santa got stuck up the chimney" but also enjoy learning new ones too. The Preschool as always will be taking part in the Christmas Tree Festival at the church on 7th & 8th Dec. This year we have asked the children and their families to make their own decoration at home for it. We have seen some lovely creations going on so far! Findon Parish Council Report

The Findon Village Hall Trust has outstanding building work to complete their full update to the Village Hall, in particular to finish the smaller meeting room extension.

Findon Parish Council (FPC) is working closely with the Trust to gain a Public Works Loan from central government. These funds would allow that work to be completed, creating an excellent and fit for purpose Village Hall for Findon.

In addition FPC has been very active on the planning front, reviewing both individual applications and those continuing discussions around the broader elements of village planning. Acting in its role as a statutory consultee, the FPC submits it's opinion to the South Downs National Park Authority (SDNPA), the Planning Authority for all applications in the village. Should you have an interest in any application we would urge you to make your opinion known at the FPC Planning Meetings (details can be found on the FPC website https://findonparishcouncil.gov.uk/) and also submit your comments on the SDNPA Public Access portal (https://planningpublicaccess.southdow

ns.gov.uk/online-applications/)

Continuing on with SDNPA, we are delighted to say that following an application from FPC for improvements to the Homewood play area, we have just been awarded an allocation of funding of £31.5k, available for three years, as part of the 2018/19 Community Infrastructure Levy receipt. The Homewood play area is included in the FPC 3 year Strategic Plan, which will be available for your review and comment as part of a public consultation in the New Year.

FPC is in the process of considering it's precept/budget for the 2020/21 financial year. This details those monies required from Arun District Council/central government to fund those works/upkeep/projects required for the village and as such represent part of the council tax levy for residents.

Finally we expect to have the additional defibrillator and external cabinet in place for the New Year, which will provide a valuable resource on Nepcote Green.






